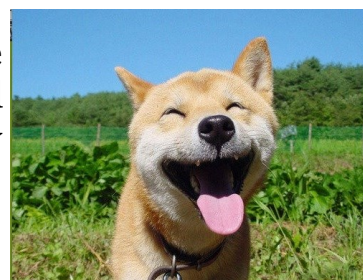
Note from Council

Your Council News

Decisions, Decisions

There's plenty on the Council's plate at the moment, with a diverse range of topics, requests and budget decisions to be put forward and responded to. The oval lights and water usage (stand pipe) schedule of fees and charges were on the May Council meeting agenda, as were those of the airport, namely landing fees and passenger service charges (mainly on the Skippers and charter flights).

The Isolated Children's Parents Association of WA put in a request for a donation, and there was an application for the lease on the Red Sandbox facilities from The Growth Church - see next page for details. Like many communities, the provision of facilities, programs and support for youth are often at the top of the list of the shire's "to do" list, with many different people and organisations in Meekatharra and the goldfields region also contributing to what can be provided for our children and youth in our remote area.

The Council is also discussing the possibility of taking on the old Power Station at the corner of Main and Savage Streets. Considerations would have to be made in regard to any contamination remediation and other requirements of the site. The old power station has an interesting history and with its central location in town, many locals have expressed an interest in what its future might become.

In regard to the standpipe water and oval lights, the Council resolved that the following two new charges be included in the 2016/17 Draft Schedule of Fees and Charges as follows:

Standpipe Water (non potable)

- For consumers of more than 20,000 litres per financial year, charge is calculated at the Water Corporation Charge plus 100%. Currently $\$2.159 \times 2 = \4.318 per kilolitre (1,000 litres) - ie 20,000 litres will be charged $20 \times \$4.318 = \86.36 .

- For consumers of over 20,000 litres per financial year, an application to the CEO will be required. Consumers to advise of quantity taken each time to allow for the appropriate charge to be applied.

Sports Complex

- Oval lights to be charged per hour of use

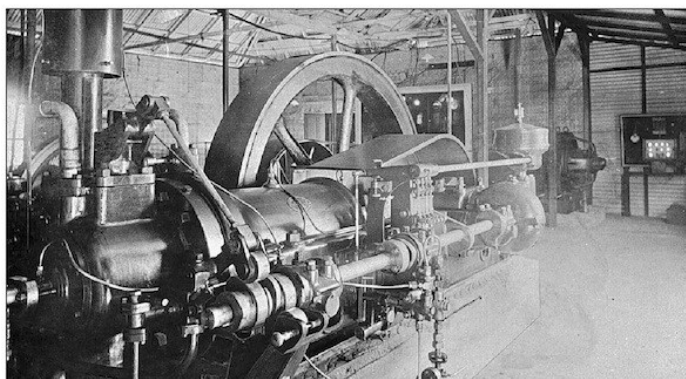
The Council also resolved that "the final draft of the 2016/17 Schedule of Fees and Charges are to be presented to Council for adoption at the same Ordinary Council meeting that Council will be adopting the Annual Budget for 2016/17, to be effective as of 1st July 2016."

Power To The People

The future use of the old power house shed (in Savage Street, across from the Department of Mines offices) will continue to be under consideration as the Shire and Horizon Power discuss possible outcomes. At the May council meeting, the Council decided to advise Horizon Power that it objects to the planned demolition of the old power house shed. With environmental factors still to be determined (remediation, auditing and reporting requirements) by the Department of Environment Regulation, the Council is deferring any decision in regard to its involvement with the site until more information is available.



Meeka has an unusual power-supply history. Did you know that we were the first Australian town to be powered by solar energy? A solar-diesel power station was completed in 1982; it was the largest in the world. Ahead of its time, the project only lasted until 1985, and Meeka now runs on diesel at the power station on the Gascoyne Junction/Carnarvon Road.

Many of us in town take our power for granted, but it takes a lot of local hands-on maintenance, supervision and chuck-your-blunnies-on-over-your-pyjamas wee hours call-outs to keep our TVs and freezers going. Boost For Our Remote Area Kids

The Council has agreed to donate five hundred dollars to the Isolated Children's Parents Association of WA for sponsorship of the 2016 Federal Convention. The association is dedicated to education access for rural and remote Australian students, including our station and remote community kids. Interestingly, the "Meekatharra Air Branch" was the first ICPA branch to be formed in WA in 1971. The current local branch president is Raelene Hall, of Neds Creek Station, and interested readers can find out more by looking at the ICPAWA website.



New Sandbox Lease

The Growth Church's request for a lease of the Red Sandbox facility has been approved, subject to the approval of the Minister for Lands. The lease will be for 2 years with an option for another 2 years if both parties are in agreement for a continuation.

Airport Fees & Charges On The Agenda

Further resolved at the May Council meeting, in relation to Airport fees and charges, that Council:

- Sets the Head Tax for RPT Flights at \$15.00 (per passenger) including GST for arrivals and departures;
- No Landing Fees shall apply to RPT flights;
- Landing fee for General Aviation be set at
 - under 5700 kg MTOW \$16.50 including GST per MT MTOW
 - over 5700 kg MTOW \$22.00 including GST per MT MTOW
- Landing Fees for Charter Operations over 5700 kg MTOW to be set at \$22.00 including GST per MTMTOW
- In addition to the Landing Fee a Head Tax for incoming and outgoing charter passengers of \$15.00 including GST shall apply
- Only General Aviation landing fees will apply to Charter Aircraft under 5700 kg MTOW
- Sets the Small Aircraft Annual Landing Fee
 - Ratepayers Only, under 1500 kg MTOW at \$250.00 including GST
 - Current conditions apply.
- Sets the minimum for any one landing at \$22.00 inc. GST



*MTOW = Maximum Take Off Weight
* MT = Metric Tonne,
* RPT = Regular Public Transport

It's coming up to WA's famous wildflower and prospecting season, with locals and visitors both enjoying Meekatharra's heritage walks and trails as the weather cools down. If you're keen and quiet and willing to tiptoe about in the very early morning, you may be lucky enough to spot one of the red kangaroos who have been grazing along the section behind the historic bakery, or the pair of Number 28 parrots who've been spotted frolicking in the bush behind the aged care hostel. The Lookout and Peace Gorge are both easy an walk or bike ride from town, and you can obtain maps, brochures, books and information from the Shire offices at the intersection of Main and Savage Streets in the heart of town.

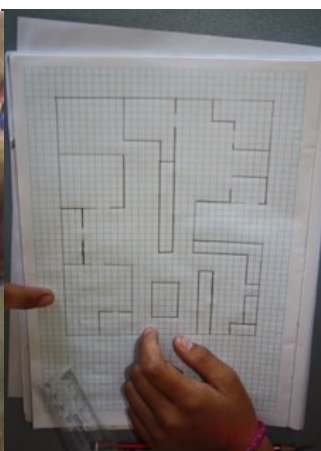


Meekatharra District High School

The unit plans were completed on Excel worksheets, with some very professional designs.



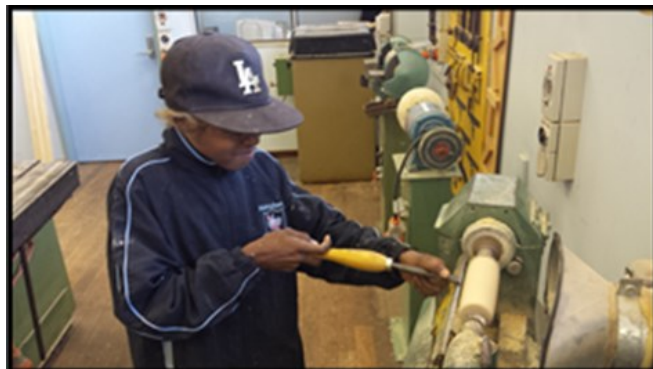

Practice Makes Perfect

On the evening of Tuesday 10 May 2016, the main street of Meekatharra was transformed into a sea of flashing red and blue lights as emergency services responded to a spillage of Chlorine gas coming from the Meekatharra Swimming Pool.

Residents would be excused for thinking that perhaps Armageddon had arrived, as those unaware of the situation would likely have thought the worst. To an observer, it would have appeared that there was mass confusion and a lack of a cohesive and appropriate response. However, the situation was not all that it seemed. The scenario was an exercise created by the Meekatharra Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) to allow local emergency responders to practice their craft and to allow the LEMC to validate their Emergency Plans.

Emergency Services from the Fire & Rescue Service, State Emergency Service, WA Police, St John Ambulance, the Shire of Meekatharra and the Meekatharra Hospital turned out to manage the 'situation' and rescue and treat volunteer 'victims' who were affected by the 'gas' to varying degrees.

While this was an exercise scenario, all participants took their roles seriously and everyone contributed towards the end goal of returning the community to a state of normality as quickly as possible.

During any emergency situation, whether it be an exercise or the real deal, there is always a degree of confusion as responders struggle to come to grips with what they are faced with and strive to gather information so they can make well informed judgments and direct their energy and resources to get the best result.

As a result of the exercise, emergency service providers in Meekatharra are better prepared to handle emergency situations.

Being a volunteer for any emergency service or organisation is a very worthwhile and rewarding pastime, and provides opportunities to participate in training and contribute to the betterment of the community.

A special thank you is extended to the individuals who volunteered their time to participate as 'victims' in this exercise, and in particular to the students and teachers from the Meekatharra School who helped.

Liquor Restrictions

Over the recent ANZAC Day weekend, it became necessary to introduce liquor restrictions in Meekatharra due to an escalation of anti-social and unruly behaviour occurring. The initial restrictions introduced by the Meekatharra Alcohol Accord resulted patrons only being permitted to purchase mid-strength products.

However, as the anti-social behaviour continued, it became necessary to impose restrictions under Section 114 of the Liquor Control Act, effectively banning the sale of all 'take-away' alcoholic beverages for a period of time. This had the effect of reducing the amount of alcohol within the community and significantly reduced the associated behaviour.

Unfortunately, due to the behaviour of some individuals and groups within the community, and their inability to control their actions when effected by alcohol which impacted upon many service providers within the community, it became necessary to take steps to reduce this problem.

The decision to impose Liquor Restrictions is not taken lightly, and while there may be disruption to some responsible community members, the welfare and safety of the entire community is far more important and will always take precedence.

We would like to take this opportunity to recognise and thank the Licensed Premises within Meekatharra for their support in these circumstances.

Securing Your Property

We once again take this opportunity to remind everyone that the security of your property and the prevention of its theft is your responsibility. Many crimes committed in Meekatharra arise due to opportunities presenting themselves because of poor security measures and victims leaving items of property unsecured and/or visible to potential thieves.

By taking simple steps to secure your items, you significantly reduce the risk of having your property stolen.

Volatile Substance Abuse

There is continuing concern in Meekatharra about inhalant use or “sniffing” among a small group of young people. Inhalant use or volatile substance use (VSU) is a very dangerous practice and can cause real harm and even death. While it tends to come and go, the impact of even a small number of users can be significant, having devastating effects on the user, their families and the community. We need to act quickly to stop the misuse of volatile substances now and to stop its use spreading among the community.

The best way to address this issue is for all of us to do our bit by keeping volatile substance products locked away and/or out of sight and report any theft of products that you notice to the Meekatharra Police Station on 9981 1007.

If you have any queries about what products should be kept locked away please contact Meekatharra Police Station or the **24 hour Alcohol and Drug Support Line (ADSL)** on **1800 198 024**.

As the practice can spread fast, we need to know about any sniffing that might be happening as soon as possible so we can respond quickly. You can report any sniffing that you see, or know about, to the **Midwest Community Alcohol Drug Service** on **9956 2424** or mwcads@health.wa.gov.au

You can choose to remain anonymous if you wish. Together we can reduce volatile substance use and keep our community and our young people healthy and safe.

Examples of products containing volatile substances

- Petrol, glues (industrial, super glue, modelling glue etc), toluene based products (such as paint thinners, paint strippers, sealants); dry cleaning fluids, correction fluid/liquid paper, felt tip markers, nail polish and nail polish remover
- Aerosols including, but not limited to, spray paint, deodorant, hairspray, fly spray, vegetable oil cooking spray, air fresheners, oven cleaner etc
- Whipped cream bulbs (nitrous oxide), cigarette lighter refill aerosols (butane), butane gas cartridges for portable cooking stoves, cylinder propane gas, bottled domestic gas, fire extinguishers
- Amyl nitrite, butyl nitrite

Examples of volatile substances/ ingredients

- Acetone
 - Bromochlorodifluoromethane
 - Butane
 - Chloroform
 - Ethyl acetate
 - Hydrocarbons (aliphatic, aromatic and halogenated)
 - Petroleum
 - Propane
 - Tetrachloroethylene
 - Toluene
 - Trichloroethane
 - Trichloroethylene
 - Xylene

Prospecting popularity prompts safety message to carry personal locator beacons.

The Department of Mines and Petroleum (DMP) has launched its annual Seven Golden Rules for Prospecting campaign to highlight safe and sustainable practices.

Mineral Titles Executive Director Dr Ivor Roberts said the department had issued more than 17,000 Miner's Rights for prospecting in Western Australia in the past five years.

"A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by tourists visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms.

"That is an incredible number and is indicative of gold prospecting's continued popularity in this State," Dr Roberts said.

Dr Roberts said safety should always be a prospector's number one priority.

"Western Australia's outback can be a harsh, remote environment, which is why personal safety is such an important consideration when prospecting in this State," he said.

"This is why we encourage everyone to carry Personal Locator Beacons (PLBs) when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be purchased from most outdoor stores, is ideal for use in remote areas as it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

PLBs are the best way of avoiding the sometimes tragic results of getting lost in the Goldfields and the outback.

The Seven Golden Rules campaign will see DMP offices, tourist bureaus, libraries and caravan parks targeted with posters, brochures and booklets.

The Seven Golden Rules for prospecting are:

1. Put safety first – Your safety is your responsibility
2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit- when prospecting on Crown land
3. Obtain a 40E permit – prior to prospecting on an exploration tenement
4. Get written permission – if you want to prospect on someone else's mining tenement
5. Comply with all legal requirements – when prospecting on a pastoral lease
6. Show respect when on Crown land – because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes
7. Fill any holes – repair any ground disturbances that you make.

Spiced Chickpea and Spinach Pasta



- 700g butternut pumpkin, peeled, cut into 2cm pieces
- Olive oil cooking spray
- 375g dried penne
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 brown onion, halved, cut into thin wedges
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 2 teaspoons sweet paprika
- 2 x 400g cans chickpeas, drained, rinsed
- 1/2 cup salt-reduced vegetable stock
- 100g baby spinach
- 2 tablespoons fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves, chopped
- Parmesan, or vegetarian hard cheese, shaved, to serve

1. Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Line a large baking tray with baking paper. Arrange pumpkin on baking tray. Spray with oil. Roast for 20 minutes or until golden and tender.
2. Meanwhile, cook pasta in a saucepan of boiling salted water, following packet directions, until tender. Drain. Cover.
3. Heat oil in a large, deep frying pan over medium heat. Add onion. Cook for 5 minutes or until softened. Add garlic, cumin and paprika. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant. Add chickpeas and pumpkin. Cook, tossing, for 2 minutes. Using the back of a wooden spoon, lightly crush 1/4 of the chickpeas.
4. Add stock and spinach to pan. Season with salt and pepper. Cook, tossing, for 3 to 4 minutes or until spinach just wilts. Add pasta and parsley. Toss until heated through. Divide pasta among serving bowls. Top with parmesan. Serve.

Apple Crumble Slice



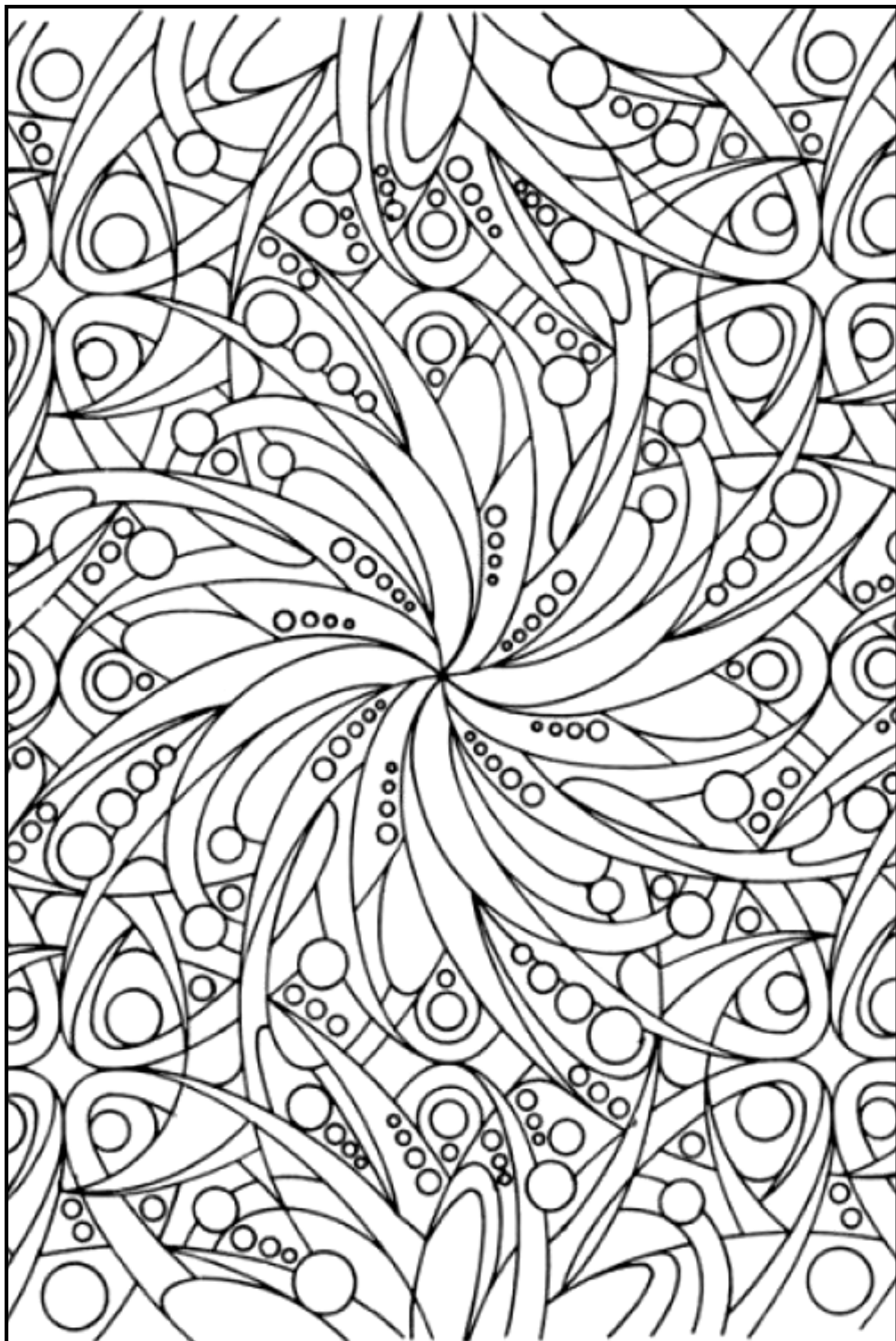
Apple Slice

- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/2 cup self-raising flour
- 1/2 cup cornflour
- 1/3 cup caster sugar
- 125g butter, chilled, chopped
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup iced water
- 6 large (1.4kg) Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, cut into thin wedges
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- Icing sugar mixture, for dusting

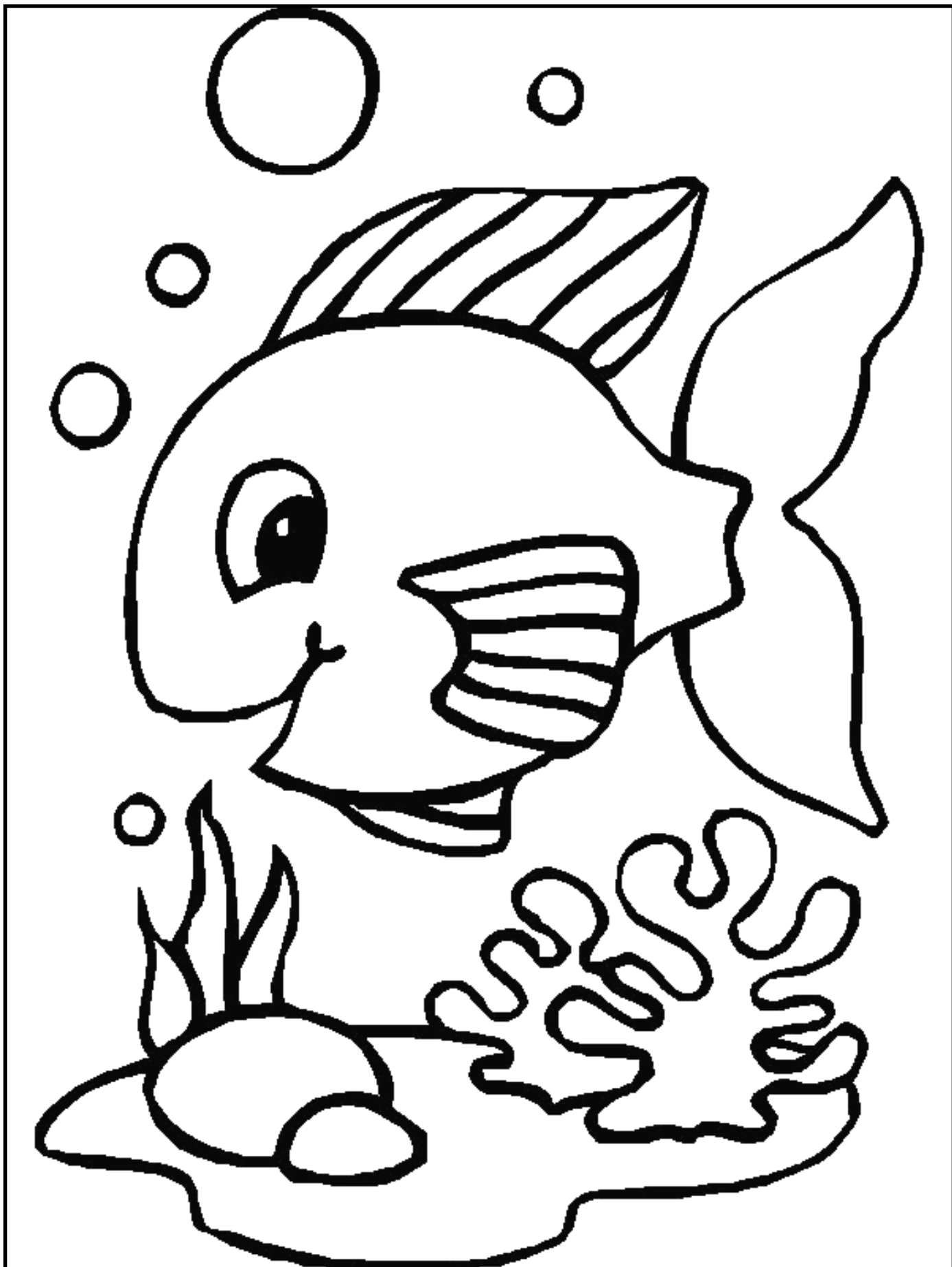
Almond crumble

- 1/3 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2/3 cup plain flour
- 60g butter, chopped
- 2/3 cup slivered almonds

1. Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan-forced. Grease a 20cm x 30cm lamington pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 5cm above edges of pan.
2. Place flours, sugar and butter in a food processor. Process until fine crumbs form. Add egg and water. Process until pastry comes together. Place in prepared pan. Using floured hands, press pastry evenly over base and sides of pan. Refrigerate for 20 minutes. Line pastry with baking paper. Fill with baking weights or uncooked rice. Blind-bake for 14 minutes or until edges are light golden. Remove weights or rice and paper. Bake for a further 8 minutes or until light golden.
3. Meanwhile, place apples and 1/2 cup water in a large saucepan. Bring to the boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to medium-low. Cover. Simmer, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes or until wedges are tender but still hold their shape. Drain well. Return to pan with lemon juice. Toss to coat.
4. Make Almond crumble: Combine sugar, baking powder and cinnamon in a small bowl. Place flour in a large bowl. Using your fingertips, rub butter into flour until mixture resembles coarse breadcrumbs. Add sugar mixture and almonds. Stir to combine.
5. Increase oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Spoon apple mixture into pastry case. Sprinkle with crumble. Bake for 30 minutes or until golden. Cool for 30 minutes. Dust with icing sugar. Serve cut into pieces.
