

CEO COUNCIL MESSAGE



Welcome to the May 2022 edition of *The Dust CEO Council Message* Report that provides information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 9th of April 2022 as well as the Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meetings that was held on the same day. This section of *The Dust* is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Council's Ordinary Meetings that are held each month.

The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only an extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

Items from the Ordinary Meeting 9 April 2022

<u>Item 9.3.4 – Application for Mining Tenement Miscellaneous</u> Licence 51/122

That Council approve the Application from M&M Walter Consulting on behalf of Cyprium Metals for approval of the application for Mining Tenement Miscellaneous Licence 51/122 situated east of Yarrabubba as depicted on the attached Tengraph map and application.

The above resolution confirms Council's approval in regard to the request from M&M Walter Consulting on behalf of Cyprium Metals for approval of the application for Mining Tenement Miscellaneous Licence 51/122 situated east of Yarrabubba.

<u>Item 9.7.1 – Mission Australia Lease – 64 Hill Street</u> <u>Meekatharra</u>

That Council approves the Lease between the Shire of Meekatharra and Mission Australia for the premises located at 64 Hill Street Meekatharra in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in the Lease and approves the affixing of Councils Common Seal and execution of the Lease by the Chief Executive Officer and the Shire President.

The above resolution confirms Council's agreement between the Shire of Meekatharra and Mission Australia to formally lease the premises at 64 Hill Street Meekatharra to Mission Australia that they currently occupy and use for the purpose of a domestic violence safe house.

<u>Item 9.7.2 – Meekatharra Speedway Lease – Yulella</u> Aboriginal Corporation

That Council approve a request from the Meekatharra Yulella Aboriginal Corporation to enter into a lease arrangement for the management of the Meekatharra Speedway Complex located on Part Reserve 36131 that is vested under Management Order with the Shire of Meekatharra pending approval from the Minister for Lands.

The above resolution confirms Council's agreement to enter into a lease arrangement for the management of the Meekatharra Speedway complex located on Part Reserve 36131 that is vested under Management Order with the Shire of Meekatharra following the dissolution of the former Meekatharra Speedway Club in 2021.

Item 9.7.3 – Lloyds Café Lease – Mama Moon's Bakery

That Council approve executing the Lease between the Shire of Meekatharra and Mama Moon's Bakery for the premises located at Shop 6 Café Lloyds Plaza 64 – 66 Main Street Meekatharra in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in the Lease appended to this report, and approves the affixing of Councils Common Seal and execution of the Lease by the Chief Executive Officer and the Shire President.

The above resolution confirms agreement to lease the Lloyds café shop to Mama Moon's Bakery. The lease will commence in early May 2022.

Further Information Snippets

Extraordinary election – as previously advised in *The Dust*, an extraordinary election was scheduled for Saturday 14th of May 2022 due to the resignation of Cr Phil Moses in February this year. At the close of nominations only one (1) qualified nomination was received from Mr Maurice Anderson for the one vacancy. Therefore, in accordance with section 4.55

of the Local Government Act 1995, Maurice Anderson is duly elected for the remainder of the term until 21 October 2023. He will be formally sworn in as a Councillor for the Shire of Meekatharra at the next ordinary Council meeting on Saturday the 21st of May 2022.

Annual 2022/23 budget – the process for Councils 2022/23 budget has commenced with Council approving its Fees and Charges, Allowances and Setting of the Annual Rate in the Dollar that are advertised for comment. Council intends to adopt the 2022/23 budget at its meeting scheduled for the 25th of June 2022.

Coles Express – a development application has been submitted by Coles Express Meekatharra which is compliant with Councils Town Planning Scheme and therefore does not require any formal Council approval. Coles Express intend to extend their internal shop area as well as develop the external car/truck bay areas.

Meekatharra Swimming Pool – a review of the swimming pool infrastructure was completed and presented to Councils Health, Building and Planning Committee for consideration. The review included quotations for the painting, re-tiling and replacing of splash items in both the main pool and kids pool. Council has requested staff to submit an application for funding to the Department of Sport & Recreation.

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council is scheduled for 9.30am on Saturday the 21st of May 2022 and the next CEO *Council Message* column will appear shortly after this meeting in the June 2022 edition of *The Dust* to provide information from this Council meeting as well as general information updates to the community. SHIRE OF MEEKATHARRA PROPOSAL TO IMPOSE DIFFERENTIAL RATES

In accordance with section 6.36 of the Local Government Act 1995 notice is hereby given that the Shire of Meekatharra proposes to again differentially rate mining tenements and pastoral holdings in those areas in which unimproved property values apply.

It is anticipated that rating levels for the 2022/23 year will be 8.8869 cents in the dollar for all gross rental valued properties, 20.0000 cents in the dollar for mining tenements and 8.5000 cents in the dollar for pastoral leases. A minimum rate of \$400 can be expected on GRV properties whilst all other ratable properties can expect a minimum rate of \$350. The objects and reasons for each proposed rate may be inspected at the Shire Office, Main St, Meekatharra during normal office hours.

Submissions from electors and ratepayers about the proposed rates or minimum payments and any related matters may be made to the undersigned at the below stated address by 5pm on Tuesday 24 May 2022.

Masks continue to be required for everyone aged 12 years and older (including year 7s) on public transport, in airports and aircrafts, hospitals, aged and disability care, and correctional facilities



Two visitors per resident per day at hospitals, residential aged care and disability care facilities. In addition, essential visitors also allowed at hospitals



Proof of vaccination removed from venues and businesses, but remain for aged care and hospitals. Mandatory workplace vaccination requirements remain



Close contacts with no symptoms no longer required to isolate, but must wear a mask when leaving the house, avoid high-risk settings, take a daily RAT for 7 days, work from home where possible, avoid non-essential gatherings and inform your employer

Pulse oximeter What you need to know!

Are you non-Aboriginal and over 65?

If you answered YES to any of the above – collect a free pulse oximeter from your local government today!

What is a pulse oximeter?

It is a small, peg-like device that clips onto your fingertip to read your heart rate and blood oxygen level. It takes only one minute to work, is reusable and can be shared between other people in your household.



Why do I need one?

If you become COVID-19 positive, you may need to be remotely monitored through the WA COVID Care at Home program. By having a pulse oximeter already in your home, a health professional can assess you and provide health advice from the comfort of your home.

Visit WA COVID Care at Home for more information.

Where do I get one?

Visit your local government to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household (each eligible household will receive one pulse oximeter).

Do **not** pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. If you have already received a positive COVID-19 test result, the Department of Health will contact you and provide further information.

SNEAK A PEEK AT THE SNEAKER PROJECT

Youth Focus and 10FF Store NAIDOC Week Sneaker Project Get Up Stand Up Show Up

Youth Focus and 10FF Store, with support from the ABC Foundation, Yulella, Meekatharra District High School and the Meeka Youth Shire Services have created a unique opportunity for young people in Meekatharra.

Youth Focus is partnering with 10FF Store to create an opportunity for young people in Meekatharra to express their cultural heritage through art and sharing good news stories from Meekatharra for NAIDOC Week 2022.

Up to 14 young people in Meekatharra will have the opportunity to create, design and paint Nike Air Force Sneakers.

Each week the young people in the Meekatharra High School - Future Endeavours class will attend the Youth Focus office on Main Street to design and create their artwork for their sneakers. During this time Meeka community members, Youth Focus staff, artists and others will be involved and invited to talk to the young people on a wide range of topics, from art and design to caring for your own social and emotional wellbeing.

Two winning designs will be chosen by members of the Meekatharra community. The winner will then have the opportunity to gift their sneakers to one West Coast Eagles player and one Fremantle Dockers player (to be announced at a later date), while still being able to keep a pair of sneakers for themselves.

Each young person will get to keep the Nike Air Force sneakers that they create. We are also encouraging the young people involved in the project to choose an older family member or guardian to help create the design with them and to share the experience. During this project there will be lots of giveaways and recognition for those young people that are really involved in the process.

Participants will also be given the opportunity to design a NAIDOC themed shirt to be sold at the 1OFF Store. Money

from selling the shirts will be returned to Youth Focus. The young people involved in the project will have a say in how that money is spent.

This project aims to:

- Encourage young people to draw on cultural knowledge and heritage to restore resilience, hope and a meaningful sense of community through creative art.
- Create an opportunity for the young people's designs to be recognised and teaching them employability skills within the creative industry.
- Create an environment where young people in Meekatharra can learn mental health literacy (resilience, self-esteem, managing anxiety, connection to the social and emotional well-being model of care).

A documentary about the process will be developed by the 1OFF Store team. This will be published on YouTube. Young people and their families will have the opportunity to see the video before it is published.

THREE LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT

Australia has three levels of government that work together to provide Australians with the services they need. The three levels are:

- local government or councils (also called shires or municipalities)
- state or territory governments
- federal government

By voting in elections, you will choose people to represent you in each level of government to make laws and govern on your behalf. Voting is how every person can have their say.

All levels of government collect money through taxes and provide a range of services. Each level of government has its own responsibilities, although in some cases these responsibilities overlap.

Here are some examples:

LOCAL

- local road maintenance
- garbage collection
- recreation facilities

STATE/TERRITORY

- education
- transport
- health

FEDERAL

- foreign affairs
- social security
- immigration

Federal Government

A federal election is held at least every three years so Australians can vote to decide who will represent them in the federal Parliament.

The federal Parliament consists of two houses — the House of the Representatives and the Senate. During a federal election, you will vote for a person to represent your area (known as an electorate) in the House of Representatives. There are 151 members in the House of Representatives in total.

The political party with a majority of members in the House of Representatives becomes the federal Government. The leader of the government is called the Prime Minister.

You will also vote for senators who will represent a whole state or territory in the Senate. There are 12 senators for every state, and two senators for each territory.

State and territory governments

State and territory governments generally have a similar structure to the federal Parliament, but only make laws and decisions for the specific state or territory. Each state, apart from Queensland, has a parliament that consists of two houses. Queensland, the Northern Territory and the Australian

Capital Territory have one house called the Legislative Assembly, instead of a Parliament.

The leader of a state government is called the Premier. The leader of a territory government is called the Chief Minister.

When a state or territory holds an election, you will vote for a person to represent you in your state parliament or in the Legislative Assembly. State and Territory elections are run by State Electoral bodies and not by the Australian Electoral Commission.

Local government

Local governments, often called city councils or shire councils, are established by state governments to look after the particular needs of a city or local community. The head of the council is the Mayor or Shire President. During local government elections, you will vote for people called councillors who form the council. Local government elections are usually run by state electoral bodies.

Opening day was rather hectic with children being enrolled all over the place, but all seemed to go well, with the children and staff looking happy with the new building.



ingredients

- 80ml (1/3 cup) extra virgin olive oil
- 1 red onion, finely chopped
- · 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1/2 bunch continental parsley, stems finely chopped, leaves picked
- · 2 tsp harissa paste
- 11/2 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp ground coriander
- 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 red capsicum, deseeded, cut into 2cm pieces
- 1 (about 360g) eggplant, cut into 2cm pieces
- 700g btl passata
- 2 x 400g cans chickpeas, rinsed, drained
- 2 tsp honey
- 500g haloumi, thinly sliced
- · 2 tsp mixed sesame seeds
- · Flatbread, warmed, to serve

directions

- STEP 1 Preheat oven to 220°C/200°C fan forced. Heat 1 /4 cup of the oil in a large flameproof baking tray over medium heat. Add onion, garlic and parsley stems. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until softened. Add harissa, cumin, paprika, coriander and cinnamon. Cook, stirring, for 2 minutes or until aromatic. Add capsicum, eggplant and remaining oil. Season. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes.
- STEP 2 Add passata, chickpeas, half the parsley leaves and 1 tsp honey to the dish. Bring to a simmer. Reduce heat to low. Cook, covered, stirring occasionally, for 30 minutes or until vegetables are soft. Remove from heat. Top with haloumi. Bake uncovered for 10 minutes. Drizzle with remaining honey and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Bake for 10-15 minutes or until haloumi is golden. Set aside for 10 minutes to cool slightly. Sprinkle with remaining parsley. Serve with flatbread.


