CEO COUNCIL MESSAGE

Welcome to the June 2024 edition of *The Dust CEO Council Message* Report that continues to provide information for all residents regarding the Council ordinary meeting that was held on the 15th of June 2024 as well as the Health, Building and Town Planning Committee meeting held on the same morning.

This section of *The Dust* is intended to provide a snapshot of the issues discussed at Councils Ordinary Meetings that are held each month. The unconfirmed minutes of Council Meetings are placed on the Council website as soon as possible within the prescribed time limit whereby they are confirmed at the next scheduled Council Meeting. Furthermore, items listed on the agenda when published for the community may not include all the items that were discussed at the Council Meeting, as provision is made for councillors and/or staff to introduce late items for consideration as permitted by legislation and Councils Standing Orders. Therefore, the following resolutions are only a summary extract of the full meeting agenda with the entire meeting proceedings being available in the official Council Minutes that are confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

<u>Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Health, Building & Planning Meeting 15 June</u> 2024

Item 7.1.1 – Principal Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor's Report
In accordance with the shared services agreement between the Shire of Meekatharra and the Shire of East Pilbara, the report provided a summary of building, planning and environmental health matters for April and May 2024. This included all activities, the progress of ongoing projects and concerns related to the required services raised by the Shire of East Pilbara. Further detail is available in the minutes of the Environmental Health Officer and Building Surveyor's Report.

<u>Item 7.1.2 – Community Services Manager's Report</u>

Lions Park

Seeds donated by West Gold have arrived and stored at the depot until final Lions Park design has identified their location.

- ➤ Large Water tank has been installed in the North East area of the park. Consultations and collaboration is ongoing regarding reticulation.
- ➤ Mid West Turf from Geraldton have been successful in the quote for 555m2 of Kikuyu turf. Delivery and installation has been postponed until the final Lions Park design has identified location.
- Awaiting commencement of new Project Officer to continue project.

Median Strip – Meekatharra Streetscape Art Project

Repair works for the damaged middle section yet to be completed.

Lloyds Signage

Still awaiting Main Roads comments on the latest sign proposal.

Local Planning Scheme & Strategy

Final Version of the Local Planning Scheme and Strategy has been sent to the Department for consideration and for referral to the minister.

Other item details from the Community Services Manager's Report can be found in the Minutes of the Health, Building & Planning Meeting.

Items from the Shire of Meekatharra Ordinary Meeting 15 June 2024

Item 9.3.3 – Meekatharra School of the Air Donation 2024

That Council approve a donation of \$1,000.00 to the Meekatharra School of the Air.

The above resolution confirms Councils commitment to supporting community based organizations in the Meekatharra District and where Council recognizes the valuable service they provide to the community.

Item 9.3.2 – Murchison Marlu Junior Football Club Donation

That Council resolve to donate \$1,000 to the Murchison Marlu Junior Football League to assist in costs to conduct the competition.

The above resolution confirms Councils commitment to supporting community based organizations in the Meekatharra District and where Council recognizes the valuable service they provide to the community.

<u>Item 13.2 – Mission Australia Lease</u>

That Council:

Approve the option to extend the current lease between the Shire of Meekatharra and Mission Australia for a further three year term from the 1st of July 2024 to the 30th of June 2027 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the current lease and approves the affixing of Councils Common Seal and execution of the Lease by the Chief Executive Officer and the Shire President.

The above resolution confirms Councils commitment to supporting community based

agencies in Meekatharra and where Council recognizes the valuable service they provide to the community.

Further Information Snippets

- ➤ Council 2024/25 budget Council is currently finalizing its 2024/25 budget having already advertised its required *Intention to Levy Differential Rates* for the 2024/25 year in accordance with Section 6.36 of the Local Government Act 1995. Council invited submissions in relation to the proposed differential rates that closed on the 14th of June 2014. Council intends to formally adopt its 2024/25 budget at its ordinary meeting scheduled for 27th of July 2024.
- Council staff appointments the community are advised that several appointments have been made at Council following the adoption of the Organizational Structure which is required to be reviewed annually. These include the appointment of Mr Alistair Finlayson as Councils Works & Services Manager after having acted in the role for the previous 3 months, confirmation of Ms Kadi King as Senior Youth Officer to be supported by a new full time position of Youth Officer, the appointment of Ms Sonja Shaw as our new Projects & Maintenance Officer, appointment of Ms Suzanne Barret as Council cleaner to replace current contract arrangements and the appointment of Mr Wayne Anderson as our Camp Cook/Chef which is a new appointment following the establishment of our new camp accommodation units for the Road Construction Crew. Applications have just closed for the Community Services Manager vacancy which we hope to fill in the next month.
- ➤ Rural Road Closures a timely reminder to all the community that recent rains have closed some, or all of Councils rural roads especially to heavy truck traffic. Council updates its 'Road Condition Report' regularly when these conditions occur and road users are advised that they are to follow the road closure instructions.

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council is scheduled for Saturday the 27th of July 2024, so the next CEO *Council Message* column will appear in the July 2024 edition. Until then bye for now!

The Travels of the Art Gallery Display Walls



A 'behind the scenes' recount, as told by Community Resource Centre Manager, Jo Bonnily

A story that twists and turns but has a happy ending.

Ok so we opened the Art Gallery and Visitor Centre officially on the 18th of April.

As we also know, Easter was 29/3/24 to 1/4/24 this year. We knew we had to take that into account when

we ordered the display walls.

The Meekatharra Shire and I worked together and we got our order in.

We were assured that everything would be delivered by Monday the 8th of April.

Ok so that gives us 10 days to have everything installed and set up. We are all good. But......

I received notification on Friday 5th of April that our delivery has been sent to delivery company A. I called them on Monday (expected delivery date), and they said that they had outsourced the delivery to company B.

I called company B and our delivery was sitting in their shed. I asked that it be put on a truck asap as they were supposed to be delivered that day.

On Tuesday I called company B again. I was told that our delivery was on a truck, but the truck was going to Newman. This was at about 10.30am. I asked if the delivery would be made today but they said no, the truck can't stop in Meekatharra (why can't the truck stop- does it blow up if it stops, is the driver unable to push the brake pedal?).

I asked them to intervene and have the delivery made. I called them again at 3.00pm and they hadn't been able to contact the driver (why – they only had about 4 hrs??) and the truck was now nearly at Newman.

So I asked if the delivery could be brought back to Meekatharra. Of course it can.... for an additional fee.

My response "why would I pay an additional fee when your truck drove straight past the delivery point, he didn't even have to turn a corner!!"

After further phone calls back and forth the delivery companies – yes both of them – decided that the best solution was to take the delivery back to Perth – straight past the delivery point again!!! I was also told not to contact delivery company B regarding this delivery, to only deal with company A. As you can imagine, my blood was boiling at the stupidity so far.

I called company A on Wednesday and they said that the delivery was in transit back to them.... but they could have it to us a week later.


Feeling slightly exasperated I at this point I explained to them, that a) the delivery was supposed to arrive 2 days ago,

By this time there were tears of frustration. How hard is it to get a pallet taken of a truck!!!

The gentleman who had the contract to unload from company B called me and explained his reaction of earlier in the day and was happy to be called when the truck arrived to unload it for me. Thank goodness.

So the truck arrived and I was so happy that I did hug the truck driver. Like, two arms, thank you so much.

He told me that he had picked our delivery up from Tom Price!!! I'm sure my eyes rolled into the back of my head,

But the delivery was here so......

It took a bit of work to get the pallet off as it was a long skinny pallet but... we had our walls and would open our Art Gallery on time.

And we all lived happily ever after!






SPORTING COMPLEX AND OVAL





10 YEARS AGO TODAY!

A trip back in time

What was happening in Meekatharra ten years ago? Well, we took a bit of a dig through the archives and this is what we found!

Sandfire Meekatharra Golf Open

10 years ago the Sandfire Meekatharra Annual Open Golf Tournament was held and for the first time, a huge cash prize was offered for the Net Men's winner. It was said to have been the largest amateur golf prize in the Mid-West/Goldfields region at that time.

The winner of the cheque for \$1,000 cash was Brendon Stuart who had a score of 70 points from the 27 hole event. Brendon was part of the Leinster Golf Club. Participants also travelled from the Pilbara to attend the tournament.

The prize money for this event was just under the amateur golfing regulations limit for that time!

Now, you might be wondering why the gym is in this section, but did you know that the Meekatharra Gym was previously located at the Indoor Cricket Centre?



Stage one of WA's rent reforms are now here.

Rent bidding is now banned, tenants have stronger rights to fight back against retaliatory action by landlords and undercover officers from Consumer Protection will be checking to make sure landlords and agents are doing the right thing.

Welcome to stage one of Western Australia's Rent Reforms, which came into effect on 16 May. The changes to the *Residential Tenancies Act* passed through Parliament last month and here's what it means for renters and landlords.

The ban on soliciting rent bidding means landlords and agents can no longer ask or invite tenants to pay more money to secure an available rental property.

An example of soliciting rent bidding would be, "there are lots of people interested in this property, you can secure it if you offer more rent."

Properties must also be advertised at a set amount and cannot include a price range, or 'rent from' figure. Failure to comply with these laws may attract penalties of up to \$10,000 or \$50,000 for a corporation.

Consumer Protection will be keeping a watchful eye on landlords and property managers by sending undercover compliance officers posing as would-be tenants along to property inspections to discuss higher rent offers.

Higher rent offers can be accepted if they are offered freely. If a tenant proposes offering higher rent, the lessor or their agent must respond along the lines, " that is a matter for you and not something I want to comment on. You need to make your own decision about the value of the property and the rent you wish to pay".

While tenants have always been able to challenge an eviction in the Magistrates Court, the new rules around retaliatory action are now broader. If a tenant believes their landlord or agent is taking action against them as payback for exercising their rental rights, they can challenge that action in the Magistrate's Court.

For example, this might be if a tenant thinks their rent was deliberately increased, or their lease agreement not renewed, just because they asked for some basic maintenance or made a complaint about their landlord or agent.

This change gives tenants boosted confidence to stick up for their rights and apply to the Magistrates Court to have decisions by the landlord or agent reversed.

It's important to note this new reform only covers actions since the 16 May 2024.

These are just the first two reforms of seven. A second stage of tenancy reforms is expected to take effect in July 2024. These include reducing the frequency of rent increases to a minimum 12-month intervals, allowing tenants to keep pets or make minor modifications in most circumstances and introducing Commissioner dispute resolution processes.

A streamlined bond release process is expected to be introduced in early 2025.

Watch this space as we will have another Saturday session coming to Meekatharra next term.



Splitting the difference

Larvae in firewood

During the winter period where firewood is often collected and split, our service receives a common enquiry: "I've chopped some wood and found these grubs! Are these borers? Is this the European house borer? Is my house at risk??? The first question we ask to split European house borer (EHB) from many other wood borers is: "What wood are you cutting? Is it pine?". If the answer is no, it's not going to be EHB.

EHB larvae will only reproduce in seasoned (dry) coniferous timber and wood, including pine, fir and spruce. Of these, pine trees (Pinus species) and pine timbers are abundant in WA. What if the answer was yes? - If you notice larvae or borer emergence holes in dead pine branches, logs, or untreated pine pallets or timbers, please report this. EHB has the potential to cause major structural damage to buildings constructed with untreated pine timber. Infested wood stored in or around the home is worth investigating.

Who's on the chopping block?

Most firewood burnt in WA is from native hardwood species and pictured in this article are the larvae of native longicorn beetles (*Phoracantha* species) in jarrah. These beetles attack live or recently dead/felled Eucalypt trees

and do not pose a risk to the timbers in your home

If you have been chopping firewood for years but are only starting to see these borers, it's likely the trees the firewood has come from, were stressed or recently felled. Trees stressed by drought or disease are particularly susceptible to borer attack.

Reporting

We can't all be insect identification specialists, but that doesn't matter. If something isn't familiar to you, it's best to report it rather than ignore it. When reporting, please include as much information as possible about what's occurring. Collect and hold onto any insect samples, and if taking photos, include things like a ruler or a pen so the dimensions of insects, holes or other symptoms can be gauged.

If borers are coming out of furniture, timber, or wooden products like bowls, chopping boards or ornaments – report it as soon as possible and we will provide guidance from there.

Find Cancer Early: Tips when visiting your doctor about a possible symptom.

As we get older, many of us don't often think too much about a change to our body. This can result in us expecting and accepting changes over time as being normal.

But it is important to not be tempted to put something unusual down to 'getting older' before you've told your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. Always have a chat and let them know what you've noticed, even if you're not concerned by it. Chances are it is nothing to worry about, but it's better to be on the safe side.

When you decide to make an appointment, lots of different questions and concerns can pass through your mind, such as:

- The doctor is always too busy.
- It's too hard to get an appointment.
- When I get to my appointment my mind goes blank.
- What could happen when I see the doctor or health worker?
- I don't have a doctor.
- I feel embarrassed or shame.

Tips when you are visiting your doctor/health professional:

- Be clear about your symptoms.
- Calling early in the morning is often the best time to arrange an appointment and if you feel it is urgent let the receptionist know this when you call.
- If your usual health professional isn't available that day, ask for their earliest available appointment, or ask to see another doctor.
- Write down why you've made the appointment and what you want to tell your health professional.
- Keep a symptom diary of what's been happening, how long for, and how often it occurs – you can take this with you.
- Health professionals are there to help you don't be embarrassed to let them know about any unusual changes you've noticed in your body.
- Take someone with you as a second pair of ears to listen & perhaps to take notes for you to clarify what is said at your appointment.

Become familiar with common cancer symptoms.

We encourage adults, especially those over 40 years of age, to be aware of some common symptoms of cancers. You can give yourself the best chance to **Find Cancer Early**, by going to see a doctor straight away if you have symptoms, so that treatment is easier, and you can be around longer to do the things you love doing with the people you love.

1 in 15 Australians are diagnosed with Bowel Cancer every year.

Living a healthy and fulfilling life is important to us all. But ignoring our health and not seeing a doctor if we have unusual symptoms could have a serious impact on our life and wellbeing. It is important to be aware of cancer symptoms and get checked out by a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker if you notice anything unusual.

Bowel cancer is Australia's second biggest cancer killer, and many people don't realise it kills more Australians each year than breast, prostate, or skin cancer.

Common symptoms of bowel cancer may include blood in your poo (even just one time) or, for more than four weeks: a new pain, lump or swelling in your tummy; feeling tired; looking pale; losing weight without trying; and a change in normal bowel habits, such as runny poo, pooing more often or finding it hard to poo.

Almost half of all bowel cancers can be prevented by leading a healthy lifestyle, which includes:

Eating well – a diet high in fibre, fruit, vegetables and low in red and processed meat

Keeping at a healthy weight

Not smoking

Consuming less alcohol

Moving more – be physically active

And of course, participating in the screening program if eligible
