

"The Meekatharra Dust" is a non-profit community newspaper. The Meekatharra Dust is published during the first week of each month. The deadline is the 24th of the previous month.





CEO COUNCIL MESSAGE

Welcome to the July2022 edition of *The Dust CEO Council Message Report* that provides information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 25th of June 2022 as well as the Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meeting that was held on the same day. This section of The Dust is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Councils Ordinary Meetings that are held each month.

The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only an extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Health, Building & Planning Meeting 25 June 2022

<u>Item 7.2 – Horizon Power Excision of Reserve</u> <u>15815 for Power Generation</u>

That the Committee in principle support the 24.9 hectares land to the north east of the existing power site to be excised from reserve 15815 for the purposes of power generation on the condition that:

- a. it goes as far as the sewerage pipeline or
- b. the pipeline be realigned at the applicant's expense; or
- c. an easement for the pipeline is created.

The above resolution supports the request from Horizon Power for Council to approve the excision of Reserve 15815 from Council for

transfer to Horizon Power so it can plan future power generation by solar panels for the community of Meekatharra.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Ordinary Meeting 25 June 2022

<u>Item 9.3.7 – WA Primary Health Alliance Funding</u>

That Council endorses the Short Form Agreement and accepts the \$100,000 from the Western Australian Primary Health Alliance for the Midwest Suicide Prevention Trial and authorises the CEO to sign the agreement.

The above resolution confirms Councils endorsement to accept \$100k funding from the WA Primary Health Alliance (WAPHA) for the Midwest Suicide Prevention Trial to fund community projects and events that support non-clinical suicide prevention activities. The funding is provided for use from 1 July 2022 to 31 December 2022 and Councils Community Development Team will be responsible for the liaison and arrangements regarding the necessary application process for community organizations.

<u>Item 9.3.8 – Donation Request – Isolated</u> <u>Children's Parent Association</u>

That Council endorse a donation to the Isolated Children's Parents Association Federal Conference in August 2022 to the value of \$ 2,000.

The above resolution confirms Councils approval to support the Isolated Children's Parent Association (ICPA) by donating the amount of \$2,000 towards the attendance by the ICPA to the 2022 Federal Conference.

♦ Staff traineeship – Council is pleased to welcome Ms Tommie-Rae Cameron as administrative trainee to the Shire of Meekatharra. Tommie-Rae transferred her traineeship from the Public Sector


Commission in Perth when she relocated back to Meekatharra to be with her family. Council has also employed additional staff in the Parks & Gardens, Civil Works and Finance areas of Councils operations.

- Town Picture Gardens Staff met on site with local tradesmen to discuss alternative design ideas that are modest and functional and councillors also undertook a site inspection following the Council meeting to further discuss these options. The community will be updated on progress.
- Town Entry Statements Councils Community Development & Services Manager (CDSM) presented the results of the fdesign survey to the Health, Building and Town Planning (HBTP) Committee meeting for discussion. The survey

feedback in summary indicates the community want the Entry Statements to be big and bold and relevant to Meekatharra. Four people also expressed their interest in being part of a focus group further working on the design and placement of the signs.





COPS CORNER WITH ACTING SENIOR SERGEANT REX TUNKS



I am currently acting in Senior Sergeant Garnaut's position as Officer in Charge (OIC) of Meekatharra Police Station, until the 1st July when Sergeant Gary WILLIAMS will take the helm until Matt's return to the chair on the 11th July.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome two new police officers to Meekatharra. Senior Constable Parker and Constable Barker, have commenced their tenure in Meekatharra and are looking forward to serving members of the local community. These officers bring experience and knowledge to the town which will only enhance the service we provide. Please feel free to stop and have a chat with them when you see them on duty.

You may have noticed a greater presence by Meekatharra Police on the road recently. Traditionally the cooler months brings many tourists north seeking the warmer weather. Many people have question why we are conducting Random Breath Testing (RBT) of a morning in Meekatharra. The answer to this is very easy with 2 high range reading of motorist detected during this period. A third motorist was detected a short distance from town with a blood alcohol reading almost 4 time the legal limit traveling at 127 km/per hour and also had a lifetime suspend drivers' licence.

Please remember, Anywhere Anytime

Alcohol related anti-social behaviour continues to be of concern to police and community in general. Also, of concern is the increase in police officer assault that have occurred in recent times, especially when we are called to these anti-social behaviour incidents by our community members.



This type of offending and behaviour will not be tolerated and is not acceptable in any community and will be dealt with swiftly. A number of people have been charged and will be appearing in court.

Stealing offences, have seen a slight increase over the last 2 weeks from either retail outlets or from unlocked vehicles. Our retailers, their suppliers and small busi-

nesses provide an essential service to the community and are valued by us. It saddens me to say that a number of the offenders are juveniles, but not in all case.

Meekatharra Police will continue investigate these offences with vigour and put the offenders before the court. If you have any information about these or any other offences you are able to call the police station direct on 9918 7120 or alternatively report through Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000. Any information will be dealt with in the strictest confidence. Please remember "Look Lock Leave"

Further we are seeing a rise in anti-social behaviour of juveniles while attending at our retailers in Meekatharra. Meekatharra Police will work with and support our retailers to stop this behaviour.

In the early hours of Wednesday morning the Automated Teller Machine (ATM) which is located outside IGA was attacked and suffered significant damage, which has rendered it inoperable. This type of offending not only causes a great cost to the owners but a huge inconvenience to the greater community of in Meekatharra who utilise this ATM.

Meekatharra Police immediately responded with the offender being identified, located and charged with Criminal Damage and will appear in Meekatharra Court.

Meekatharra Police continue to actively investigate reported crimes and engage with community members whilst out and about. I encourage the community as a whole to help us and in turn us help the community.



Don't let a stressed ceiling go over your head

A sudden ceiling collapse can turn a comfortable home into a disaster zone in an instant, with the potential for serious injury and significant damage to property and possessions.

Consumer Protection recently became aware of two tenants who had been given seven days to vacate their rental property following the collapse of their living room ceiling.

As we step in to help the parties reach an agreement, we want to remind tenants, landlords and property managers that seven-day termination notices are unlawful unless the home has been destroyed or deemed uninhabitable by a local government authority.

There are often warning signs a ceiling is about to give way, so it is important for tenants to alert their landlords and agents about any loud cracking sounds, sagging or dropping of the plasterboard sheeting and/or cornice, or any visual cracking. Small circles or blisters (nail pops) in a line on the ceiling can indicate the plasterboard sheeting is pulling away from the nails or screws. Landlords need to respond to such reports and ensure necessary repairs are undertaken to prevent a collapse.

If a ceiling does collapse, landlords are legally responsible for bringing the property back to a liveable condition and must initiate these urgent repairs within 48 hours.

Should the landlord or agent fail to respond to a written request for repairs within a reasonable timeframe, a tenant may serve a <u>breach notice</u>. If the issue continues to be ignored, an application can be made to the <u>Magistrates Court</u> for an order that the necessary repairs be undertaken.

While it is important to keep paying rent until the matter is resolved, a tenant is entitled to ask the court for a rent reduction if the issue means part of the property – such as a second bathroom – is unable to be used.

We always recommend tenants arrange their own contents insurance in case they need to replace damaged possessions. However, if the damage is caused by a fault in the building, such as a lack of maintenance, then a tenant may decide to seek compensation from the landlord through the courts.

If a tenant believes their landlord or agent has failed to initiate repairs in a reasonable timeframe, or has issued an unlawful termination notice, they should contact Consumer Protection on consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or 1300 30 40 54.

From Nicholah at Youth Focus

The NAIDOC theme for 2022 Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up! resonates with me as an ally for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. As a Black African woman working in Meekatharra, I embed cultural and intersectional practices in my work. This project was inspired by the NAIDOC theme for 2022, and a drive to amplify young local artist voices through art and creating an opportunity for recognition to help promote hope and resilience. Meekatharra might be a place of little water, however, it's a community rich in cultural heritage. Through this project, we had the opportunity for community members, elders and local artist Mr Andrew Binsiar to come in and share their stories and knowledge with the young people.

We saw services unite and collaborate to help make an impact on young people's lives. The highlight of this project was working alongside the Meekatharra District High School-Future Endeavours class, Jamal Diallo and Dean from 10FF Store. Jamal's story of hope and resilience, and the impact 10FF Store made on the community and young people was inspiring. What makes 10FF Store unique is through fashion and sneakers, they promote culture, community and hope by creating a platform for creative artists and partnerships with Indigenous communities and People of Colour.
