9.1.3 AIRPORT MANAGER'S REPORT- JANUARY 2023

Aircraft Movements and Statistics

Aircraft movements for General Aviation, Charter & RPT increased slightly compared to January 2022. The volume of aircraft movements decreased compared to other months but was on par with this time of year over previous years. Total fuel sales for January 2023 were also on par with January 2022 with minor increases for JetA1 and decreases for Avgas noted.

 - (c) actual amounts of expenditure, revenue and income to the end of the month to which the statement relates; and
 - (d) material variances between the comparable amounts referred to in paragraphs (b) and (c); and
 - (e) the net current assets at the end of the month to which the statement relates.
- (2) Each statement of financial activity is to be accompanied by documents containing—
 - (a) an explanation of the composition of the net current assets of the month to which the statement relates, less committed assets and restricted assets; and
 - (b) an explanation of each of the material variances referred to in sub-regulation (1)(d); and
 - (c) such other supporting information as is considered relevant by the local government.
- (3) The information in a statement of financial activity may be shown
 - (a) according to nature and type classification; or
 - (b) by program; or
 - (c) by business unit.
- (4) A statement of financial activity, and the accompanying documents referred to in subregulation (2), are to be —
 - (a) presented at an ordinary meeting of the council within 2 months after the end of the month to which the statement relates; and
 - (b) recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which it is presented.
- (5) Each financial year, a local government is to adopt a percentage or value, calculated in accordance with the AAS, to be used in statements of financial activity for reporting material variances.

The Shire consider implementing as part of the preparation of financial statements a formal robust process to determine whether indicators exist annually, that would trigger a requirement to perform a formal revaluation of these assets. This process is to ensure that the Shire's infrastructure, land and building assets are recorded at fair value in compliance with AASB 13 Fair Value Measurement and the Regulations.

This may entail obtaining relevant input from an independent valuer as to whether or not they consider there are any prevailing market factors which may indicate that the fair value of relevant assets are likely to have been impacted to any significant / material extent from the prior year. Where a fair value assessment has been performed internally the Shire may consider having this assessment peer reviewed by an independent valuer to obtain assurance over the valuation methodology applied, inputs and the reasonableness of the valuation model applied.

2. Inadequate controls over inventory

Finding

We noted that the Shire did not have adequate processes in place to record the outgoing movements of its inventory during the year. As such, the inventory balance of \$108,550 in the annual financial report is based on management's estimation from the physical inventory count performed at 30 June 2022.

Rating: Moderate Implication

In the absence of adequate processes for recording issuance of inventory, there is an increased risk of inappropriate use or misappropriation of inventories. In addition, there is a risk that inventory may not be properly measured and recognised in accordance with AASB 102 *Inventories*, and that the inventory balance reported in the annual financial report may be misstated.

Recommendation

We recommend that management implements processes to record the issuance of inventories. In addition, management should reconcile the year end stocktake listing to the general ledger to ensure that the inventory balance in the annual financial report is measured and recognised in accordance with AASB 102 *Inventories*.

3. Incorrect recording of GST in expenditure

Finding

We noted that 4 out of 31 samples tested for expenses was incorrectly recorded due to the inclusion of Goods and Services Tax ("GST"). The error identified an overstatement of approximately 10.8% (i.e. \$10,918 error out of \$101,359 of GST related portion). The extrapolated error in expenses was expected to be approximately \$147,400, which we have included as part of the unrecorded adjustments.

Rating: Moderate Implication

There is a risk that trade and other payables and expenses may be misstated.

Recommendation

We recommend that management considers implementing a more robust review process to ensure that GST is recorded separately from expenditure.

Management comment

Agree with recommendation and will implement in accordance with ATO guidelines. Shire has implemented a review of GST classification on Creditors batches prior to batch posting.

4. Unclaimed monies

Finding

We noted that the payable balance (net off general ledger account 6300, 9470, 9610, 9611) holds excess monies owed to ratepayers following the forfeiture and sale of their properties due to the cumulative non-payment of rates. The outstanding balance at 30 June 2022 was \$4,281.

Management represented that they have attempted but were unable to locate the relevant ratepayers. Any amounts which have been held for more than 6 years should have been transferred to the Department of Treasury under the Unclaimed Money Act 1990.

Rating: Moderate

Implication

There is a risk that trade and other payables may be misstated and the Shire may be in breach of the Unclaimed Money Act 1990.

Recommendation

We recommend that management transfer any unclaimed monies held by the Shire for 6 years or more to the Department of Treasury, where they have been unable to contact the relevant ratepayers.

Background:

Council will be aware of the recent devasting floods that have occurred in the Kimberley Region, especially in the Derby and Fitzroy Crossing areas. Ex-tropical cyclone Ellie caused intense rainfall in WA's Kimberley Region that left many towns and communities cut off and isolated in the State's worst ever floods. The Martuwarra Fitzroy River and its catchment area was the worst affected, with damage to the road infrastructure in Fitzroy Crossing and parts of the Great Northern Highway linking Derby to Fitzroy Crossing and Broome.

The Shire of Derby West Kimberley covers an area of approximately 104k kms² and is responsible for the towns of Derby, Fitzroy Crossing and surrounding established communities such as Noonkanbah, Looma, Mowanjum, Yungngora as well as numerous pastoral stations. The majority of these towns, communities and stations have been totally isolated by the floods and remain so with the Great Northern Highway between Derby and Broome still closed to all traffic.

Comment:

There has been extensive media reports and vision of the devastation that the recent floods have caused in the Kimberley and Shire of Derby West Kimberley district. Long after the flood waters have receded, the damage will be enormous and the recovery period to rebuild and restore basic infrastructure services to all the communities affected will be lengthy.

Disaster relief has, and will continually be provided by emergency package(s) from various government agencies (federal and state), and where various 'Flood Appeal Disaster Funds' have also been organized to raise much needed financial relief. However, the Shire of

Meekatharra also believes that financial assistance can and should be provided to our local government colleagues in times of emergencies for distribution directly to the community. As a regional local government, we fully understand how important community organizations (many are volunteers and not for profit) are to the social fabric and well being of our communities. In this regard, Councils preference is to make a financial donation directly to the Shire of Derby West Kimberley so they can best decide how to distribute this donation. For example, by purchasing valuable equipment for their volunteer agencies, convening a BBQ for all volunteer organizations in the community etc.

This report therefore recommends Council endorse the donation made to the Shire of Derby West Kimberley by the Shire President to assist the recovery process for the community of the Shire of Derby West Kimberley.

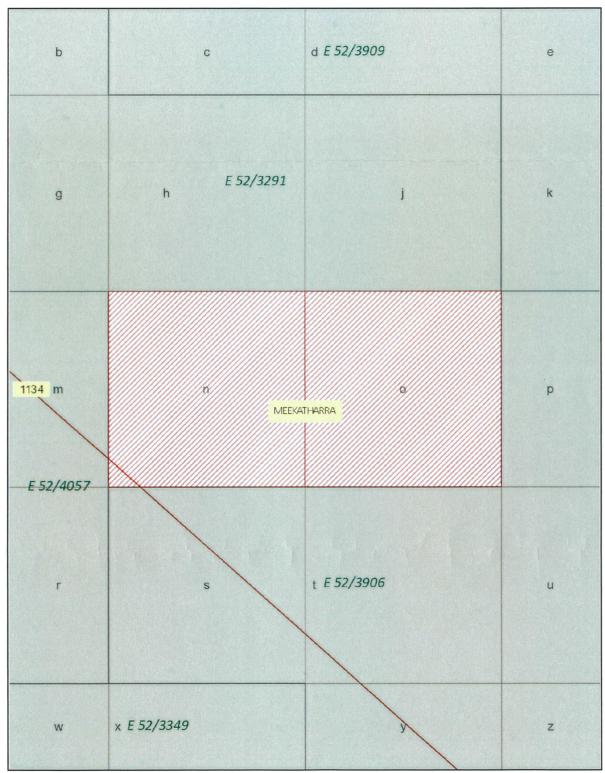

Background:

The building on this lot, also known as the "Convent of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary" is listed on Council's municipal heritage register. The heritage listing provides the following background information:

"In 1909, the Lennonville Catholic Church was acquired and rebuilt by Harry Pidgeon on the corner of High & Regan streets, Meekatharra. It was opened 9 May 1909 by Bishop Kelly as the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer. In 1911, the adjoining Lot 184 was purchased and the Convent of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary was built for the Dominican Sisters. The foundation at Meekatharra was founded on 16 May 1911 with three Sisters from the Mother House at Dongara. Classes of the Dominican Convent School began in the Church on 22 May with 40 pupils. A presbytery was built in 1912. The school soon grew to 100 pupils and in 1916 a School building, 60ft x 25 ft with verandahs on 3 sides, was constructed between the Church and the Convent. By 1970, the number of pupils had fallen to 30 and the School closed on 16 December that year and the Sisters withdrew from the town. 1400 children attended the School at Meekatharra over the 60 years of its operation and it was the last of the Murchison convent schools to close.

Holy Rosary Convent & Catholic Church are significant for the associations with the Catholic community and the sense of place for events that have taken place. The convent's significance also lies in the education role and associations during its 60 years.

Constructed from 1967 to 1975"

In December 2009 Council received correspondence from the Outback Catholic Parishes, stating they don't have the resources for the upkeep of the building and asked whether Council would be interested in refurbishing and utilizing, or would consider demolishing the building. The Health, Building and Town Planning Committee and Council deliberated on the issue and resolved:

"Committee Recommendation/Council Resolution:

Moved: Cr RK Howden Seconded: Cr HJ Nichols

That Council does not get involved with the Demolition or Refurbishment of the Convent Building.

CARRIED 7/0"

In July 2012 the property was sold to a private person who then on-sold the property to the current owner in September 2021.

The adjoining lots 183 and 182 (also part of the same heritage listing) still belong to the Roman Catholic Church.

Comment:

The site has a 'Category C' listing under the Shire's Municipal Heritage Listing. Category C means: Some heritage significance at a local level; places to be ideally retained and conserved; endeavour to conserve the significance of the place through recognised design guidelines; an Heritage Assessment / Impact Statement may be required as corollary to a development application, particularly in considering demolition of the place. Further development is required to be within recognised design guidelines. Incentives should be considered where the condition or relative significance is served through retention and conservation.

Clause 5.14 of the Shire of Meekatharra Town Planning Scheme No 3 (TPS3) states that the places listed in Schedule V of the Scheme are "considered to be of historic, architectural, scientific, scenic or other value and should be retained in their present state or restored to their original state or to a state acceptable to the Council". However, the convent is not listed in Schedule V and therefore this section of the scheme does not necessarily apply.

Given the Category C status, and lack of a listing in both Schedule V of TPS3 and at a State Level, a condition of approval of the demolition could be to document the site through photography and a summary acceptable to the Council prior to issuing of a building permit for the demolition.

Considering that the Catholic Church in 2009 suggested Council demolish the building and then consequently sold this property it is assumed they do not have any interest in preserving the heritage.

The building has been vacant ever since and has been extensively vandalized.

The lot is zoned "Civic/Cultural". The applicant is planning to demolish the house and sell the block as vacant land.

The Convent and adjoining Church are part of the Meekatharra Heritage Trail.

The applicant has lodged both an application for a demolition permit as well as an application for planning approval. No supporting documentation has been submitted at this stage.

In an email received 09/02/2023 the applicant advised that he had already commenced the demolition as he thought payment for the application meant the demolition had been approved. He was asked to cease any further demolition works and await Council consideration and formal approval.
