CEO COUNCIL MESSAGE

Welcome to the August 2022 edition of *The Dust CEO Council Message* Report that provides information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 16th of July 2022 as well as the Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meeting that was held on the same day. This section of *The Dust* is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Councils Ordinary Meetings that are held each month.

The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only an extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Health, Building & Planning Meeting 16 July 2022

Item 7.1.2 – Community Development & Services Manager Report

That the Community Development & Services Manager's report be accepted.

The above resolution included an update on several projects that the Community Development & Services Manager and staff were engaged in, such as:

- * Entry Statement
- * Mural Town Wall
- * Lions Park
- * Town Planning Scheme revision
- * Picture Gardens
- * Swimming Pool Works, and
- * Median strip in town main street

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Ordinary Meeting 16 July 2022

Item 11.1 – Excision of Land from Reserve 15815 for Power Generation

That Council:

- * *Support the excision of a portion of land from reserve 15815 as the preferred site to support the creation of*

a new Crown reserve for the purpose of 'Electricity Generation' and issue a management order to Regional Power Corporation, otherwise known as Horizon Power;

- * *Should this land be unsuitable, Council agree to the excision of a portion of land instead;*
- * *Make this decision subject to the condition of an Easement in Gross being granted for access to the effluent waste pipeline traversing this land;*
- * *Advise Horizon Power and the Department of Planning, Land and Heritage of the above decision accordingly.*

The above resolution confirms Councils endorsement of the application from Horizon Power for the excision of part of Reserve 15815 that extends the current facility and will further support the energy generation facility.

Further Information Snippets

- * Annual 2022/23 budget adoption – Council has completed its 2022/23 budget process with Ministerial Approval for the proposed differential rating having been granted on 20/7/22 that allowed Council to formally adopt the 2022/23 budget at a Special Meeting held on the 21st of July 2022.
- * Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act Workshop – the Shire President and staff members attended the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act workshop held on 20/7/22 that provided an update on the new Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021 and community consultation input to the draft Regulations being developed. It is expected that the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act will be proclaimed by parliament in July 2023.
- * Meekatharra Airport Pavement Works – Council will undertake major airport runway, apron and taxi way pavement works towards the end of this year. Assessment of the airport pavement areas is currently underway that will inform the extent of works required. The community will be informed of when the works are expected to commence and expects little disruption to flight schedules at the airport.

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council is scheduled for 9.30am on Saturday the 20th of August 2022 and the next *CEO Council Message* column will appear shortly after this meeting in the September 2022 edition of *The Dust* to provide information from this Council meeting as well as general information updates to the community. 
The Goldfields Highway, the last remaining partially unsealed state highway, was the next stop on the list before the board members were shown a number of locations in town such as the Picture Gardens, the

Watch out for rogue removalists

Moving house is widely considered to be one of life's most stressful events, so we always urge consumers to choose their removalist carefully to avoid any extra drama on the day.

Consumer Protection has recently received a growing number of complaints about the conduct of removalists advertising on social media. Initially the trader quotes an hourly rate and requests a small deposit, however upon arrival they demand a large lump sum be paid up front with a promise to return any unused money once the job is complete.

In some cases, the traders have refused to return or deliver the furniture until the higher fees have been paid. Neither are the promised refunds forthcoming and belongings are often damaged during the move for which a remedy is never provided.

Damage to property accounted for just over half of the 262 complaints we received about removalists in the past 18 months. Disagreements over costs was another top issue, along with removal trucks turning up late.

Consumers are urged to be wary when sourcing removalists on social media, as they may be using someone else's ABN to appear legitimate. It can also be tricky to identify the individual behind a business that is only advertised on social media, meaning consumers may struggle to enforce their rights should they wish to pursue legal action.

When sourcing a removalist, we recommend giving preference to removalists that are members of the [Australian Furniture Removals Association](#) or get recommendations from family and friends.

It is best to make sure all the details are worked out and agreed to before the move. Consumers should get a proposal on company letterhead that contains a copy of the terms and conditions and clearly sets out an hourly rate or a fixed price for the job.

Like other traders, removalists must exercise due care and skill by doing all they can to prevent damage or loss, and the consumer has the right to claim compensation if they fail to do this.



RATING INFORMATION

Council resolved to increase the rates in the dollar for the 2022/23 financial year for all categories. After Three years of no increase in the rate in the dollar.

The interest rate for overdue rates and service charges remains at 7% for the 2022/23 Financial year. Interest charged on instalments is 5.5%

REFUSE COLLECTION CHARGES

Rubbish service charges have not increased.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Instalment options offered are in accordance with both Local Government Act 1995 Sections 6.45 and 6.50(3) and the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations Sections 58 to 69.

Option 1: Payment in full by a single instalment

Due date is 02 September 2022

Option 2: Payment by four equal instalments

(plus interest and administration charge of \$15)

Instalment Due Date: 02 September 2022

Instalment Due Date: 06 November 2022

Instalment Due Date: 12 January 2023

Instalment Due Date: 18 March 2023

Option 2 is only available if previous rates have been paid in full. Rubbish charges are spread over all instalments.

Note: if first payment is not received within 35 days of issue date, the instalment option cannot be utilised. Administration charges do not apply to pension card holders.

Payment can be made via bank transfer, EFTPOS, Cheque or Cash. Please refer to the rate notice for details.

Alternative payment arrangements for ratepayers suffering financial hardship may be available.

OBJECT OF RATES

The Shire of Meekatharra works to ensure that the local community runs smoothly. We administer various laws and regulations to help maintain and improve services and facilities for the community. These services include infrastructure, community services, sporting and recreation services, town planning, public health, environmental protection and waste collection. The rates you pay allow the Shire of Meekatharra to fund these services.

Some projects that Council have approved for the 2022/23 budget are:

- An additional \$1m has been allocated to the Maintenance Grading program to lift the quality of our roads .
- Over \$8M in Road Construction - including \$2.1M for Ashburton Downs Road and \$4M for the continuation of road works on Landor Road (both partly funded by the state and federal government)
- \$1.1M for upgrading the Airport Runway
- \$103k in Picture Garden upgrades (new toilet block, upgrading electrics, surface for kids to sit on)
- \$190k for landscaping, seats and tables and BBQ for the Lions Park area
- \$100k for Indoor Cricket Centre upgrades
- Nearly \$170k for Youth Centre and Kids Zone upgrades
- Over \$3.4m for new plant purchases and replacements including a camp accommodation, roller and various vehicles and plant are budgeted for sale/trade-in in this financial year.
- \$266k for repairing and repainting swimming pool basins.

INTEREST ON OVERDUE RATES AND CHARGES

An annual interest rate of 7%, calculated on a daily basis will apply to all overdue rates. If no election has been made to pay by instalment, interest on unpaid rates will accrue after 35 days from issue of rates notice. Penalty interest of 5.5% is also charged for late payments on instalments.

ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

Ratepayers experiencing difficulty in paying rates and charges are asked to contact Council’s Finance Officer as soon as possible before the due date to discuss alternative arrangements (e.g. Centrelink deductions). Special payment plans may be able to be arranged to suit your situation.

OBJECTIONS AND APPEALS

Appeals can be lodged against the accuracy of Council’s rating details or the rating valuations used in assessing rates. The appeal procedures vary but do not negate the normal responsibility to meet payment within the prescribed time limits. The Valuation of Land Act sets out the manner in which objections may be instituted as regards valuations. Objections must be lodged with the Valuer General's Office within 60 days of the issue of a Notice of Valuation and Rate. Regardless, rates must be paid, but are subject to adjustment if an objection is successful. Further information regarding rate valuations and lodging an objection can be found on the Rates link on the Shire website www.meekashire.wa.gov.au

CHANGE OF ADDRESS OR OWNERSHIP

It is a responsibility of the owner to ensure that the Council is notified in writing within 22 days of the sale/disposal of property. Advice as to changes of address are necessary to ensure correct service of rates notices.

RATE NOTICE QUERIES AND PENSIONER ELIGIBILITY

If you have any queries relating to your rate notice or would like to know more about pensioner eligibility please contact us.

EMERGENCY SERVICES LEVY

The Emergency Services Levy (ESL) is a State Government charge applicable to all properties in WA, which is invoiced and collected by local governments on behalf of the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES). The ESL provides the majority of funding required for career and volunteer Fire & Emergency Service brigades, DFES multi-function brigades/units, Bush Fire brigades and State Emergency Service units.

The amount of ESL to be collected, and the applicable rates and charging parameters, are declared annually by the Minister for Emergency Services.



AND HOW IS IT SPENT?


Income Sources

(\$12,728,449)




Operating Expenditure

ASTROTOURISM STAR GAZING

Meekatharra was lucky enough to have AstroTourism come to town and give us a tour of the night sky, tell us about the new telescope and let the community use their telescopes to see Saturn, the moon and a few constellations.

The night started off with dinner cooked by our Youth Services team then a presentation from AstroTourism staff, Riley. Shire President Harvey Nichols did a welcome speech and Amanda Shar did a very special Welcome to Country.

The presentation was about the new SKA telescope built in the Murchison, how it worked and why it was built in the region. The Murchison is one of the best places in the world to use telescopes due to the remoteness and lack of light pollution. The view of the stars is so clear and the astronomers are able to do some of the next work from this area.

We also learnt about black holes, galaxies, the moon, other planets and so much more. Everyone walked away knowing a few more things about the night sky and how small Earth is compared the galaxy and sun.



After the presentation there was a tour of sky, the astronomers and volunteers showed us different constellations like the Southern Cross, Scorpio and Sagittarius. As well as ways that the constellations were once used all over the world.

There were six telescopes that everyone was able to look through, the astronomers and volunteers all had something different to look at. For those of us who stayed late enough we were able to catch a glimpse of Saturn and its rings, an amazing sight to see the very clear image.




With music pumping and horns blaring, the Variety Club of W.A. made a some what noisy, but colourful entrance to town.



Vegetarian Minestrone

SERVES: 6 | PREP TIME: 20 MINS | COOK TIME: 6 HRS 45 MINS | INGREDIENTS: 16

ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 red onion, finely chopped
- 3 celery sticks, finely chopped
- 3 carrots, peeled, finely chopped
- 1 fennel bulb, trimmed, core removed, finely chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2.5L (10 cups) Massel vegetable liquid stock
- Mutti Polpa Finely Chopped Tomatoes 400g
- 400g can borlotti beans, rinsed, drained
- 1 parmesan rind, (or vegetarian hard cheese) (optional)
- 145g (1 cup) small dried macaroni
- 160g (4 cups) Coles Chopped Kale
- Basil pesto, to serve
- Fresh purple basil leaves, to serve
- Finely grated parmesan (or vegetarian hard cheese), to serve
- Bread, to serve

directions

- **Step 1** Heat the oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the onion , celery , carrot and fennel and cook, stirring often, for 10 minutes or until the vegetables are soft and lightly golden. Add garlic . Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until aromatic. Transfer to a 6L slow cooker. Stir in stock , tomato , beans and parmesan rind (or vegetarian hard cheese) , if using. Cover and cook on Low for 6 hours.
- **Step 2** Add pasta to the slow cooker. Stir to combine. Cover. Cook for a further 30 minutes or until pasta is al dente. Remove the parmesan rind (or vegetarian hard cheese). Stir in 2 cups of the chopped kale leaves.
- **Step 3** Divide the soup among serving bowls. Top with a few dollops of pesto and sprinkle with the basil , grated parmesan (or vegetarian hard cheese) and remaining 2 cups of chopped kale. Serve with bread.
