


The special event was hosted at the Shire Hall on Australia Day, offering an opportunity for everyone to gather in a spirit of appreciation and unity.




SPORTING COMPLEX AND OVAL


Looking for a space to use for a big event in town?





Family and Domestic Violence Service

This service offers a community response to women and their children (if present) who are experiencing domestic violence or are concerned about their safety.

Support includes:

- Crisis accommodation up to 72—hours or with a Police Order
- Arranging transportation and alternative accommodation
- Essential emergency items such as food
- Links to counselling and other culturally appropriate services

Meekatharra Housing and-Support Service—Gumbarra Urda

Transitional Accommodation will provide a pathway for families, women and children who have a desire to transition out of unsafe and/or unstable housing situations with support. MHSS will provide medium term accommodation combined with case management and community development.

Remote Education and Learning—Ijaba

This service works with families and community to increase school attendance in Meekatharra.

Our team acknowledges that school attendance is a 'whole of community' responsibility and has adopted a family focused model to work specifically with parents, carers and other family members as well as Elders, the school, local residents, community organisations and government agencies.

Our aim is to identity and address the short and long term challenges that families encounter, which may impact on children and young people attending and staying at school.

Public Tenancy Support Service

This service supports people living in Public Housing who face difficulty maintaining their tenancy.

Our team aims to support tenants to increase their ability to avoid reaching the point of eviction, debts and property standards.

Mental Health Support Service

This service provides information support, advocacy, referral and counselling to Aboriginal people living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who experience and live with mental ill health.

Our team adopts a recovery-orientated model, placing significant emphasis on the choices and decisions of the individual. We aim to support people to make positive changes and reach their goals while continuing to participate fully in the community.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

This service supports grandparents living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who are the sole or primary carer of their grandchildren.

Emergency Relief

This service is offered to people experiencing significant financial distress, homelessness and other life challenges.

Immediate relief is available once every three months in the form of food hampers. In addition to referrals to other services. Appointments to Emergency Relief are essential.

Inake Dies

What to do:

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John WA Action Plan.
- 2. Urgent medical aid. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3. Ensure the casualty does not move.
- 4. Lay the casualty down, rest and reassure.
- 5. If the bite is on a limb, apply a broad pressure bandage over the bite site as soon as possible.
- 6. Then apply a further elasticised or firm bandage start at fingers or toes and move up the limb as far as can be reached. Apply tightly but without stopping blood flow.
- 7. Splint the limb including the joints on either side of the bite.
- 8. Write down the time that the casualty was bitten and when the bandage was applied.
- 9. If the casualty becomes unconscious and not breathing normally, Commence CPR and Defibrillation.

Signs and symptoms

- Visible in an hour or more after the person has been bitten.
- In children, signs and symptoms may appear within minutes.
- Paired fang marks, but often only a single mark or a scratch mark may be present. Marks or scratches may bleed.
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Headache, drowsiness, giddiness or faintness.
- Double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids.
- Voice changes, trouble speaking or swallowing. Pain or tightness in the throat, chest or abdomen.
- Breathing difficulties, respiratory weakness or arrest.

Do not wash the venom off the skin (it may aid in identification).

Do not cut the bitten area and try to suck the venom out.

Do not use a tourniquet.

Do not try and catch the snake.

Beware the trap – work from home scams flooding social media

New year, new job! But watch-out for job scams that hope to steal your money, rather than make you any.

Social media or encrypted message platforms like WhatsApp or Telegram are currently flooded with job scams, offering easy employment online with no experience needed and the added benefit of working from home.

The phony jobs require people to perform tasks for a commission, such as leaving fake "five star" reviews on food delivery services apps and online shopping platforms, or liking and following social media accounts. Some people are asked to purchase products before leaving a false review, so they appear as a "verified buyer" on the platform.

Victims often have to send evidence of their "work" to an "auditor" (i.e. scammer), and they are led to believe they are helping a business' profile with their fake positive reviews. But it's got nothing to do with the reviews, it's about scamming you out of your hard-earned money. Scammers will request money through bank transfer or crypto currency to cover taxes, keep your account active or to cover conversion rates when paying out your "earnings".

To secure the job, victims are deceived into investing a substantial amount of money with the false promise of high returns. They will be encouraged to create an account where they are often asked to provide forms of identification as well. Once the person realises there won't be any payment or promised return, the scammers then begin a harassment campaign for further payments.

One person reported losing nearly \$2,000 to a job scam where she was assigned tasks to rate products online. After setting up a cryptocurrency account, she initially earned \$400 and felt positive about the new job. She was then asked to deposit her own money into the account to continue receiving tasks and was also added to a group chat with scammers posing as other excited employees encouraging the newcomers to invest in this "wonderful opportunity."

Sadly, these job scams generally target new parents, retirees, international students and people living with disability. However, anyone could become caught in a scammer's web.

WA ScamNet has already received several reports of these scams this year. The victims have lost almost \$60,000 in total.

Keep an eye out for the red flags and practice the pause – take a moment to consider if the job is too good to be true. Scammers are highly sophisticated and may post ads on legitimate job websites or on social media to appear as genuine businesses. Be alert to any vague job descriptions and communications conducted through social media and message platforms.

Verify company information through your own internet searches and be suspicious if there is no physical address.

Beware of job offers made without a formal interview and never provide payment upfront, especially by cryptocurrency. It's unlikely you'll ever get your money back and you should never have to pay a fee to secure employment.

If you think you have fallen prey to a job scam, cease and block all contact with the scammers, contact your bank and report the scam to ScamNet – scamnet.wa.gov.au or call 1300 30 40 54.

Also be on high alert for follow up scams where fraudsters contact you again claiming to be a fund recovery agency able to help retrieve the lost money. This is also a scam and should be ignored.

European wasp surveillance in full swing







European wasps feed on grapes and other fruit, human and pet food, insects and dead animals like rats, kangaroos and bandicoots.

The annual hunt to detect and eradicate European wasps (*Vespula germanica*) from WA is in full swing!

Guard your BBQs, monitor your pet's food and check the insects you scoop from the pool! European wasps, we are looking for you!

The European wasp is a declared pest and must be reported. It has threatened to establish in WA since six nests were found and destroyed near Fremantle in 1977. Thanks to ongoing collaborative surveillance between the Department, community, local governments and businesses, WA has prevented the permanent establishment and spread of this species, to date. This is globally unique, and an extraordinary achievement.

European wasps are widely established across most of southern Australia and Tasmania which aren't subject to such a coordinated program. Consequently, new queens hitchhike their way into WA each year, and this is our 48th year spent competing in a sophisticated game of 'hide and seek' against this highly adaptable and destructive pest.

These wasps have the proven potential to establish nests from Kalbarri to Eucla, with outbreaks historically

in Kalgoorlie, Kalbarri, Geraldton and regional towns across the south-west. Most detections are made in the Perth Metro, but current regional detections include the Bunbury, Geraldton_and Albany regions. These are huge areas to monitor, so please keep your eyes peeled.

What to look for

There are similar looking black and yellow wasps in WA, so look for these key characteristics:

- Scavenging on human food and drinks, fruit like grapes, apples and stone fruit, pet food and roadkill (carrion).
- Nest underground nests are HUGE, grow larger than a basketball in a single season, and have a small (golf ball sized) entrance hole.
- Completely black antenna.
- Legs up in flight (rear legs don't dangle).




