There will be exception for RFDS (Royal Flying Doctor Service) emergency medical evacuations.





A White card is issued to individuals who complete general construction induction training. It serves as proof that workers have a basic understanding of health and safety precautions on a work site.




SPORTING COMPLEX AND OVAL



SunSmart relaunches graphic campaign Two sides of the Sun to educate people living in the Midwest/Gascoyne regions that it is UV not hot weather that causes skin damage.

When the UV is 3 or above, protect yourself!

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world, yet it is highly preventable by using sun protection. There were nearly 200 deaths from skin cancer in Western Australia in 2020 and more than 117,000 skin cancer treatments in 2023.

Diagnosis and treatment of skin cancer is estimated to cost the WA health system approximately \$172 million per year.

Two sides of the sun was originally launched during the summer of 2021/2022 and the latest phase of this campaign has just been launched and shows us that there are two sides of the sun; a pleasant and nurturing side, and a dangerous side which can lead to skin damage and skin cancer.

This campaign hopes to motivate people to use multiple sun protection strategies during outdoor activities when UV levels reach 3 or above. UV not heat causes skin damage and UV can still be high on cool or cloudy days – it is different to heat and can't be felt. Protect your skin in five ways – Slop, Slop, Slap, Seek & Slide.

The campaign will run from February – May 2024 on radio (including digital audio), out-of-home and online channels (including social media and search activity).

Find Skin Cancer Early

Common skin cancer symptoms:

- A new spot or mole on your skin that is red, pale or pearly in colour
- A spot that is different from other spots on your skin
- Any crusty or non-healing sores
- Any spots, freckles or any moles changing in size (width), thickness (height), colour, or shape

Get to know your skin and what's normal for you, particularly if you're over 40 years of age. If you notice any of these symptoms or any other unusual changes, tell you doctor without delay.

If it's skin cancer, the earlier it's found, the greater the chance of successful treatment.

Living by the law: what you need to know before share housing

Splitting a rental with mates or even people you find through an advert can be a smart way to tackle soaring rent prices and low vacancy rates. But before you start dividing up chores and discussing furniture options, it's important to understand your legal rights and responsibilities when it comes to share house arrangements.

In co-tenancies, there is a shared tenancy agreement, but all tenants are jointly responsible for the full rent amount, bond and condition of the entire property. This means if your house mate misses a rent payment, for example, the whole household could be at risk of breaching the tenancy agreement unless they can cover the outstanding amount.

When it comes to paying the bond, each contributor must be listed against the bond as a tenant. The private landlord or agent then has 14 days to lodge the bond with the Bond Administrator. Consumer Protection has recently had two real estate agencies and directors fined and reprimanded for failing to lodge tenancy bonds within the required timeframe. Renters deserve peace of mind knowing their bonds are being handle by landlords and agents in accordance with the law.

It is important tenants receive an immediate receipt of their payment. The Bond Administrator will also send the tenants and the private landlord/agent a record of the payment directly from the department. This also ensures each tenant is returned their correct share of the bond when the tenancy ends.

If you move out of a share house, negotiate to have your name removed from the tenancy agreement. If you fail to do this, you can still be held responsible for the rent and other obligations. Also ensure you are provided with an outgoing property condition report. If anything needs to be addressed the cost will be recovered from your share of the bond.

Similarly, if you move into a share house ask for the tenancy agreement to be varied to list you as a co-tenant and add your name to the bond. The landlord/agent should provide an up-to-date property condition report. As the new co-tenant, you cannot be held responsible for the condition of the property before you moved in.

We advise only entering into shared tenancy agreements with people you trust and communicate well with. We know this can be difficult to gauge when replying to an ad looking for a house mate, so we recommend putting everything of importance in writing to protect yourself. This may include agreements about how and when rent and bills are paid, responsibility for everyday cleaning and maintenance of the property, ownership of any shared belongings and use of common areas.





If one tenant has paid another tenant's share of rent or other money owed to the landlord, the tenant can apply to the court for an order they be repaid by the other tenant. If you need assistance with money owed by a co-tenant or other similar dispute, reach out to your local community legal centre for more advice.

When everyone decides to move out of a share house the tenancy ends in the typical way.

Cook Mode Prevent your screen from going dark

Method

- 1. In a large bowl, mix together cooked rice, spring onions, capsicums, parsley and currants.
- To make dressing, combine soy sauce, vinegar, honey, sesame oil and lemon juice in a cup. Pour over salad and stir through well.
- Place a metal steamer into a large saucepan with a few centimetres of water. Add bok choy and bring to the boil. Steam with lid on for 3 minutes or until tender.
- 4. Meanwhile heat a griddle, barbeque grill or large non-stick frypan on high. Lightly spray each side of salmon with oil, season with pepper. Reduce heat to medium and cook salmon for 3 minutes each side until golden brown and just cooked.
- Top rice salad with cashews then spoon onto serving plates.
- 6. Add bok choy and salmon fillets; serve immediately.


Ingredients

- ▲ 2 cups cooked brown rice (from 1 cup uncooked rice)
- 6 spring onions (including green tops), thinly sliced
- ▲ 1 medium red capsicum, seeded and finely diced
- 1 medium yellow capsicum, seeded and finely diced
- ▲ 1/2 cup parsley, chopped
- ▲ 1/2 cup currants
- ▲ 4 x 100 g salmon fillet
- ▲ olive or canola oil spray
- ▲ 1 bunch bok choy, quartered
- ▲ 1/2 cup unsalted roasted cashews, roughly chopped, to serve
- ▲ 1 tbs salt-reduced soy sauce
- ▲ 2 tsp balsamic vinegar
- ▲ 2 tsp honey
- ▲ 1 tsp sesame oil
- ▲ juice of 1/2 lemon
