IMPORTANT NOTICE—DOGS!

There have been a number of issues around stray and wandering dogs again in Meekatharra during the month of August. Unfortunately, this has led to more very difficult conversations being held, and emotional decisions made to surrender family protectors.

Many of these problems could have been avoided if owners kept their dogs contained as required by our law, and if written notifications of breaches or concerns had been provided to the Shire earlier.

It is a fact of life unfortunately that some people will always disregard the law. Some people simply don't have the resources to keep their dogs contained. <u>These excuses, however won't be accepted.</u>

The Dog Act (1976) states -

- 31. Control of dogs in certain public places
 - (1) A dog shall not be in a public place unless it is
 - (a) held by a person who is capable of controlling the dog; or
 - (b) securely tethered for a temporary purpose,by means of a chain, cord, leash or harness of sufficient strength and not exceeding the prescribed length.

This means that your dog **MUST ALWAYS** be on a lead when outside your yard. To not comply leaves you open to a fine of \$200 **each time** your dog is found unleashed outside your yard. Strictly speaking, this includes places like Peace Gorge, and other regularly used dog exercise areas around Meekatharra.

When dogs do stray, it is vitally important that people in the community voice their concerns, in the right way. Your confidentiality is assured if you come to the Shire office to fill out the complaint form. This form is essential and critical to our ability to take further action. We can't act on an email or phone call complaining about a wandering dog, or on a Facebook post. We need the written complaint before we can act. This is a legal process after all.

All written complaints are taken seriously and investigated

The current fine for not keeping your dog contained is \$50, although the advertised proposed Dog Local Laws prescribe a fine of \$200. This can add up very quickly when the dog is a serial stray.

The Shire of Meekatharra generously provide subsidies to desex dogs to health care card holders. This is another key piece in the approach to ensure no dogs are destroyed. A single female on heat will attract a number of aggressive male dogs and it is very likely at this point they will form a pack. This is a situation we want to avoid at all costs, and can be avoided by having your dogs desexed. For Free.

Come to the Shire to get your voucher at any time.

By being considerate of our neighbours and stopping dogs from barking at night, by making sure dogs are contained in a yard, and by registering and neutering your pets, we can all enjoy the comfort of a companion, and

1 MAN AND A BIKE

Meeka was very privileged to have an excellent film crew in town to film as part of the Murchison GeoRegion initiative. 1 Man and a Bike films in locations all over Western Australia and

promotes small towns everywhere. Blackers, the host, interviews people who are a key part of the community and explains the culture and atmosphere in the towns he visits.

Blackers and the team travelled across the Midwest to film the show. They started in Yalgoo, headed to Murchison, then came to Meeka and their last stop being Mount Magnet. The host rides his motorbike to each town and is able to find some incredible places that highlight the town. Once this show goes to air, everyone who sees it will see what all local people see in Meekatharra and just how special it is.

Blackers and his film crew were in Meeka for just over 24 hours but managed to fit a lot of exploring in. They filmed Andos Art Prints, Energise Café, Peace Gorge and the Museum. Key places in the Meekatharra community including unique, self-made businesses.

Filming started at Andos Art Prints, filming Andrew's story and the gallery he has set up. The show filmed Andrew creating his art and explaining his passion. It is such a privilege to have an art gallery in town and showing it off is very important for the community.

Energiser Café was also featured, showing the busy food van on Main Street serving up a storm. The food van is widely known as an icon and is one of the first things you see when driving down Main Street. David and Keenan have been part of the Meeka community for years and they truly understand the town.

The show wanted to focus on the history of the town so chose to film in the Shire's Museum. We had local 'historian', Rigby Trenfield, speak about the old hearse and its use before it retired to the museum. Rigby got set up with a microphone and did a few takes of his segment. It was amazing to see local people talk about the history, even if it was one area. There is a lot to learn about the history of this town.



Cold is finally over!

We are loving warm and beautiful weather here in Meekatharra! We have identified some common health issues that have been happening quite a lot in Meekatharra these days.

RINGWORM

Ringworm is a common fungal infection of the skin. It is usually a scaly and itchy circular rash. It is a common condition that can be treated by over the counter anti-fungal medication from your pharmacy.

The best ways to avoid ringworm is to identify if others around you or pets have the symptoms and treating those infected. Also keep your skin clean!

DRY EYES

Dry air in Meekatharra can easily lead to dry eye symptoms. The eyes will feel uncomfortable, become red and inflamed.

It can be managed by using lubricating eye drops that you can get from the pharmacy!

COLDSORES

Cold sores are a common viral infection and they usually occur on and around the lips. Dry lips and stress are common factors that trigger cold sores. Also the sun can be a trigger factor as well!

BOTTLE TOP CRAFT



At our August Upcycling Workshop we experimented with plastic bottle tops since we've accumulated boxes and boxes of them. (Is it sad to admit that it was actually quite therapeutic sorting them all into different colours?)

First we brought the "Recycle" sign back to its former glory. Elaine had craftily made and gifted this to us when the Recycling Centre was first established but some of the lids had fallen off (probably due to heat and us being a rough bunch). Nothing that hot glue and reinforcing nails can't fix though! Did we burn our fingers on the hot glue and nails? Yes.

The internet is full of great ideas about repurposing and upcycling bottle tops. Whether it's waste paper baskets, fly curtains, mirror and picture frame decorating or making coaster – it's all possible and these are quite easy to do.

We really wanted to try our hands at making coasters so we cranked up the sandwich press, covered it in baking paper and started playing around with colour combinations.

It's really easy and great to do with kids (just make sure an adult operates the hot sandwich press)! Good idea for a fathers day or Christmas present perhaps?

- 1. Pre-heat a sandwich press (it would also work with a hot iron)
- 2. use baking paper on both top and bottom
- make sure bottle tops are clean and remove any white foamy inserts
- 4. arrange the bottle tops in different patterns and colours (the Aboriginal flag one looks great! You could also make your favourite footy club's colours or just floral patterns)
- close the sandwich press (make sure baking paper covers the bottle tops completely considering they'll spread out a bit)

- 6. wait a few minutes until completely melted
- 7. pull the baking paper and plastic off the sandwich press and put on a heat resistant surface (caution: the plastic is hot and retains heat for a quite some time!). Leave it wedged in between the baking paper for now until cool.
- 8. put a heavy heat resistant item on top so it flattens it whilst it cools down (e.g. heavy book or a baking tray with a brick on top)
- 9. repeat with another batch whilst the first one is cooling down





Look for flexibility when booking travel

Just when many Western Australians may have thought it was safe to book domestic travel, a series of COVID-19 outbreaks have led to interstate lockdowns and tighter border controls.

If your travel plans have been grounded by the latest round of restrictions, then hopefully a refund or credit note was sorted quickly. If not, you're far from alone. Since COVID-19 started impacting Western Australia in March 2020, Consumer Protection has received nearly 1,200 complaints and 1,340 enquiries from people with travel-related issues.

When the cancellation of travel services occurs due to government restrictions, consumers may not be automatically entitled to the same remedy options, such as a refund, as they would be in normal circumstances under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

Before booking travel, it's important to carefully consider what the terms and conditions (T&Cs) say about cancellations or postponement, and think about what your options might be if border restrictions remain or are reimposed before or during the dates of travel. For this reason, cheaper options for travel bookings may not be the best choice under current circumstances as they may be quite restrictive on what, if any, remedies are offered if there is a need to change your plans. In the current circumstances, our advice is to look for the most flexible booking arrangements with the best refund options.

If you have booked travel to a jurisdiction where there is a sudden lockdown, don't immediately cancel your travel arrangements. Firstly speak to your travel or accommodation provider to see what they are planning to do. Cancelling in advance of a decision by your travel provider might be treated as a 'change of mind' by you and your cancellation options may be significantly reduced.

Booking future travel can be risky due to the ongoing and evolving nature of the pandemic. A safer option currently is intra-state travel, however we would advise booking within WA close to the date of travel, and continue to be wary of 'pay now/book later' deals that may impact your ability to get a refund.

veys at the recent Youth Expo – congratulations to our \$50 voucher winners: Kyliesha, Wesley and Beverley!

The Project Manager will deliver EON's Thriving Communities Program including planning, planting and maintaining edible gardens and the delivery of practical gardening, cooking and nutrition lessons, with a particular focus on the school children. The aim of the Program is to help the school and community build a sustainable source of fresh healthy food and equip them with the skills to maintain the gardens and good nutrition.

Most of that time has been spent as a Detective where I have investigated offences ranging from Homicide, Child Abuse and Armed Robbery. As part of those investigations I have travelled the state of Western Australia and in particular the Kimberley from Broome to Kununurra and in between. I've met many great people and understand the importance of strong communities. I'm really looking forward to the challenge that presents itself in Meekatharra. My efforts and that of my team will be focused towards reducing crime and anti-social behaviour in the community.

I've already met some great people in town which has given me an appreciation of what drives Meekatharra. Of note, the many local residents that were born here and continue to contribute to Meekatharra in some capacity. There is a strong community presence as can be seen by the many business owners that have contributed for 10 – 30 years and longer in some cases.

I look forward to working with key groups in the community such as local business owners, Shire, Hospital, School, Housing/Child Protection, Justice, St John, Volunteer Fire and Rescue, Family Support, Mines and many other industry leaders. This is important as we all play our role. I'm encouraged by the fact there's group forums in place already and I look forward to Meekatharra Police playing

I'd like to update you all on missing prospector Trevor McDonald. This is a very sad and tragic incident. Police conducted an extensive land and air search for Mr McDonald without success. Meekatharra Police and Mr McDonald's family would like to thank the many individuals and business owners who dropped what hey were doing and assisted. The file remains a missing person investigation. Anyone with information are encouraged to attend the station or call crime stoppers 1800 333 000.

What I have observed since arriving in town is the opportunistic offending. By this I mean people leaving trucks, cars, sheds and houses unlocked for a would be criminal to take advantage and steal property. Please, take the time to lock-up and secure your belongings to prevent these types of crimes. Anti-social behaviour continues to be of concern to Meekatharra Police and I'll be working closely with members of the community and groups to help curb such behaviour.

In relation to my staff at Meekatharra Police Station, I can't speak highly enough of the work they do and their commitment to the Meekatharra community. You will see a few staff changes over the next 6 weeks and I'll be encouraging new members to get out into the community and introduce themselves.

What are some ways the Meekatharra Community can assist police:

GARDENS WITH SAL, THE GARDEN GAL

A very warm and sunny hello to everybody out in Meeka,

Spring has truly sprung and what a time to be out in the Midwest! The wildflowers this season are so very beautiful and the bush is singing in celebration. Have you been out bush checking things out? I wonder what you all have found?

Spring is every gardener's favourite time of year! You can feel the warmth back in the sun and that is true also for the soil. Right now is the perfect window to be getting busy in your veggie patch and garden, preparing and tending for successful harvests for months to come.

There are no rules on how to create your veggie patch but good things to keep in mind are: accessibility to water, well-worked soft fluffy soil (in a raised bed, old bath, split rainwater tank or possibly into a well prepared patch of earth), nutrient rich additions (manure, compost, dynamic lifter, blood and bone) and potentially a bit of shade for when the weather warms in coming months, remember veggies need six hours of direct sunlight a day to be productive.

If you have good quality seeds already then well done! But if not, there are many online seed suppliers that can send them out within weeks. One of my favourite suppliers is Eden Seeds as they are organic, non-GMO, highly viable seeds and the end produce is always delicious. But there are many suppliers to choose from and if you head to Geraldton, Bunnings Warehouse is always well stocked!

Seeds to plant direct into garden beds include: zucchini, squash, beetroot, carrot, radish, turnip, corn, cucumber, peas, beans, pumpkin, watermelon, and rockmelon (remember these ones will grow far and wide so be sure to have space for them), sweet potatoes, asparagus, spring onions Asian greens and silver beet.

Seeds to raise in seed raising mix prior to planting out include: leek, capsicum, tomatoes, chillies, eggplant and passionfruit.

There are plenty of herbs to get planting into your garden too, such as basil, parsley, chives, sage, oregano, rosemary and mint.


I'm planning to grow some Ceylon running spinach- also known as Malabar spinach- this summer too. This climbing plant comes from India and is renowned for loving the high temperatures and direct sunlight, perfect for our climate here in Meeka. Ceylon spinach isn't a true spinach per se but the leaves are high in vitamins and can used in the place of store-bought spinach in your favourite meals. However I think this plant has the potential to get a bit out of hand if given the opportunity, so be sure to know where you might like it to thrive, perhaps growing over a trellis or over something to provide shade?!

The bush is certainly colourful at the moment and now is the time to make your home garden colourful too! There are countless flower varieties you can plant right now. Sunflowers, nasturtiums, zinnias, pansies, daisies, cornflower, lavender, dahlias, strawflowers, cosmos, foxglove, dianthus, echinacea, the list goes on. I know that we don't have many (if any!) honeybees out here, but I have seen some native bees take interest in some flowers in the home garden.

Speaking of flowers, for those of you that have fruit trees growing at your home you may have noticed there are flower buds forming- if not already blossoming. How lucky you are if so as they smell amazing! You can help your fruit trees produce more flowers by adding potash to the surrounding soil. Potash helps plants to create more flowers but also improves the flower colour and quality of flowers and also the fruit! Potash also moves water and sugars around the cell membrane which can make fruit juicier and sweeter. You can

make your own potash feed fertiliser at home from banana peels, just chop some up into small pieces and leave in water for around a week. Then you can pour this solution around the desired plants. A very quick and easy homemade natural feed- perfect!

Another plant I am trying out this year is taro. Taro is a root crop that is found mostly in tropical humid places around the world, however I have heard it grows well in NZ too so it can be versatile. It prefers a part-shaded space with plenty of room to spread its leaves and roots. Taro would be perfect for a south facing location that has access to plenty of water, as they get very thirsty. You can eat their leaves as well as their roots! Taro can be grown from their tuber which I have bought from the fruit and veggie shop in Geraldton. Simply plant as you would a potato in spaces of about 30cm apart. I'm very much looking forward to seeing how they go! I hear they grow well in Karalundi?

No matter what you plant this spring, remember to mulch your plants well to keep that precious water in the soil where it is needed most.

Well wonderful Meeka, sadly this will be my last edition to the Dust for now. I've gone from growing pumpkins to growing humans and am very excited to report to you all that I'm pregnant- and at the half-way mark!

I have spent the last three years working in your town and school and have enjoyed every moment of it so thank you for having me. I will be "handing over" to a new Project Manager to replace me at EON and take over our beautiful garden and thriving program at the school. Be sure to say hello to them when you see them.

It's been a pleasure and wish you all many happy gardening days ahead.

Thanks to everyone who helped put this awesome incursion on for our students!







FIRST AID FACT SHEET Electric Shock

An electric shock occurs when a person comes into contact with an electrical energy source. Electrical energy flows through a portion of the body causing a shock. Exposure to electrical energy may result in a lifethreatening situation as there may be damage to internal organs.

Caused by

 Electricity (either high voltage or prolonged current) passing through the body.

Signs & symptoms

- Burns, particularly entry and exit burns where the electricity entered and left the body which may be deep.
- + Unconsciousness.
- Not breathing normally.
- A weak, erratic pulse or no pulse at all.
- Cardiac arrest.

What to do

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John Action Plan.
- 2. Check for danger to yourself and bystanders.
- 3. Switch off the power if possible.
- 4. If safe to do so, remove the casualty from the electrical supply without directly touching them. Use non-conductive, dry materials, for example a dry wooden broom handle.
- Cool any burnt areas with copious amounts of cool water for up to twenty (20) minutes.
- **6.** Remove any clothing and jewellery from affected area unless stuck to the burn.
- Cover burnt area with a light non-stick dressing or clean, dry non-fluffy material.
- 8. Reassure the casualty.
- Always seek medical aid immediately for electrical burns. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.

DOWNED POWER LINES

- + When calling **Triple Zero (000)** advise that there are downed cables.
- + Remain at least 6 metres from any cable and do not approach until advised that it is safe to do so.
- + DO NOT attempt to remove the cable.
- If a vehicle is being touched by a high voltage cable, **DO NOT** go near the vehicle or try to remove the casualty from the vehicle.
- Advise the casualty not to move.







- 2/3 cup chopped fresh basil leaves
- 1 cup grated pizza cheese
- · Extra basil leaves, to serve

directions

- Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan-forced.
- Melt butter in small saucepan over medium heat. Add flour. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until bubbling. Remove from heat. Gradually stir in milk until combined. Return to heat. Cook, stirring constantly, 3 minutes or until sauce boils and thickens. Remove from heat. Season with salt and pepper.
- Bring a medium saucepan of salted water to the boil.
 Add asparagus, zucchini and onion. Boil for 2 minutes. Remove with slotted spoon. Drain on paper towel. Add spinach to pan. Cook for 1 minute or until wilted. Remove with slotted spoon. Squeeze out excess moisture when cool enough to handle. Roughly chop.
- Cover the base of a 20cm x 28cm (8 cup-capacity) ovenproof dish with 2/3 cup white sauce. Layer 1/4 lasagna sheets trimming to fit. Layer asparagus mixture, peas and 1/3 ricotta. Top with 1/3 of remaining lasagna sheets, 1/2 spinach, and 1/2 remaining ricotta. Repeat. Top with remaining lasagna sheets and remaining white sauce. Arrange tomato and basil leaves on top. Sprinkle with cheese.
- Bake for 45 minutes or until golden and pasta is tender. Serve with extra basil leaves.




