A FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT DOG CONTROL

When walking your dogs on the town oval, please ensure you are in complete control of your animal at <u>all times</u> and dispose of any waste in the rubbish bins provided by Council.

The Shire of Meekatharra provide the Town Oval as the only off-lease exercise area in town—at all other locations your dog must, according to law, be collared and restrained.

To allow your dog to be unrestrained in public is an offence in the Dog Act 1976.

Being responsible for a dog that attacks a person causing injury is also an offence which attracts a significant penalty of up to \$10,000.

Please be a responsible pet owner—keep your dog restrained when exercising them to avoid both injury to bystanders, and significant penalties, and please pick up any droppings left behind. Nobody wants to step in that!!

The Shire of Meekatharra support the neutering and desexing of pets to reduce the number of strays, and provide sponsorship to the Murdoch Veterinary Clinic to attend Meekatharra to provide this service at no cost to health care card holders. Additionally, the Shire fund regular visiting vet service—Newman Veterinary Clinic—to the value of \$5,000 to neuter the pets of health care card holders at no cost to the owner.

Local residents can access this service by attending the Shire Office to present your Health Care Card and prove registration. You will be issued with a voucher for the appropriate service at the visiting clinic.

Meeka's 2020 Vision

As we bid a not-so-fond farewell to the difficult year that was 2020, it's good to take a look back via the Shire's Annual Report as a reminder of Meekatharra's dynamic, resilient community spirit. The report is available to all online, and has a great summary of the busy year behind us as well as leads on what's coming up.

We had a great year full of events, enhancements and achievements, including the small wheels park and skate clinics, camps and other activities for the kids, the wonderful performance put on by the Tjuki Mala dancers, the Lloyd's grand opening, the Festival and the helicopter rides, and the best Christmas party ever. A big highlight of the past year was our Meeka kids winning the state's "Showcase in Pixels" competition with their painting of our night sky; you can see it on the Shire's web page.

The pet sterilisation program proved to be a solid success, with many locals commenting on the reduction of wandering animals. Improvements were made to a number of town and regional features, including the Nannine cemetery and various upgrades to public facilities.

While COVID brought many things to a halt and affected local business, we were among the many fortunate remote towns of WA to remain safe from the virus and to benefit from the tourism tsunami that helped bolster the coffers. We also saw an increase in local mining, drilling and exploration projects, as evidenced by the many locals phoning dinner in early at the pubs in order to beat the meal time rush!

Our local accommodation services reported that they have been receiving lots of calls for next-season bookings, and both the Shire office and the Community Resource Centre assisted a record number of visitors who had plenty of nice things to say about our region, particularly the people – that's us! This year saw some terrific community events and initiatives, with people pitching in to help on every level. The Shire is looking forward to more events and community momentum in 2021, and welcomes your input via our contact details on the next page.

Moments from the Minutes

The December minutes feature the Annual Report, which includes end of year summaries from Shire President Harvey Nichols and CEO Roy McClymont; while there's plenty of number crunching to digest, what emerges is a very positive overview of our Shire operations and budget.

The annual audit went well, with Shire staff busily dotting i's and crossing t's to ensure detailed recording of compliance and best practise. The Shire has been working hard to meet the standards and goals set within various plans and legislation, including disability access, our ongoing revitalisation projects and more. Many locals have already noted the various improvements appearing around town, ranging from the colour-coordinated public seating, the clean up at the Cemetery, upgrades at the swimming pool and of course the bigger projects such as Lloyds and the small wheels park.

Our Animal Ranger has feral cats firmly in his sights and has been attending to all reports put in to the Shire. The December minutes identify a total of fourteen feral animals being euthanased, including five feral cats trapped at a residential property, at the owner's request. Cats remain a problem in Meeka and the Shire appreciates all the locals who took time to submit formal complaints so that action could be taken. The ranger does his best to ensure that no pets are caught up in the program, so it's vital that you make sure your pets have collars and registration tags. The free desexing service is continuing; all you need to do is bring your health care card to the Shire office and then make an appointment with the visiting vet.

Those with dentures, lower back pain or crockery in the caravan will be pleased to hear that further bitumenising has been completed on the Ashburton Downs Road. Road crews on the Meeka side have been working hard to keep the old bone-rattler in good nick, especially with our increased mining and tourism traffic.

A big news item is the Council's endorsement of an Events Subcommittee. Expressions of Interest have been advertised for potential committee members; if you are interested, please contact the Shire. The goal of the subcommittee is to work with Shire staff on the development and execution of community events throughout the year, building on the success of our 2020 activities, special events and festival.

Termite Treat is a Bitter Pill to Swallow

Number one on the hot topic list these days of course is the Meekatharra Hospital. As most locals are painfully aware, our busy medical facility is in desperate need of improvements and the fight is on to get our state government to recognise and act on how necessary it is to our region.

Meekatharra Hospital, once located on the southeast side of town, has a vital and colourful history, bringing relief and life-saving services to our once rough and ready outback region where, in the olden days, the best you could hope for was a few gulps of whiskey and a stick to bite down on. We have produced some legendary nurses from our region, including Pearl Ashwin, and today our amazing hospital staff somehow manage to provide top notch services while doing their best with the ageing building facilities.

The Midwest Times did a front page story on the sorry state of affairs in December, featuring comments from our Shire President Harvey Nichols, Nationals MP Vince Catania and our CEO, Roy McClymont. For those not in the loop, the Department of Treasury and Finance "formally identified asbestos, termites and a leaking roof" at the premises over a decade ago. Despite "loose plans" to address the hospital situation over the years and a more recent visit by Health Minister Roger Cook, the Meekatharra Hospital received no mention in the 2020-21 state budget handed down in October.

While some may think that a hospital for a town of less than 1000 people isn't a priority, its important to recognise that the catchment area for its services covers much, much more than just the immediate local population.

Meekatharra is also a Flying Doctor base, and provides much needed medical and mental health services for thousands of people including residents, station families and workers, the very busy mining industry, travellers and our high number of temporary workers. With COVID still on our horizon and an ageing population, having modern medical services is even more important, and the Shire is committed to pushing for action on behalf of our community.







Herb, Fruit & Vegie Planting Guide

By Temperate/Regional Zones

For Summer Flower Planting or Seasonal Planting Guides;

www.aboutthegarden.com.au



Subtropical (includes: South-east Qld & Northern NSW)

HERBS - plant basil, chives, coriander, fennel, gotu kola, heliotrope, lemongrass, mint, parsley, tarragon and winter savoury.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES – plant artichoke, beans, capsicum, celery, Chinese cabbage, cucumber, eggplant, kohlrabi, leek, lettuce, melons, okra, onion, potato (tubers), rosella, silver beet, spring onion, squash, sweet corn, sweet potato and tomato.

Wet & Dry Tropical (includes: North Queensland, NT & WA)

HERBS – plant basil, coriander, lemongrass, mint and tarragon. thyme.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES - plant artichoke, beetroot, capsicum, cauliflower, celery, Chinese cabbage, cucumber, eggplant, lettuce, pumpkin, radish, shallots, spring onion and tomato.

Dry Inland (includes: Arid or Outback areas)

FRUIT & VEGETABLES - No sowing or planting throughout summer due to hot and dry conditions

Temperate Areas (includes: Sydney, coastal NSW & Victoria)

HERBS – plant basil, chives, coriander, fennel, gotu kola, heliotrope, lovage, mint, parsley and tarragon.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES - plant beans (dwarf and climbing), beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, capsicum, carrot, cauliflower, celery, chicory, chilli, Chinese cabbage, cucumber, eggplant, endive, kohlrabi, leek, lettuce, okra, parsnip, potato (tubers), radish, rhubarb (crowns), shallots, silver beet, spring onion, sweet corn, sweet potato and zucchini.

Cool & Southern Tablelands (includes: Melbourne & cool highlands)

HERBS – plant basil, chives, coriander, lemongrass, marjoram, mint, oregano, parsley, rosemary, tarragon and thyme.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES - plant beans, beetroot, cabbage, capsicum, carrot, cauliflower, cucumber, English spinach, kohlrabi, leek, lettuce, onion, parsnip, pumpkin, radish, silver beet, spring squash, swede, sweet corn, tomato, turnip and zucchini.

Mediterranean (includes: Adelaide & Perth)

HERB - Keep picking the flowers of parsley and basil to prevent them bolting. **FRUIT & VEGETABLES** – Plant tomatoes, zucchini and capsicum by the end of January. Spray apples and pears against codling moth.

First aid fact sheet

Heat-induced illnesses



- If a person with heat exhaustion is not managed appropriately, they can develop heat stroke.
- Heat stroke is potentially life-threatening and immediate medical aid is needed.

Heat exhaustion

Signs and symptoms

- feeling hot, exhausted, weak, fatigued
- persistent headache
- thirst
- nausea
- faintness, dizziness
- rapid breathing, shortness of breath
- pale, cool, moist skin
- rapid, weak pulse

What to do

- 1 Move the patient to a cool place with circulating air.
- 2 Help the patient to sit or lie down in a comfortable position.
- 3 Remove unnecessary clothing from the patient, and loosen any tight clothing.
- 4 Sponge the patient with cold water.
- 5 Give the patient cool water to drink.
- 6 Seek medical aid if the patient vomits or does not recover quickly.

Heat stroke

Signs and symptoms

- high body temperature of 40°C or more
- flushed, dry skin
- pounding, rapid pulse that gradually weakens
- headache and irritability
- nausea, vomiting
- visual disturbances
- faintness, dizziness, confusion
- loss of consciousness
- seizures

What to do

- 1 Follow DRSABCD.
- 2 Call triple zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3 Move the patient to a cool place with circulating air.
- 4 Help the patient to sit or lie down in a comfortable position.
- 5 Remove almost all the patient's clothing, and loosen any tight clothing.
- 6 Apply a cold pack to areas of large blood vessels such as the neck, groin and armpits, to accelerate cooling.
- 7 If possible, cover the patient with a wet sheet and fan to increase air circulation. Stop cooling when the patient feels cold to touch.
- 8 If patient is fully conscious and is able to swallow, give them cool water to sip.

TANDOORI CHICKEN

AND SALAD WRAPS

Ingredients

- 2 skinless chicken breasts, trimmed of fat (450g)
- ▲ 1 tablespoon tandoori paste
- ▲ 2 tablespoons low-fat Greek yoghurt
- ▲ ¼ teaspoon tandoori paste, extra
- 4 wholegrain or reduced-fat soft wraps (20cm)
- 2 Lebanese cucumbers, halved, sliced into thin strips lengthways
- 1 small red capsicum, seeded and sliced into thin strips
- ▲ 60g snow pea sprouts
- ▲ 20 mint leaves

Preparation time: 15 minutes
Cooking time: 20 minutes

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C (180°C fan forced). Coat chicken in tandoori paste then place in a medium baking dish or onto an oven tray lined with baking paper. Bake for 15-20 minutes until cooked through. Once cool enough to handle, slice thinly. Combine yoghurt with extra tandoori paste; spread 2 teaspoons evenly on each wrap. Layer equal amounts of chicken, cucumber, capsicum and sprouts on one edge of each wrap, top with a row of mint leaves. Roll up tightly to enclose filling and cut in half.

Hint

Cover and refrigerate tandoori coated chicken for as long as time permits, from 30 minutes to overnight.

QUICK CHICKEN PIZZA

Ingredients

- ▲ 1 thin 23cm pizza base (dinner plate size)
- 2 tablespoons salt-reduced tomato-based pasta sauce or paste
- ▲ 1 cup (30g) baby spinach leaves
- ½ large red onion, peeled, finely sliced and separated
- 100g cooked or BBQ chicken breast, thinly sliced
- ½ small red capsicum, seeded and sliced in thin strips
- ▲ 12 small whole or 6 large halved cherry tomatoes
- ▲ ½ cup grated reduced-fat mozzarella cheese
- ▲ Basil leaves, to serve

Method

Preheat oven to 220°C (200°C fan-forced). Spread tomato paste evenly over pizza base. Top with spinach leaves, sliced onion, chicken, capsicum strips and cherry tomatoes. Sprinkle with cheese and place on a baking tray, pizza stone or wire rack. Bake for 5 minutes until cheese is melted then cover with foil to prevent burning. Bake for a further 5 minutes until base is crisp. Sprinkle with roughly torn basil leaves on top to serve.

Hint

Use mini bases, pita or wholegrain English muffins for individual pizzas.



ENOUGH IS ENOUGH

Everywhere in my electorate, the story is the same – people have had enough of alcohol abuse and anti-social behaviour, affecting their lives in Regional WA.

The policy of the McGowan Government and the 'do-gooders' simply isn't working.

IT'S TIME FOR A NEW POLICY:

A policy of direct intervention into aboriginal communities and child welfare. A policy which puts the tackling of alcohol abuse as a top priority. A policy which puts a stop to the 'softhanded' approach to youth justice.

NO CONSEQUENCES FOR ACTIONS

The best way to change a person's behaviour is for them to learn that there are consequences for actions.

Right now, anti-social behaviour is terrorising regional WA. We need to impose measures that teach offenders that there are consequences for their actions.

JAIL IS NOT A DETERRENT

At the moment there is no fear of going to jail, instead, it's become a "rite of passage", and somewhere for kids to learn the behaviours of criminal adults.

We need take offenders off the streets for longer periods, which protects society and which allows for intensive education and rehabilitation programs to be delivered to the offender.



THE PROBLEM

COVID-19 reduced crime numbers significantly, but now the worst is over, things have gone back to "normal"-burglary, property damage and assaults are being reported more than ever before. Politically-correct policies of the Government have failed. We need to stop this idea of a 'partnership model' and instead directly intervene.

THE SOLUTION

We need to start right away implementing both short-term and long-term solutions:

- Provide government subsidies for home and business CCTV camera systems.
- Confiscate phones that are being used to upload criminal behaviour to social media.
- Tougher prison sentences with intensive education programs.
- Provide beds at schools 24/7 for children to escape abusive homes.

Containers for Change is coming to Meekatharra and Yulella Aboriginal Corporation and the ABC Foundation Ltd is bringing it here from Saturday October 3!

A new state-wide container deposit scheme, Containers for Change lets you cash in eligible containers for 10-cents each.

Your local refund point in Meekatharra is: 18 Marmont Street, Meekatharra.

Open: Wednesdays 1.00pm-5.00pm & Saturdays 8.00am-12.00pm. (From Sat Oct 3)

You will be able to cash in up to 800 containers and receive up to \$80 cash-in-hand during these times. You can also have the money deposited straight into your bank account by signing up for a Scheme ID at www.containersforchange.com.au.

Anything more than \$80 will be deposited directly into your bank account via your Scheme ID, so make sure you sign up for one today!

Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.

There are some drink containers that are not eligible for a refund. Generally, excluded containers are those that are less than 150ml and greater than 3L. Containers excluded include:

- Any plain milk containers
- Any glass containers which have contained wine or pure spirits
- Containers 1L or larger which have contained flavoured milk, pure fruit or vegetable juice
- All cordial or syrup containers
- Registered health tonics.

Any containers that are presented as either broken glass or damaged/cut containers will NOT be eligible for a refund. Light crushing of cans, plastics and liquid paperboard is acceptable.

Please remember when coming down to exchange your containers:

- Make sure they are CLEAN and cleared of any contamination. Contamination includes: sand, cigarette butts, sharps and lemon/lime, plus much more.
- Sort and count your containers before into their types (glass, aluminium, plastic etc) as this will assist us in processing your containers quicker.
- Be nice we are just starting out, so please be patient if we are a bit slow in the first days.

If you would like to bag up your containers for us to count and process later so you don't have to wait, just make sure to mark your bag clearly with your Scheme ID, Full Name and Contact Number. Alternatively, put your details on paper inside a sealed plastic sleave and pop that in your bag.
