COUNCIL MESSAGE

Welcome to the November 2023 edition of The Dust CEO Council Message Report that provides information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 14th of October 2023 as well as the Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meeting held on the same morning. This edition also includes the results of the 2023 ordinary Shire of Meekatharra election that was held on the 21st of October 2023.

This section of The Dust is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Councils Ordinary Meetings that are held each month. The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only a summary extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

<u>Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Health, Building & Planning Meeting 14 October 2023</u>

Item 7.1.1 – Principal Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor's Report

In accordance with the shared services agreement between the Shire of Meekatharra and the Shire of East Pilbara, the report provided a summary of building, planning and environmental health matters for July/August 2023. This included all activities, the progress of ongoing situations and concerns related to the required services raised by the Shire of East Pilbara. Further detail is available in the minutes of the Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor's Report.

<u>Item 7.1.2 – Community Development & Services Manager's Report</u>

Entry Statements

The Entry Statement footings have been installed and the design monuments have been mounted. The local mining company has provided banded iron formation rocks to use for the cladding of the footings that is arranged for the end of October.

Lions Park

Earth works for the Lions Park have commenced in-house and security fencing for site has been arranged. Cracker dust for compacted paths has also been purchased. Purchase of shelters has been finalized and will be erected in due course.

Meekatharra Memorial Pool Works

Renovation works at the pool were completed on schedule in September 2023 and within budget. The pool officially opened for the 2023/24 season on Monday 2nd of October 2023.

Other item details from the Community Development & Services Manager's Report can be found in the Minutes of the Health, Building & Planning Meeting.

<u>Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Ordinary Meeting 14 October 2023</u>

Item 9.3.1 – Mining Tenement Applications

That Council approve the following Applications from:

- Department of Water and Environmental Regulation on behalf of Vango Mining Ltd situated at Marymia Gold Project on Mining Tenements M52/217 and M52/218.
- Mining Tenement Application for Miscellaneous Licence 52/250 on behalf of KoBold West Australia Pty Ltd situated at Peak Hill, and
- Mining Tenement Application for Exploration Licence 51/1703 from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation on behalf of Castle Minerals Ltd situated at Annean.

Council considers mining applications received for the district on a monthly basis.

<u>Item 9.3.2 Closure of Council Operations – Christmas/New Year Period 2023/24</u>

That Council authorise the CEO to close the Shire office, works depot and recreation/community services operations from Friday 22nd of December 2023 to Tuesday 2nd of January 2024 inclusive in accordance with Councils Policy 3.16.

The above resolution is consistent with previous Council decisions to close Shire operations for the Christmas/New Year period. A Public Notice to this effect will be advertised in late November/early December this year. An emergency skeleton crew will be available if required.

<u>Item 9.3.4 Shire of Meekatharra Cemeteries Management Plan 2022 – 2023 Stage Two and Three Progress Reports</u>

That Council receive the Stage Two and Three Progress Reports for the Shire of Meekatharra Cemeteries Management Plan 2022 – 2032.

The above resolution importantly acknowledges and confirms the important work that has continued on Councils cemeteries. The community are encouraged to contact Council for more details, especially where renovation work has been completed on the historic headstone of John George Barkas at the Nannine cemetery. The cemeteries heritage team will return in May 2024 to undertake further community workshops and headstone works at Peak Hill.

Further Information Snippets

Local Government Elections 2023 – as noted above, the Shire of Meekatharra local government elections were held on Saturday the 21st of October 2023. Early Voting, Absent Voting and Postal Voting opened on Monday 2nd of October 2023 with Early Voting closing at 4pm on Friday 20th of October 2023 and Postal and Absent Voting closing at 4pm on Tuesday 17th of October 2023. A total of 405 electors were on the Shire of Meekatharra Consolidated Roll with only a disappointing 87 voters, or 21.5% in total registering to vote. The 2023 election voting and counting system was changed by the WA Government as a result of reforms to the local government legislation, from 'First Past the Post' to 'Optional Preferential Voting'. There were eight candidates who nominated for five vacancies comprising of four vacancies of four year terms and one vacancy for a two year term. The successful candidates that were elected are as follows that have also been advertised as required:

1.Harvey Nichols – 4 year term
2.Barkley Day – 4 year term
3.Wesley Ward – 4 year term
4.Mark Smith – 4 year term, and
5.David Hodder – 2 year term

At a Special meeting of Council held on the 23rd of October 2023, the newly elected Councillors were all sworn in and the election of President and Deputy President was conducted resulting in Cr Harvey Nichols being elected as Shire President and Cr Mark Smith as Deputy President. The next ordinary election is scheduled for 18th of October 2025.

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council is scheduled for Saturday the 18th of November 2023 and the next CEO Council Message column will appear in the next edition of The Dust in early December. Until then bye for now!

MEEKATHARRA Walk for Suicide Awareness

The Meekatharra community united on Sunday 15th October for a cause that's close to our hearts.

Around 130 people came together for the second annual "Meeka Walk for Suicide Awareness", in an event that was once again coordinated by Youth Focus and the Shire of Meekatharra, under the guidance of Paulette Anderson and Svenja Clare. It was wonderful to have the support of a number of service agencies from Meekatharra and Geraldton, including the Meekatharra Shire, Youth Focus, Midwest Mental Health, Mission Australia, WAPOL, Meeka District High School, Standby, headspace Geraldton, and Yulella.

Last year, around 100 people joined the walk, taking 3,139 steps to remember each person who died by suicide in 2020.

"This year, we walked 3,144 steps around Meekatharra to remember each person who died by suicide in 2021. That's five more steps," Paulette said.


SPORTING COMPLEX AND OVAL



From Vision to Reality: Meekatharra's Streetscape Art Project Journey

BEFORE

Once upon a time, the Median Strip used to feature colourful Bougainvillea shrubs. Over time they were slowly but surely decimated by wide-load trucks and traffic, leaving only unsightly dirt and weeds. The Shire tried to bring back some colour with ground covers and flowers, but they, too, succumbed to traffic and the climate

So, the Shire embarked on a project to renew the Median Strips, complete with a new paver patterned hard wearing surface, new kerbing, a new crossover point and *drum roll* featuring community co-designed murals highlighting Meeka's heritage: Indigenous, Pastoral & Mining. The community was invited to contribute keywords to feature in the murals:



The new murals, designed by local artist Ando, are big and bold and beautiful and feature many of the keywords and colours suggested by the community. One challenge encountered are the rubber marks left by haul pack loads on wide load trucks. It's a visual reminder that our mining heritage is not history, instead it's very much alive and well.













We're Finalists in the Tidy **Towns Competition!**

We are thrilled to announce that the Streetscape Art Project has made Meekatharra a finalist in the Tidy Towns Competition, specifically in the General Appearance category.

The Streetscape Art Project, originally conceived as a means to upgrade the Median Strip, has evolved into something far more profound. Thanks to our partnership with RAC through its Reconnect WA initiative, we have created spaces and artwork to celebrate Meekatharra's heritage and culture and come together as a community.

The project included:


- Upgraded median strip and traffic islands including an additional crossover point
- Community co-designed median murals depicting Meekatharra's heritage
- Community created mural on the Youth Focus building celebrating 'Our Meeka'
- Interpretive signage of the murals
- · New bike racks in the Main Street

- · A new bench inviting people to gather
- The outdoor art gallery on the Lloyds building wall
- The Yarn Bombing activity
- The launch event together with the Meeka MADE art exhibition



Meekatharra's heritage, rooted in Indigenous, Pastoral, and Mining history, has been central to this project. The stories and history of our town have been immortalised in murals that now grace our streets, making our heritage a living and integral part of our everyday lives.

The Tidy Towns competition has been running for 54 years and recognises regional and remote communities for their efforts in effective litter prevention activities, sustainable projects and positive environmental outcomes. KABC judges visited entrants across regional and remote Western Australia in September to witness the diversity of projects being carried out.

The other finalists in the General Appearance category are Jurien Bay, Ongerup, Paraburdoo, Sandstone and Walpole. We wish them well and are looking forward to catching up with all other finalists at the lunch gala event in Perth on the 24th of November to share ideas and to discover if Meekatharra has clinched the coveted title.

Things Go KABOOM!

This was the name of an emergency exercise held at Plutonic Gold Mine on 27th October 2023.

Things should not go kaboom when you have many people in a 400km network of underground tunnels, but exactly that's why emergency drills are so important.

Catalyst Metals Ltd staff got to practice their Underground Search and Rescue skills and this scenario was also used as the annual exercise for the Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC). The LEMC is comprised of all the local emergency responses such as Police, the Firies/SES, Ambos, and Royal Flying Doctor Service as well as the other agencies that would activate depending on the scenario (e.g. Shire, Department of Communities, other government services and NGOs, surrounding mines etc).

In this made-up scenario the mine's Magazine Keeper stole explosives to get to a stash of gold in an unused area of the mine but managed to injure himself fatally by explosion and rock fall. The mine's rescue team got to test their new BG4s (self-contained regenerative oxygen breathing apparatus) to make the "scene" safe, checked the dummy for signs of life (none) and then secured the scene for other agencies to come in and do their bit.

After being fitted with helmets, head torches and safety equipment, our local teams (police, ambos, DFES and RFDS) were driven underground to the scene of the "incident". OIC Glenn Moore talked the rescuers through the investigation process and how a scene of this calibre would need to be secured.

The teams also discussed how the different agencies would respond to this kind of emergency or what would change if it was a mass-casualty incident. Where would all the extra resources come from? How long would it take for services to mobilise? Which team would be responsible for what?

With all the mining in the area, it is important that the different agencies know each other and can test their processes so that in the event of a real emergency everything can go as smoothly as possible and provide the best outcomes for all affected.

Be breast aware this October

Cancer Council WA is urging women in the Midwest region to use Breast Cancer Awareness Month as a reminder to be aware of the common symptoms of the disease.

In 2019, there were 1,899 women in WA were diagnosed with breast cancer, and 259 women lost their lives to it,". In the Midwest region, 30 women were diagnosed with breast cancer and, compared to 7 deaths.

Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast
- Change in the look of your breast, including redness, rash, or your skin looks like the skin of an orange, or is wrinkling in small folds
- Changes to the nipple, like it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side
- An area of the breast that feels different to the rest

If you have had any of these symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible.

If you have any of the symptoms, it doesn't mean you've got cancer – often, it turns out to be something less serious, but finding breast cancer early often means that the breast cancer is small, less likely to have spread to other parts of the body, and can be more effectively treated.

Rogue car dealer Ventura Autos warned again after name change (Ventura Autos / Car Central)

- Second warning for Ventura Autos Pty Ltd, trading under different names such as Car Central, for continuing to sell unroadworthy vehicles
- Ten further defect notices issued since first public warning in July 2023
- Five further complaints received by Consumer Protection

Consumer Protection has issued a second public warning to car buyers in Western Australia, urging extra caution if considering purchasing from Ventura Autos Pty Ltd, a licenced dealer in Welshpool now operating under different trading names such as Car Central.

Despite an initial warning in July this year, Ventura Autos Pty Ltd directors James Jonathan Mentiplay and Clancy Tamlyn Mentiplay aka Clancy Arnott, continue to sell unroadworthy vehicles in breach of the Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

Since the first public warning in July 2023, Consumer Protection has received 5 further complaints, totalling 141 complaints and issued 10 further defect notices totalling 53 defect notices since 2016, for unroadworthy vehicles offered for sale by Ventura Autos Pty Ltd or other trading names such as Car Central.

The further 10 defect notices were issued at a recent compliance visit. Defects included cracked windscreens, non-compliant tyres and issues with seatbelts.

Under the ACL, the consumer guarantee of acceptable quality requires that a vehicle be roadworthy at the point of sale.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake is concerned that Ventura Autos Pty Ltd continues to sell unroadworthy vehicles, is now using different trading names and often refuses to engage with consumers to provide suitable remedies.

"After six compliance visits and a public warning, we would have expected Ventura Autos Pty Ltd to have changed their business practices," Ms Blake said.



Food safety management tools

Guide for food businesses on Food Safety Standard 3.2.2A

A new standard has been introduced across Australia to improve food safety. If your food business is captured under the standard, you will need to comply with the requirements by 8 December 2023.

Why is there a new standard?

Poor food handling can cause outbreaks of foodborne illnesses, which can result in avoidable hospitalisations, loss of revenue and reputational damage to food businesses. This new standard has been introduced to reduce foodborne illness by ensuring food is handled safely by food handlers with adequate skills and knowledge.

Will my business be impacted by the standard?

You will need to comply if your business handles:

- unpackaged
- potentially hazardous
- ready-to-eat foods.







Two categories of businesses will be impacted.

Category one

Your business will be classified as category one if it processes or makes unpackaged, potentially hazardous, ready-to-eat foods. For example, cafés, restaurants or caterers that cook and serve meals with foods such as meat, dairy, seafood, cut fruit and vegetables, pasta and rice.

Category two

Your business will be classified as category two if it only minimally handles unpackaged, potentially hazardous food (such as slicing, weighing, repacking, reheating or hot-holding). For example, a service station which receives chilled pies and sandwiches that are displayed in a hot or cold display unit, or a supermarket deli which slices and packs cold meats.











Food safety management tools

The standard introduces 3 tools to manage food safety.

1. Food handler training

Food handlers (including chefs, cooks, waiters) in category one and two businesses will need to complete food handler training or show that they have the necessary skills and knowledge in food safety. Details of free online food handler training courses can be accessed at www.health.wa.gov.au/FSMT. Alternatively, each food handler can demonstrate skills and knowledge of food safety and hygiene matters.

2. Food safety supervisor

Category one and two businesses will need to appoint at least one food safety supervisor who must be reasonably available to advise and supervise the food handlers when they are handling unpackaged, potentially hazardous, ready-to-eat foods.

A food safety supervisor will be required to take a training course delivered by a registered training organisation and the certification must be refreshed every 5 years. Courses are listed at: www.health.wa.gov.au/FSS.

3. Showing that food is safe

Category one businesses must show that food safety controls are being managed by keeping records of it. The records must be kept for a minimum of 3 months.

Key records you may need to keep include:

- temperature of food on receival and transport
- storage and display temperatures
- cooking temperatures, or other pathogen control steps
- time taken to cool or reheat foods
- cleaning and sanitising of equipment and premises.

Record templates can be downloaded from www.health.wa.gov.au/FSMT

Alternatively, you can use other ways to demonstrate that you are managing key food safety controls. This can be checked by your local government *Food Act 2008* authorised officer.







Ants in your plants, and pavers?

Want to know what your problem ants are and how to control them? You've come to the right place.

There are thousands of ant species in Australia, and most are difficult to identify without a microscope and specialist knowledge. There are very effective baits for some species, while others require control using sprays. Other species rarely need any control and can be left alone. Unless you know the species of ant, control can be guesswork, which can waste your time and money, and involve the unnecessary use of pesticides.

By submitting samples for identification, you can learn about the species of ants at your property and how to control them, plus you'll contribute to ant surveillance in WA. Detections in recent years of exotic and problematic species such as the African black sugar ant, red imported fire ant and browsing ant, is a testament to the ability of ants to arrive in WA via freight and cargo. Their rapid detection provides the best chance of eradication and prevents the economic, social and environmental impacts caused by these ants.

For ant identification services, we request that only dead specimens are submitted. This will prevent any unintended spread of the ants, whilst keeping the postie happy!

Sampling instructions

- Brush ants into a sealed container, Ziplock bag or collect ants using the sticky side of transparent tape and fix this gently to a piece of paper.
- Place sample in the freezer for 1-2 hours to kill any live ants.
- Label samples with the collection location e.g. backyard, kitchen, bathroom, driveway etc., and include a note with your name, address, contact number and email address.
- Deliver or post to: Pest and Disease
 Information Service (PaDIS), Department of

 Primary Industries and Regional

Development, 3 Baron-Hay Court, South Perth WA 6151.

Any suspected exotic ant species should be reported for biosecurity screening to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.







Ingredients

- ▲ 6 corn cobs
- ▲ 2 tbs olive oil
- ▲ 1/2 tsp smoked paprika
- ▲ to taste chilli flakes or hot sauce, optional
- 2 tbs Parmesan cheese, grated
- 2 tbs coriander stalks and leaves, finely chopped
- ▲ 1 lime, cut into wedges

Method

- Heat a BBQ, griddle pan or frypan until very hot.
- If the corn cobs are in their green skins, pull the skins back but leave attached to make a handle. Remove the corn silks.
- Cook corn cobs on a high heat, turning often, until lightly charred all over (10 15 mins).
- 4. Mix the olive oil and smoked paprika and chilli flakes (if using).
- Once the corn is cooked, brush with the paprika oil, sprinkle with parmesan and coriander and serve with lime wedges.




