CEO COUNCIL MESSAGE

Welcome to the February 2024 edition of *The Dust CEO Council Message* Report which provides information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 20th January 2024 as well as the Audit Committee and Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meeting held on the same morning.

This section of *The Dust* is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Councils Ordinary Meetings that are held each month. The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only a summary extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Audit Committee Meeting 20th January 2024

Item 4.1 – Audited Financial Report

The Audit Committee recommended that Council accepts the 2022/23 Annual Report, financial statements, auditor report and management letter. The annual report is now available for public inspection at the shire office or online. The report will be sent to the Department within 30 days.

The Annual Electors Meeting is scheduled for 17th February 2024 commencing at 9am at the Shire Council Chambers.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Health, Building & Planning Committee Meeting 20th January 2024

Item 7.1.1 – Principal Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor’s Report

In accordance with the shared services agreement between the Shire of Meekatharra and the Shire of East Pilbara, the report provided a summary of building, planning and environmental health matters for December 2023. This included all activities, the progress of ongoing projects and concerns related to the required services raised by the Shire of East Pilbara. Further detail is available in the minutes of the Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor’s Report.

Item 7.1.2 – Community Development & Services Manager’s Report

Entry Statements

The plaque for the Time Capsule at the northern entry statement has arrived and will be installed on a rock to mark the spot of the capsule. A visitor centre wall panel is being designed, explaining the meaning of the artwork on the entry statement.

Event Update

The Town Christmas Party on 8th December was a huge success with great turnout. The team is planning the Meeka Community Awards for 26th January.

Item 7.1.3 - Local Planning Scheme No4 and Strategy

A revised version of the draft Scheme and Strategy was presented to the Committee, taking into consideration feedback and amendments suggested by the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage.

Item 9.3.1 – Mining Tenement Applications

That Council approve the following Applications from:

- 3. Mining Prospecting Licence Application 51/3379 from Robert Wood of Meekatharra situated at Chesterfield.*

Council considers mining applications received for the district on a monthly basis.

Item 9.4.1 – Gym Use by Meekatharra District High School

Council considered a request by the High School for the usage of the Shire's Community Gym in order for the school to run fitness sessions for students aged 15 years and older. Council approved this request subject to a number of conditions and granted a substantial waiver of the normal gym fees to allow a special discounted school group fee.

Item 11.1 - Annual Report and Audited Financial Report

Council accepted the Annual Report and Audited Financials as per the Audit Committee's recommendation.

Item 13.1 – Bitumen Sealing Works Meekatharra Airport

Council opted for a best practice approach as recommended by the approved contractor (Bitutek Pty Ltd) for an additional 'sand seal emulsion treatment' for the Meekatharra Airport resealing project. A sand seal emulsion treatment will provide best value for money,


longevity and will increase serviceability of the runway for jet aircraft usage. The additional sand seal works will be funded through the Airport Runway Reserve. The airport works will commence 10th March 2024 which means the airport will be closed for 2-3 weeks. The works are essential in the upkeep and sustainability of the airport and involves the runway, apron, taxiway and RFDS area. Some disruption to flights will occur and the community is advised to check with Public Notices that will be advertised closer to the date.

Further Information Snippets

- A new Community Development & Services Manager, David Schulz, has been appointed and will commence duties on the 5th February 2024 that will allow a handover period with the outgoing CDSM Svenja Clare. Council extends its gratitude and best wishes to Svenja and Pete as they embark on the next chapter of their lives in the south west of the State. David Schulz comes to Meekatharra from Darwin where he has worked extensively with indigenous communities and youth at various not for profit organizations and his own consultancy business. We welcome David to the Shire and indeed to the community of Meekatharra.
- Our current Deputy Chief Executive Officer (DCEO), Peter Dittrich has sadly departed the Shire of Meekatharra (prior to Christmas) and advertising for the position closed in mid January 2024. It is expected interviews of potential applicants will occur in early February 2024 with an anticipated appointment being made towards the end of February. Mr Darren Friend has been appointed as A/DCEO until a new DCEO is appointed.

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council is scheduled for Saturday 17th February 2024 so the next CEO *Council Message* column will appear in the March 2024 edition. Until then bye for now!

Cash is king... or is it?

"Businesses have to accept legal tender." It's a comment we hear a lot at Consumer Protection, so I wanted to take the opportunity to clear this up and let you know what the law says about it.

Businesses can choose which payment types they accept. It is legal for a business to specify the terms and conditions that they will supply goods and services. This includes whether they will accept cash payment.

However, you must be made aware of these terms and conditions before you make a purchase. This could be a clear sign at the register or door stating the business does not accept cash, or the staff verbally informing you that you can't pay with cash.

We know a lot of people like to pay with cash to avoid credit card surcharges. The good news is there are rules about this too. Card surcharges are permitted under the Australian Consumer Law, however the fee must only reflect what it actually costs the business to process the payment, such as bank fees or terminal costs. If a business charges a payment surcharge, it must be able to prove the costs it is based on.

If there is no other way for you to pay without incurring a surcharge, then the business must include the fee in the total cost. For example, your local café charges \$5 for a coffee, but they do not accept cash, and all card payments are surcharged. Then it is not possible for you to buy that coffee at \$5. If the surcharge is 1% then the price displayed must clearly be \$5.05 so you can easily tell how much your coffee really costs.

While the costs associated with taking card payments is obvious, there are also costs for dealing in cash. Handling cash costs businesses in time and wages.

Remember, purchasing goods or services is entering into an agreement with a seller. You do not have to agree to make the purchase if the payment methods aren't acceptable to you. But, it is legal for the business to refuse to accept cash so long as they have made this clear.

If you believe a business is breaching the rules, it's best to broach it with them first. Should negotiations fail, contact Consumer Protection on 1300 30 40 54, or consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au.

1. Bring a medium-sized saucepan of water to the boil. Add beans and simmer for 2 minutes until they are bright green. Remove beans with a slotted spoon and refresh under cold water. Alternatively cook beans in the microwave on HIGH (100%) for 2 minutes with a tablespoon of water in a microwave-safe bowl.
2. Add pasta to the boiling water and cook according to packet directions until just tender.
3. Drain well and add to a large serving bowl with drained beans and remaining salad ingredients.
4. In a small jug, mix together dressing ingredients then pour over salad. Toss until well combined.
5. Serve immediately or enjoy cold the next day.

Ingredients

- ▲ 300 g green beans, ends trimmed, cut into 3cm pieces
- ▲ 200 g spiral or bowtie pasta (3 cups cooked)
- ▲ 420 g can reduced-salt corn kernels, drained
- ▲ 420 g can no-added-salt four bean mix, drained
- ▲ 250 g punnet cherry tomatoes, halved
- ▲ 1 medium red capsicum, seeded and cut into 2-3cm pieces
- ▲ 1/2 red onion, peeled and finely chopped
- ▲ 1/2 cup fat-free semi-sundried tomatoes, drained and chopped
- ▲ 1/2 cup flat-leaf parsley, finely chopped
- ▲ 1/2 cup basil leaves, shredded
- ▲ For the dressing:
 - ▲ 1 1/2 tbs Dijon mustard
 - ▲ 1/2 tbs honey
 - ▲ 1/2 tbs white vinegar
 - ▲ 1/2 tbs water
