Extracts from DLGSC Department Circular 8 2020

"It (Council involvement in the recruitment of employees and "senior employees") does not extend to participating in the actual recruitment and selection process in any way.

The recruitment of employees, including senior employees, must not include a member of council."

Extract from Local Government Act 1995 Section 5.37

- 1) "A local government may designate employees or persons belonging to a class of employee to be senior employees.
- 2) The CEO is to inform the council of each proposal to employ or dismiss a senior employee, other than a senior employee referred to in section 5.39(1a) and the council may accept or reject the CEO's recommendation but if the council rejects a recommendation, it is to inform the CEO of the reasons for it's doing so."

Council and the CEO in the past have chosen not to designate "senior employees" because it can slow the recruitment process and causes extra legislative requirements to be undertaken.

However, given this rather unfortunate and short-sighted ruling by the Department, Council may, in the near future, wish to consider its options in terms of the recruitment process for the Shires three management positions.

As it stands, in the absence of this panel, the CEO is solely responsible for the recruitment of all employees, including the three managers.

#### Aircraft Movements and Statistics

Aircraft movements for General Aviation, Charter & RPT increased compared to October 2020. Increases in GA aircraft can be attributed to the increase in mining activity through the region. AVGAS drum sales to the pastoral industry account for 46% of the AVGAS fuel sales this month. Increased aerial survey activities in the region have also seen an increase in bulk drum/trailer sales of JET A1.

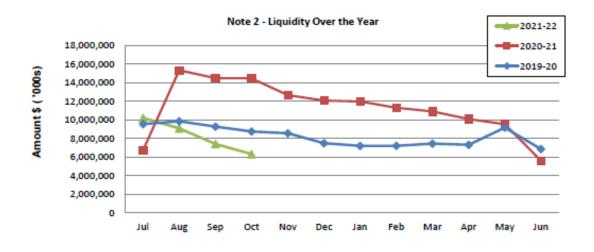

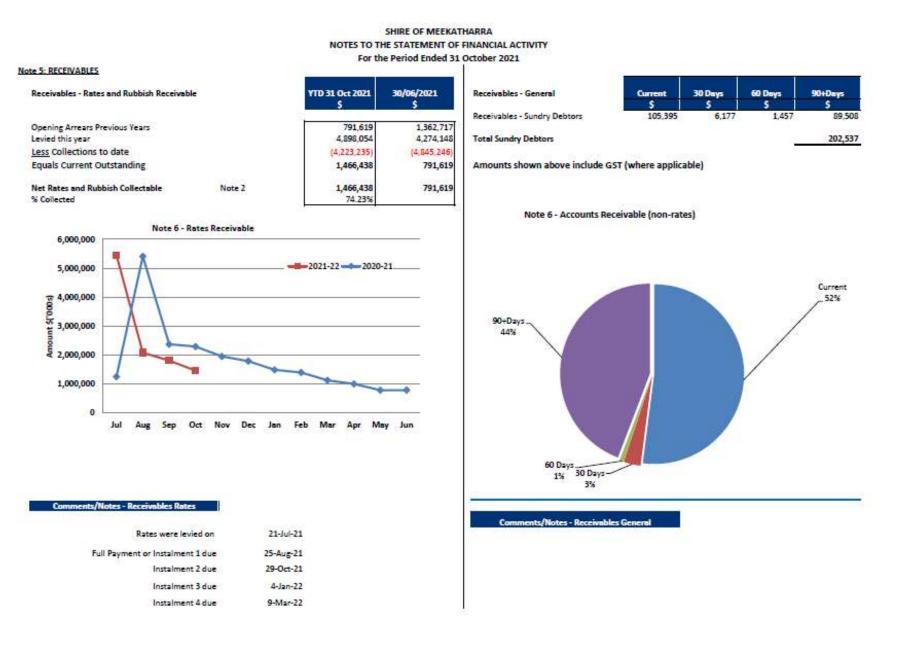

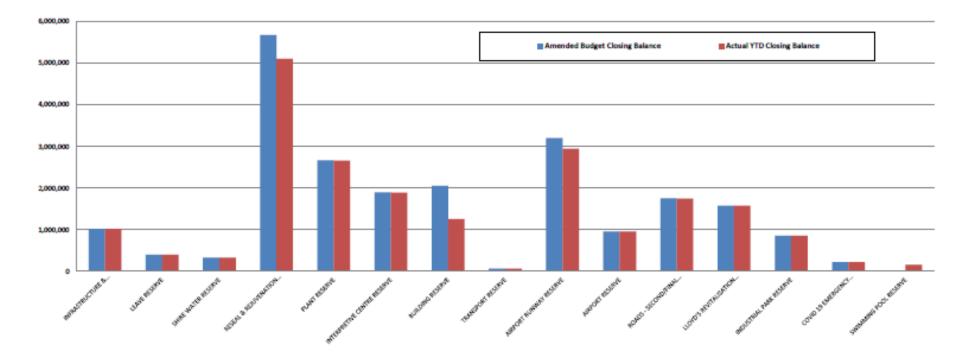

### **Background:**

Two nominations were received for four positions at the recent ordinary council election.

Council resolved to conduct an extraordinary election to fill the two vacant positions. Nominations for the extraordinary election closed at 4.00pm on Thursday 14 October 2021. No nominations were received.

At the Council meeting 16 October 2021, Council resolved:

"That Council resolves to consider appointing two persons as Councillors at the November 2021 Council meeting. The process to achieve this is as follows;

The process is to be generally in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Government Act 1995 and the Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997.

The CEO is to advertise the two positions on the Shires website, shire social media pages, shire and town notice boards and in "The Dust".

Potential candidates are to;

- complete the online Induction for Prospective Candidates,
- complete a Nomination Form (LG08),
- provide a compliant Candidate's Profile (s. 4.49(b) & Reg. 24)
- submit their nomination (as above) to the CEO by 4.00pm Thursday 11 November 2021.

In terms of enrollment, candidates are deemed eligible if they are on the state electoral roll or the owners and occupiers roll at the time of their nomination (subject to confirmed compliance with section 3.57 (3) of the Act).

The CEO is to provide to the November 2021 ordinary Council meeting each <u>eligible</u> candidates nomination form and profile. Council will then consider appointing two of the candidates as Councillors.

If two candidates are appointed by Council, the CEO/Returning Officer will then draw lots to determine the order of their retirement (two or four year term)."

Nominations from three candidates have been accepted at the close of nominations: Judith Holden Nick Wren Barkley Day

# **Comment:**

In this circumstance, the Local Government Act 1995 (the Act) provides that council "may appoint to any unfilled office a person who would be eligible to be a candidate for election to office and who is willing to accept the appointment."

Beyond this provision in the Act, staff can find no other references in legislation or other documents as to the requirements and processes to undertake such appointments.

On the face of it, it appears to be quite a simple provision, however interpretation of the detail that may be required appears to potentially be quite complicated and critical. Staff have contacted the Electoral Commission and the Department of Local Government for advice on the matter. Copies of emails with the Department are attached.

Section 4.57 (3) of the Act is discretionary – that is; Council is not <u>required</u> to make any appointment (it can choose not to appoint anyone as Councillors). What happens thereafter is not clear in terms of the legislation (as far as can be established so far).

Should Council resolve to appoint less than two persons as Councillors (one or none) then it is recommended that the CEO do further research and if required seek legal advice from Councils lawyers regarding what should happen next. The Local Government Act 1995 does not appear to provide a clear course of action in this situation.

The adoption of a transparent and clear process for these appointments will reduce the potential for conflict, complaints and negativity within the wider community. Council may therefore consider holding a secret ballot to decide who should be appointed as Councillors. This would be like a mini election with each Councillor completing a ballot paper by ticking two boxes (first past the post system). In the event of a tie with two people having the same number of votes it could be rerun using the preferential voting system (numbering each box from 1 upwards. Or, perhaps more correctly, the CEO could decide who, of the tied candidates, should be appointed by drawing lots (as would be the case in a normal election).

Council has absolute discretion on how it goes about this process and there are many potential decisions and methods of appointment that could be used.

Staff have provided four possibilities as recommendations;

Option A; Appoint two Councillors by secret ballot (a mini election) Option B; Appoint two Councillors by discussion and reaching consensus Option C; Appoint one Councillor only - by discussion and reaching consensus Option D; Make no appointments. Should any Councillor wish to do something different or to use a different method to those provided above please contact the CEO prior to the meeting to enable any necessary research and arrangements to be made prior to the Council meeting.

### "4.57. Less candidates than vacancies

- (1) If, at the close of nominations, there are no candidates for the office or offices to be filled at the election, an extraordinary election is to be held to fill the office or offices as if it or they had become vacant on the day after the close of nominations.
- (2) If, at the close of nominations, the number of candidates is less than the number of offices to be filled at the election
  - (a) the candidate or candidates is or are elected; and
  - (b) an extraordinary election is to be held to fill the remaining office or offices as if it or they had become vacant on the day after the close of nominations.
- (3) If, at the close of nominations for an extraordinary election required under subsection (1) or (2) there are no candidates or the number of candidates is less than the number of offices to be filled at the election, the council may appoint\* to any unfilled office a person who would be eligible to be a candidate for election to the office and who is willing to accept the appointment.

\* Absolute majority required.

(4) A person appointed under subsection (3) is to be regarded as having been elected.

# 4.48. Candidate, eligibility of

- (1) If the election is to fill an office or offices of councillor, a person can only be a candidate if the person was an elector of the district who, as at the close of enrolments, was qualified under section 2.19 to be elected as a member of the council and, at the time of nomination
  - (a) the person is qualified under section 2.19 to be elected as a member of the council; and
  - (b) the person is not a candidate in another election to fill an office or offices of councillor on the council; and
  - (c) the person is not the holder of an office of member of a council other than an office the term of which will end on, or before, election day; and
  - (d) the person has completed the course of induction prescribed for the purposes of this subsection.
- (2) If the election is to fill the office of elector mayor or president, a person can only be a candidate if —

- (a) the person was an elector of the district who, as at the close of enrolments and at the time of nomination, was qualified under section 2.19 to be elected as a member of the council; and
- (b) at the time of nomination, the person has completed the course of induction prescribed for the purposes of this subsection.

# 2.19. Qualifications for election to council

- (1) A person is qualified to be elected as a member of a council if the person
  - (a) is of or over the age of 18 years; and
  - (b) is an elector of the district; and
  - [(c) deleted]
  - (d) is not disqualified for membership of the council under section 2.20, 2.21, 2.22, 2.23 or 2.24; and
  - (e) is not disqualified by an order under section 5.113, 5.117 or 5.119 from holding office as a member of a council.
- (2) A person is not qualified under subsection (1)(b) if he or she is only eligible for enrolment under section 4.30(1)(a) and (b)—
  - (a) as the nominee of a body corporate under section 4.31; or
  - (b) because of Schedule 9.3, clause 12(2).
- (3) A person who is qualified under subsection (1) can be elected as a councillor for a ward whether or not he or she is an elector of that ward.
- **Note:** An interpretation of section 2.32 of the Act (How extraordinary vacancies occur in offices elected by electors) indicates the current two vacancies are not extraordinary vacancies under that clause. This appears to therefore negate all the other requirements that provide for dealing with extraordinary vacancies and extraordinary elections.

### 2.32. How extraordinary vacancies occur in offices elected by electors

*The office of a member of a council as an elector mayor or president or as a councillor becomes vacant if the member*—

- (a) dies; or
- (b) resigns from the office; or
- (c) does not make the declaration required by section 2.29(1) within 2 months after being declared elected to the office; or
- (d) advises or accepts under section 2.27 that he or she is disqualified, or is declared to be disqualified by the State Administrative Tribunal acting on an application under section 2.27; or

(da) is disqualified by an order under section 5.113, 5.117 or 5.119 from holding office as a member of a council; or

- (db) is dismissed under section 8.15L or 8.25(2); or
- *(e) becomes the holder of any office or position in the employment of the local government; or*

(f) having been elected to an office of councillor, is elected by the electors to the office of mayor or president of the council."

The legislation is silent on the matter of how council are to appoint an eligible person and time limits, though it would be preferable to finalise the process sooner rather than later. Unfortunately, council would not be able to operate until the next ordinary election by leaving the positions vacant as it would not comply with ss4.16 and 4.17 of the LG Act.

The Department's view is that Option B would represent best practice, however the Shire may wish to consider whether a nomination form and candidate profile is still necessary. Please note that the Department is unable to provide a legal opinion on this matter. Should the Shire continue to have concerns about the process, you are encouraged to seek independent legal advice.

### **Background:**

In September 2020, policy 01.09 was amended to incorporate the mandated requirements for the professional development of council members as per Section 5.128 of the Local Government Act 1995.

Section 5.128(5)(a) states:

- "(5) A local government
  - (a) must review the policy after each ordinary election; and
  - (b) may review the policy at any other time."

# **Comment:**

In September 2021, nominations were called for the Local Government Ordinary Election and only 2 nominations were received for the 4 vacant positions. No election was required as both nominees were automatically appointed as Councillors.

If an Ordinary Election had been required this would have taken place on 16 October 2021.

Whilst no actual Ordinary Election was undertaken due to lack of nominees, it is prudent for Council to review the policy to ensure compliance. The Policy remains relevant with no changes needed at this review time.

# 01.09 - Councillors Training Course, Conference Attendance Registration and Expenses

- Reviewed and Amended 17 October 2020

### INTRODUCTION:

It is important that Councillors, as part of their roles and responsibilities, participate in professional development by attending conferences, training courses, seminars and development programs.

The intention of this policy is to ensure that Councillors are given the opportunity to participate in professional development without being financially disadvantaged.

Budgetary provision will be made each year to cover the costs of sending Councillors to approved conferences, training courses, seminars and development programs and where practicable, to have training courses delivered in Meekatharra.

## OBJECTIVE:

To provide the opportunity for Councillors to participate in ongoing professional development in areas directly related with the provision of local government services.

### POLICY:

- Authority is delegated to the Chief Executive Officer to register Councillors for conferences, seminars and training courses, and to prepay registration fees, accommodation and meals, subject to available budget provision;
- Authority be delegated to the Chief Executive Officer to register and prepay for a Councillor's partner for participation in the "Partners Program" including the conference dinner if part of the conference or seminar program, and covered by an appropriate budget provision.
- If the proposed attendance at a conference, seminar or training course is not covered by an appropriate budget provision the express approval of the Council must be sought by the Councillor to attend, including authorisation of expenses such as a dinner for the attendee, and, if applicable the Councillors partner.

Note the above point 3 only applies to prepaid registrations. If a Councillor attends an event and seeks a reimbursement, that attendance must be authorised prior to the event, in accordance with Section 5.98 of the Local Government Act (1995) and Local Government (Administration) Regulation 32. The conferences to which this policy applies shall generally be confined to:

- Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA), Murchison Zone of the Local Government Association;
- Special 'one off' conferences called or sponsored by or for WALGA and/or Murchison Zone on important issues;
- 3. Annual conferences of the major Local Government professional bodies;
- Conferences, seminars or training courses which advance the development Elected Members in their role as Councillors;
- Any meetings or conferences of organisations or bodies on which a Councillor may be elected, or appointed to be a delegate or member of the Council or WALGA.

Attendance by a Councillor at any conference, seminar, congress, forum, workshop, course, meeting, deputation, information or training session, event, etc. related to the industry of local government which is held interstate or overseas, must be authorised prior to departure by specific resolution of the Council and such resolution shall specify and detail the conditions of attendance.

## TRAINING:

## Mandatory training

The Local Government Act 1995 stipulates that each council member must complete training in accordance with regulations. Regulation 35 of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 stipulates Elected Members must complete Council Member Essentials that comprises the following modules unless a prescribed exemption applies:

- Understanding Local Government
- Conflicts of Interest
- Serving on Council
- Meeting Procedures and Debating
- Understanding Financial Reports and Budgets

Training must be completed within 12 months from the day on which the council member is elected.

Council's preferred provider is WALGA (WA Local Government Association). All associated costs associated with this training will be paid for by the Shire. The training is valid for 5 years.

Council's preference is for Members to undertake this training via eLearning which is the most cost effective method but acknowledge that a Member may choose to receive face-to-face training which is being delivered in the region or in the metropolitan area.

### Other training

Consideration of attendance at training or professional development courses, other than the online Council Member Essentials are to be assessed as follows:

- Events for the Shire President must be approved by either the Council or the Deputy Shire President, in conjunction with the CEO; and
- Events for Councillors must be approved by either the Council or the Shire President, in conjunction with the CEO.

## Publish on website

The Shire will publish on the Shire's website training undertaken by all Elected Members within one month after the end of the financial year pursuant to the Local Government Act 1995.

## EXPENSES

The following shall apply for Councillors authorised and/or appointed as delegates under this policy to attend conferences or registered to attend training courses, seminars or development programs:

## 1) Registration

The Council will pay all normal registration costs for Councillors/delegates, which are charged by organisers, including those relating to official luncheons, dinners and tours/inspections that are relevant to the interests of the Shire.

## 2) Accommodation

The Shire will pay reasonable accommodation costs and breakfast, lunch and dinner costs only for Councillors, including the night before and/or after the conference where this is necessary because of because of travel and/or conference.

## **Background:**

Policy 03.21 'Christmas/New Year Closure of Shire Offices' states that the Shire Offices close for the period between Christmas and New Year. # **Background:**

Council owns the property on which Meeka FM and the SES are co-located. There is no formal agreement with either party as to costs or responsibilities. The power to both sites is delivered initially to the SES building, with a submeter that records usage by MeekaFM.

A number of years ago (in excess of 15) Intelligent IP Communications built the tower on the block to provide internet services to Doray mine site and camp. There was no formal agreement in place for this organisation to build the tower, or over ownership, although they have continued to pay for the power consumed by the Meeka FM building in exchange for locating hardware inside.

This company passed hands a number of times in the proceeding years, most recently purchased by Superloop. When Doray ceased mining, services ceased to be provided by Superloop, though they continued to pay the power to the building. Superloop have relinquished ownership of the tower to the Shire.

Node One recently removed Superloop hardware on the tower and replaced it with their own to provide a commercial service of wireless internet services to Meekatharra. This action uncovered the location of similar hardware owned by Ciphertel on the tower, who provide a commercial service to other mining companies in and around Meekatharra. It is understood Ciphertel purchased an air conditioner for the Meeka FM building some years past to maintain an appropriate temperature for the technology contained within. This air conditioner is the cause of most of the energy consumption, but many organisations benefit from its operation.

Further investigations have uncovered TAB Radio access the facility, as does Vision Christian Radio, both with no financial contribution to power consumption. It would appear that a number of community services gain benefit from the building and the infrastructure free of charge.

In 2006, Tom Hartman the then Chief Executive Officer wrote to the committee promising Council would pay for at least some of the power consumed. This letter is attached, but due to the passage of time the full correspondence is not available in Shire records. The letter indicates the Shire was responsible for installation of the submeter at the building.

# **Comment:**

Costs to Meeka FM in the last twelve months from submeter readings has totaled \$3170.89 including GST.

Since 2014 Council has donated \$3000 to Meeka FM annually.

In the past this utility cost has been met by Superloop, with MeekaFM still requiring donations from the Shire to meet operational costs. With the cost of electricity exceeding the donation amount – albeit marginally, it is recommended that Council instead (or additionally) pay the cost of electricity, which benefit is derived by many broadcasting agencies to the Meekatharra community.

It is also recommended a MOU be entered with each of the main parties to the energy consumption, being Meeka FM, Ciphertel and Node 1, regarding access to the building and the tower.

# HOST SITE AGREEMENT

Meeka FM Community Radio Station (referred to as "the Host")

Five years, commencing upon the date of signing, renewable for further periods unless cancelled earlier by either party according to the provision in this agreement	

#### PREAMBLE

This agreement facilitates the functional aspects of what is effectively a community focussed partnership between the Host and Vision, the aim of which is to provide interested locals with access to Vision's not-for-profit Christian radio service.

#### IT IS AGREED

- The Host warrants that it has full right and interest in the site in terms of a binding agreement, or by virtue of ownership, and that is entitled to enter into this agreement.
- The Host agrees that Vision may erect, construct and maintain transmission equipment at the site for the purpose of receiving and/or transmitting broadcast signals. Such equipment may be located on or inside the building(s) on the site, and may includebut not be limited to;
  - a. An antenna and fixtures and fittings;
  - b. A 90 cm satellite dish and fixtures and fittings;
  - c. A shelf suitable for housing the broadcast equipment inside the building;
  - d. A satellite decoder Box;
  - e. An FM Transmitter Box
  - f. Any other such equipment as may be reasonably required sufficient to ensure a broadcast area as permitted in terms of the broadcast license granted to Vision by the relevant authority.
- The Host agrees to provide Visionwith reasonable access to the site for the purposes of maintaining an efficient and continuous operation of the equipment, including but not limited to installation, maintenance, upgrading, repairs and monitoring.

Request for access to the site will be made by prior arrangement with the Host with reasonable advance notice. Generally, work shall be carried out during business hours, emergencies excepted.

- Persons given authority for access to the site shall close all doors, gates and other means of restricting access to the site and shall refrain from interfering with the activities of the Host at the Site.
- Vision agrees that the Host is not responsible for any loss of or damage to Vision's equipment located at the site or any associated liabilities.

- The Host agrees to permit Vision to take a power feed from their existing power supply at the Site for the operation of Vision's equipment.
- 7. Vision agrees that all work at the site will be undertaken to appropriate workplace health and safety standards and all personnel involved in the installation and maintenance of the equipment will have the appropriate training and certificates for the work involved. Vision accepts liability for all work undertaken on its equipment at the site and liability for any incidents as a result of any incorrectly installed equipment. Further, Vision will indemnify the Host for any damage that may be caused to the Host's property because of the installed equipment, as well as damage to others property and bodily injury to the Host and all other persons.
- 8. The Host agrees to provide the site to Vision at no cost
- 9. The Host agrees to cover the cost of electricity for the site to Vision
- 10. Either party may cancel thisagreement during the initial term or further agreement periods upon three months' notice. At the termination of the Agreement, Vision shall remove all constructions, erections and installations it has made at the site and shall restore the Site as far as possible to its original state as at the commencement of the agreement.
- The parties agree that a faxed or scanned copy signed by both parties shall be valid and binding.

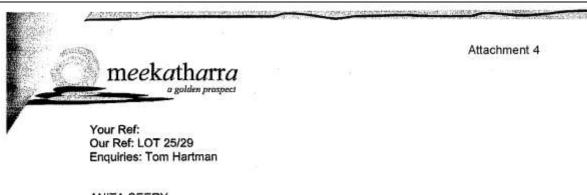

## **Background:**

Council made budget allowance in the 2021/22 Budget of \$10,000 for Art throughout the community.

Recent advertisements for local involvement have received no responses at all, despite many very accomplished artists living in Meekatharra.

Quotes have been received from two artists.

Helen Ansell who is a recognised artist based in Mullewa. Helen completed her primary school in Meekatharra and is very excited to be given an opportunity to quote this project. Her work is principally wildflowers, and it is expected to have appeal to the majority of the community. She has participated in the Kalgoorlie Heartwalk mural projects, and has been featured in many publications with a range of fabrics, souvenirs and many other murals to her portfolio. A sample of her work has been attached to this item. Quoted price of \$8,500 (inclusive of GST) includes Council accommodating Helen in the consultants quarters, 5 days painting plus a community workshop to further develop interest of local people.

It is suggested that Helen paint over the current mural depicting the Youth Centre bus at the centre of town next to the pool, and a base undercoat of white paint would be an additional cost to Council prior to Helen starting work. A budget of \$5,000 has been allowed for an external paint refresh of the Pool and it is believed this could be completed within that budget.

The second quote is from a graffiti artist selected by the Youth Centre participants. His work is generally classified as Pop Art, and again likely to appeal to most of the community. Andrew has quoted the vertical and horizontal surfaces at the Skatepark, and has agreed that his work could be "modular" in that Council may elect which if not all surfaces are painted. Samples of his previous work have also been attached to this item. Quoted price of \$12,180

(inclusive of GST) includes Council accommodating Andrew and his brother in the consultants quarters, and community involvement.

## **Comment:**

While the two quotes are more than the proposed budget, it is the strong recommendation of staff that such a quality and comprehensive beginning to the Murals in town will precipitate stronger interest and participation by local artists in future work of the project. It should be noted that there remains \$15,000 in the revitalisation budget for statues in the main street. There has been much difficulty in reaching consensus on appropriate statues, or even attracting interest of suitable artisans to complete the work. It could be deemed appropriate to access these funds for an enhanced mural project of some quality instead to round out the revitalisation of the Main Street.

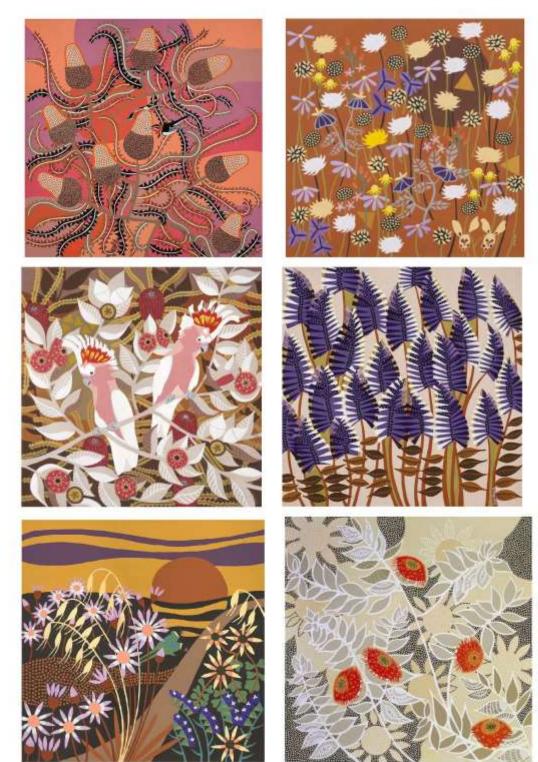

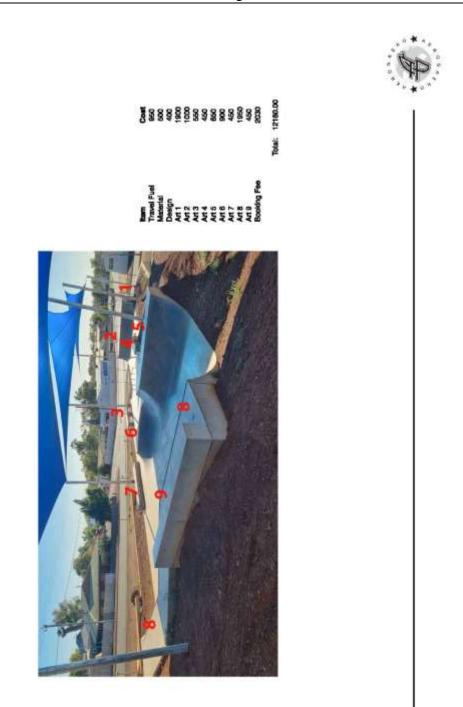
