The above resolution confirms Councils agreement for a variation to the current Road User and Maintenance Deed Agreement between the Shire of Meekatharra and Westgold Mining Pty Ltd for the use of the Ashburton Downs Road network as requested by Westgold.

<u>Item 9.3.5 – Stephen Michael Foundation Lease</u>

That Council approve leasing the property Lot 832 being a portion of Lot 500 Railway Street on Reserve 3892, Meekatharra on Deposited Plan 69309 Certificate of Title Volume LR3161 Folio 607 to the Stephen Michael Foundation Ltd in accordance with the terms and conditions of the attached lease and for the Shire President and CEO to execute under Common Seal and to seek Ministerial approval.

The above resolution confirms approval to lease the former Meeka Goes Green shed to the Stephen Michael Foundation at Lot 500 Railway Street, on Reserve 3892, Meekatharra. This will allow the Stephen Michael Foundation to store its equipment at a secure site.

Further Information Snippets

- Council 2024/25 budget As previously advised, Council finalized its 2024/25 budget that was formally adopted at its ordinary meeting of 27th of July 2024. This will now allow the 2024/25 Rates Notices to be finalized and sent to all landowners. This year Council will not include the budget explanation documentation with the Rates Notices but instead has advertised the information in this edition of the Dust and will also include on Councils website, Facebook etc.
- ➤ Shire President Local Government Award Councillor Harvey Nichols has been awarded the Local Government Merit Certificate for his long and dedicated service to the Shire of Meekatharra. Harvey was first elected to the Shire of Meekatharra in 2003 and elected as Shire President in 2019. The award was presented by the WA Local Government Association and on behalf of the Shire of Meekatharra and the community, we congratulate Councillor Nichols on receiving his well deserved award.
- Citizenship ceremony the Shire President was pleased to confer citizenship to Mr Mmeli Moyo at a ceremony held after the Council meeting of 17th August 2024 We congratulate Mmeli on becoming an Australian citizen.

2024-2025 Budget in Brief

Snapshot

Council has implemented a new rating model bringing the Shire's rating effort in-line with the other Councils in the Murchison Region.

Rating of townsite properties and pastoral stations is on average with the region, whilst mining has increased from last year it remains below the regional average.

Charges for waste disposal remains the same as last year.

The Shire's total operating revenue is \$11.6 million, of which \$7.2 million comes from rate revenue.

The Shire has estimated \$8.0 million in capital funding, primarily helping to fund improvements to the road network.

No loans are proposed in the budget.

The 2024-2025 Budget includes operating cash expense of \$9.1 million, with a further \$26.0 million allocated to capital works.

Council has also implemented a new model for cashbacked reserves, effectively consolidating many historical reserves into larger, newer reserves.

A net decrease of \$0.9 million in cash-backed reserves is anticipated as funds are directed to the proposed capital works.

Capital works included in the budget are summarised as -

- Buildings \$3.8 million
- Plant and Machinery \$1.9 million
- Roads \$18.3 million
- Pathways \$0.4 million
- Other Infrastructure \$1.1 million
- Airport \$0.5 million

Some of the proposed works include -

Staff Accommodation - \$1.2 million

Finalisation of two new units for staff accommodation at Lot 304 (135) Darlot Street will occur once planning approval has been completed. Additional accommodation will also be constructed.

Lloyd's Plaza Extension - \$1.6 million

Stage 1 of an extension to Lloyd's Plaza will occur following public consultation. Concept plans have been prepared and discussed by Council.



Recreational and Cultural Facilities - \$0.5 million

Renewal works to the Swimming Pool, Gymnasium, Picture Gardens and Youth Centre are proposed.

Landor-Meekatharra Road Sealing - \$10.5 million

Roads to Recovery capital funding will be used to assist in sealing the remaining unsealed 29-kilometre section of the Landor-Meekatharra Road.

Floodway Reinstatements - \$3.2 million

Funding for 4 x Floodway Reinstatements has been included at Gorge Creek, Pingandy River (Little), Pingandy River (Big), and Deverell Creek.

Flood Damage Reinstatement - \$3.0 million

Flood damage on over 40 Shire roads, caused by significant weather events in recent years, will be reinstated with funding being provided by government.

Lions Park Development - \$0.3 million

Park development will continue, including pathways, reticulation, tree planting, and other landscaping.





We had our first ever 'Colour Run' over the Festival weekend and there was a street parade that took place as well.





New rules crack down on hiding a vehicle's past

Used car buyers now have more confidence that the vehicles for sale from dealers are safe and reliable, with new regulations taking effect that help protect consumers from making a purchase they may later regret.

As of 7 June, motor vehicle dealers in Western Australia must disclose to prospective buyers whether a vehicle under 15 years old is a repairable write-off.

And there will be penalty of \$2,000 coming to car dealers who fail to reveal whether they are selling written-off vehicles. They must declare this on a form that will be displayed in the window of every second-hand car they are selling.

A repairable write-off is deemed too costly for an insurer to repair but it may be repaired and re-registered subject to the vehicle passing specific safety and vehicle identification inspections. The vehicle must be assessed as roadworthy by an authorised assessor.

Even though a damaged vehicle can be repaired, it may mean there could be other unknown issues. Consumers may also struggle to get full insurance for a vehicle that has been written-off and discover it has a lower market value.

The new regulations help address the growing numbers of consumers who unknowingly purchase used cars that have been written off and repaired, with complaints to Consumer Protection tripling since 2020.

In 71 per cent of the 34 complaints made to Consumer Protection in 2023, the complainants alleged they were not advised that the vehicle they were purchasing was a repairable write off. In many of these cases, the complainants were explicitly told the vehicle had never been in a crash or written-off.

Any false or misleading statement or representation made on the form displayed in the car window may attract a fine of up to \$5,000 under the Motor Vehicle Dealers legislation.

Every used car buyer has a right to know that the vehicle they have chosen is safe, reliable, and fit for purpose. The new regulations will mean consumers can make an informed choice and this will help improve consumer trust in the dealer industry.

These changes do not apply to private car sales. There's a greater risk for buyers involved in private sales, compared to buying from a dealer.

We encourage consumers to continue to do a \$2 Personal Properties Securities Register check on a second-hand car when buying privately. In addition to revealing whether a vehicle under 15 years old is a repairable write-off – it will also confirm if it has been stolen and is free of outstanding debts.

Do this check at www.ppsr.gov.au . Do not use other non-government websites that do the same check but for a much higher fee.





Splitting the difference

Larvae in firewood

During the winter period where firewood is often collected and split, our service receives a common enquiry: "I've chopped some wood and found these grubs! Are these borers? Is this the European house borer? Is my house at risk??? The first question we ask to split European house borer (EHB) from many other wood borers is: "What wood are you cutting? Is it pine?". If the answer is no, it's not going to be EHB.

EHB larvae will only reproduce in seasoned (dry) coniferous timber and wood, including pine, fir and spruce. Of these, pine trees (Pinus species) and pine timbers are abundant in WA. What if the answer was yes? - If you notice larvae or borer emergence holes in dead pine branches, logs, or untreated pine pallets or timbers, please report this. EHB has the potential to cause major structural damage to buildings constructed with untreated pine timber. Infested wood stored in or around the home is worth investigating.

Who's on the chopping block?

Most firewood burnt in WA is from native hardwood species and pictured in this article are the larvae of native longicorn beetles (*Phoracantha* species) in jarrah. These beetles attack live or recently dead/felled Eucalypt trees

and do not pose a risk to the timbers in your home.

If you have been chopping firewood for years but are only starting to see these borers, it's likely the trees the firewood has come from, were stressed or recently felled. Trees stressed by drought or disease are particularly susceptible to borer attack.

Reporting

We can't all be insect identification specialists, but that doesn't matter. If something isn't familiar to you, it's best to report it rather than ignore it. When reporting, please include as much information as possible about what's occurring. Collect and hold onto any insect samples, and if taking photos, include things like a ruler or a pen so the dimensions of insects, holes or other symptoms can be gauged.

If borers are coming out of furniture, timber, or wooden products like bowls, chopping boards or ornaments – report it as soon as possible and we will provide guidance from there.

RECIPE TIME!



Ingredients

- ▲ 1 cake instant noodles
- ▲ 1 1/2 cups frozen mixed vegetables
- ▲ 2 eggs
- ▲ 2 tsp kecap manis or reduced-salt soy sauce
- ▲ chilli sauce, to taste
- Cook Mode Prevent your screen from going dark

Method

Stove-top method

- Bring a small saucepan of water to the boil. Cook noodles for 90 seconds, then add frozen vegies and cook for another 30-60 seconds, until noodles are tender and vegetables are defrosted.
- 2. In a small frypan, heat a little oil and fry eggs on medium heat till cooked to your liking.
- 3. Transfer noodles and vegies to a large bowl, stir in sauces and top with eggs.

Microwave/ office method:

- 1. Put noodles in a large bowl and cover with boiling water and set aside.
- 2. Crack 1 egg into a mug and add a splash of water (about 2 tbs). Cover with a saucer (IMPORTANT!) and microwave for 30 seconds. Remove from microwave and check to see if the egg white is cooked through, being careful of the steam burst when you take the saucer off. If it needs longer, microwave in 10 second bursts, until cooked to your liking. Repeat with the other egg. Note: The size and temperature of the eggs, the size and material the mug is made out of, and the microwave power will all affect how long it takes. Eggs-periment until you figure out your perfect system!
- 3. Add the frozen vegetables to the noodles. Stir in the hot water, then roughly drain. Microwave for 1-2 minutes, until vegetables are defrosted and noodles are cooked.
- 4. Toss noodles with sauces and top with eggs.




