
SPORTING COMPLEX AND OVAL



The Halloween Disco event at the school attracted around 100 attendees. It was a funfilled event with costumes, music, and dancing. The youth had a great time, and it was a good opportunity for them to come together in a social, Halloween-themed setting.

Additionally, The Barndi Mayu (Good kids) Community Fashion Show event was a highlight of the season. The show featured a variety of youth-designed outfits, showcasing incredible creativity and talent. The event attracted a diverse audience and provided an exciting platform for young models to express themselves.

It was a fantastic celebration of fashion, community, and self-expression.



Due to the Youth Centre undergoing some new painting and changes to the interior, the facility has been unavailable for some of October. However, we were still able to run sports sessions from the swimming pool between 3pm - 5pm and from the Sports Complex between 6pm - 8pm weekdays.

Looking ahead, we are focused on addressing staffing challenges and planning more events to engage and support our youth community.



Family and Domestic Violence Service

This service offers a community response to women and their children (if present) who are experiencing domestic violence or are concerned about their safety.

Support includes:

- Crisis accommodation up to 72—hours or with a Police Order
- Arranging transportation and alternative accommodation
- Essential emergency items such as food
- Links to counselling and other culturally appropriate services

Meekatharra Housing and-Support Service—Gumbarra Urda

Transitional Accommodation will provide a pathway for families, women and children who have a desire to transition out of unsafe and/or unstable housing situations with support. MHSS will provide medium term accommodation combined with case management and community development.

Remote Education and Learning—Ijaba

This service works with families and community to increase school attendance in Meekatharra.

Our team acknowledges that school attendance is a 'whole of community' responsibility and has adopted a family focused model to work specifically with parents, carers and other family members as well as Elders, the school, local residents, community organisations and government agencies.

Our aim is to identity and address the short and long term challenges that families encounter, which may impact on children and young people attending and staying at school.

Public Tenancy Support Service

This service supports people living in Public Housing who face difficulty maintaining their tenancy.

Our team aims to support tenants to increase their ability to avoid reaching the point of eviction, debts and property standards.

Mental Health Support Service

This service provides information support, advocacy, referral and counselling to Aboriginal people living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who experience and live with mental ill

Our team adopts a recovery-orientated model, placing significant emphasis on the choices and decisions of the individual. We aim to support people to make positive changes and reach their goals while continuing to participate fully in the community.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

This service supports grandparents living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who are the sole or primary carer of their grandchildren.


Emergency Relief

This service is offered to people experiencing significant financial distress, homelessness and other life challenges.

Immediate relief is available once every three months in the form of food hampers. In addition to referrals to other services. Appointments to Emergency Relief are essential.

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

Lung cancer is one of the most common cancers affecting both women and men in Western Australia.

In 2019, 693 Western Australian men and 564 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:

- A new cough or change to your usual cough.
- A lot of chest infections
- · Finding it hard to breathe
- · Losing weight without trying
- Not feeling hungry
- · Pain in your chest and/or shoulder
- Feeling tired or lacking energy
- Changes to your voice, such as hoarseness or croaky voice

If you have coughed up blood, **even if it was just once**, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer – often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Tenant termination: Breaking your lease

Ending a tenancy agreement early, or 'breaking lease' can be stressful, but renters should find it easier in the current tight rental market given it probably won't take long to find new tenants.

While there are potential costs involved with breaking lease, you cannot be asked to pay the usual end of tenancy expenses such as the final inspection fee that an agent may charge and the landlord cannot impose other additional fees.

Landlords are also not entitled to be compensated for losses that could have been avoided, such as lost rent via a delay in reletting the property because they decide to undertake some renovations. They must do everything reasonable to find a new tenant as quickly as possible and keep their losses to a minimum.

Additionally, your bond should be returned to you as normal, minus any costs for repairs, and you will need to leave the property clean and tidy.

It's best to notify your landlord in writing as soon as possible that you intend to break lease. This will help reduce any costs you may have to pay.

But what costs will you be liable for? You must continue paying rent until your lease officially ends (even if you've moved out), or until a replacement tenant is able to move in, whichever happens first.

If you can, give a specific moving out date as this can make it easier to secure a new tenant. You are entitled to stay in the property as long as you're paying rent as per your tenancy agreement.

Besides the lost rent, you may be asked to cover other costs as a result of you breaking lease, for example the cost of advertising the property. However, the landlord must do what they can to reduce these costs, including advertising the property quickly.

There are circumstances where you can end a tenancy agreement early without breaking lease or incurring costs, such as if the property is destroyed in a natural disaster or circumstances of family violence. Check the Consumer Protection website for the specific conditions that need to be met in these cases.

What about if your landlord wants to break lease? You don't have to agree with the request to break lease but if you do agree, you can ask the landlord to cover some costs of having to move house unexpectedly. Landlords can also apply to the Magistrates Court for an order to end the tenancy.

Consumer Protection wants landlords to appreciate that tenants breaking lease can be experiencing a lot of stress, which can include a need to relocate at short notice for work or a change in financial



circumstances. In a tight rental market, landlords are unlikely to experience much of a loss of income and it's always best to address these situations amicably.

Not mushroom for error

Spring has arrived here in the south-west. The weather is mild, the bush is exploding with flowers, and many Western Australian's are venturing out to experience the natural wonders of our region. Although past their peak, those with keen eyes will still spot what the intrepid winter bushwalkers have been enjoying for months, weird and wonderful specimens from the captivating kingdom of fungi!

Fantastic fungi

When you think of south-west WA's biodiversity, fungi might not be the first thing that comes to mind. However, it's estimated that fungal species may outnumber plant species 10:1, which means there could be as many as 140,000 different species in this region, the majority yet to be discovered. These oftenoverlooked lifeforms play crucial roles in our ecosystems, from the forest floor to the treetops, they are hard at work, decomposing organic matter, forming symbiotic relationships with plants, nourishing wildlife and even glowing in the dark. One of the most enchanting fungi you might encounter is the ghost fungus (Omphalotus nidiformis). These bioluminescent beauties can be found growing on dead or dying wood, emitting an eerie green glow in the darkness. Look but don't touch - ghost fungi are toxic.

The dangers of foraging

While the world of fungi is fascinating, and some species are safe and tasty to eat, it's crucial to remember that foraging for wild mushrooms can be

extremely dangerous. Many poisonous species closely resemble edible ones, and misidentification can lead to severe illness, organ damage or even death. Never eat wild mushrooms unless you're an expert or have had them identified by an expert. Sadly, fungi experts are hard to find, and even experienced foragers can make mistakes. It's best to admire fungi in their natural habitat without taking them home for dinner. For cases of suspected poisoning call 000. For general information, the poisons information centre: 13 11 26.

Livestock and pet concerns

Occasionally we receive enquiries from the public concerned about the risk of poisonous mushrooms to their animals. Though not common, ingestion of mushrooms has caused accidental poisoning of livestock and companion animals. If you are concerned your animal/s have consumed wild mushrooms, please contact your local veterinarian in the first instance.

Fungi resources

Unfortunately, the Department has limited expertise in the identification of mushrooms and fungi species outside of our plant pathology expertise. However, some helpful resources include the Fungimap website (fungimap.org.au), the WA Naturalists' 'Fungi books and resources' webpage, social media fungi interest groups, and various fungi book resources including publications from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation, Attractions (DBCA) and CSIRO.



Ingredients

- ▲ 1/2 head cauliflower, cut into florets
- ▲ 1 head broccoli, cut into florets
- ▲ 1/3 cup water
- ▲ 2 tbs plain flour
- ▲ 2 cups reduced-fat milk
- pepper, to taste
- ▲ 1/2 cup reduced-fat cheese

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- Place cauliflower, broccoli florets and water into a microwave safe and ovenproof dish. Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 5 minutes. Carefully drain off the water and set aside.

- 4. Microwave the milk mixture on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute. Stir. Heat again for 1 minute and stir. If needed, heat again for 30 seconds intervals and stir until thick and creamy.
- 5. Add grated cheese and stir until melted through.


