COUNCIL MESSAGE | CEO Report



Thank you to the Council of the Shire of Meekatharra for entrusting me to lead the Shire as the new Chief Executive Officer.

Coming up to nearly a year as a resident in Meekatharra I am committed to a lengthy stay, building productive relationships, and helping to generate much needed change to ensure a positive future for the townsite, and greater area.

Recent Shire happenings are below -

Rubbish Collection

After careful consideration, the Shire is bringing townsite rubbish collection back as an "inhouse" service. I take this opportunity to sincerely thank Mark Tipple for his many years of service to the area and wish him all the best in his future endeavours. Initially the Shire will be operating a second-hand rubbish compaction truck (sourced from the City of Armadale), before taking possession of a new truck in 8-10 months. It is a steep learning curve for our town crew, and I have every confidence in their ability to undertake this crucial service.

Safer Meekatharra Strategy

Council members recently agreed to undertake a study, and develop a strategy, to identify initiatives to help make a safer Meekatharra. Amongst other matters, this will include the development of CCTV facilities throughout the town, with a priority given to improving greater integration with WA Police. Other initiatives to be considered include the provision of financial incentives for ratepayers to install their own CCTV systems and additional lighting.

Cattle Grid Management

Shire contractors have recently cleared several cattle grids of dirt and other materials thus returning the grids to a usable standard. The program has been so successful, and the work performed has been of such a high standard, Council has agreed to additional funding to extend the service over the next few months. Funding in outgoing years is also likely, and a program of future works is being prepared.

Floodway Installations

Contractors have recently completed installation of 4 floodways on the Ashburton Downs-Meekatharra Road. The project, which totalled \$4.5 million, has improved accessibility on this regionally significant road. The floodways were installed at Big Pingandy Creek, Little Pingandy Creek, Mucalana Creek, and Gorge Creek. Further floodway works are proposed.

COUNCIL MESSAGE | CEO Report



Meekatharra-Sandstone Road Re-sheeting

The Shire Road Crew is progressing re-sheeting works on the Meekatharra-Sandstone Road. These works complement other recent works on the road and are being funded with assistance from the State Government's Regional Road Group program. The 30-kilometre section of works is located 80 kilometres from the Meekatharra townsite.

Branding Change

Council members recently considered a branding change for the Shire. It was considered the current branding is outdated and a more modernised brand was appropriate. The change will incorporate a new logo for the Shire as well as a return to the original shield for Council.

Strategic Community Planning and Master Planning

Shire officers will be seeking community input and hosting community sessions soon for community planning for the Shire of Meekatharra and the Meekatharra townsite. Your involvement is very much sought after and appreciated. Be sure to look out for notices regarding how you can help plan the future of Meekatharra.

Department of Fire & Emergency Services Visit

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) recently visited Meekatharra Youth Services to engage with young people about the serious consequences of deliberately starting fires.

The educational session aimed to raise awareness about the dangers of arson and the significant impact it has on communities, the environment, and individuals.

The event began with an introduction to the DFES, outlining the department's crucial role in keeping communities safe. Children were reminded of the vital services DFES provides, including emergency responses to fires, and the ongoing work to prevent fire-related disasters.

A key part of the presentation was educating youth on the science of fire. DFES experts explained how fires start and how quickly they can spiral out of control, especially in dry conditions. With the rising risks of bushfires in certain seasons, understanding fire behaviours is important.

A special emphasis was placed on the efforts of local volunteer firefighters, in Meekatharra. The volunteer firefighters play a vital role in protecting the community, often working tirelessly under challenging conditions. These brave individuals, who are part of the DFES network, give their time and effort to safeguard their towns and surrounding areas.

These volunteers, who are often balancing work and family life, demonstrate the importance of community involvement and the critical role volunteers play in emergency services.



Family and Domestic Violence Service

This service offers a community response to women and their children (if present) who are experiencing domestic violence or are concerned about their safety.

Support includes:

- Crisis accommodation up to 72—hours or with a Police Order
- Arranging transportation and alternative accommodation
- Essential emergency items such as food
- Links to counselling and other culturally appropriate services

Meekatharra Housing and-Support Service—Gumbarra Urda

Transitional Accommodation will provide a pathway for families, women and children who have a desire to transition out of unsafe and/or unstable housing situations with support. MHSS will provide medium term accommodation combined with case management and community development.

Remote Education and Learning—Ijaba

This service works with families and community to increase school attendance in Meekatharra.

Our team acknowledges that school attendance is a 'whole of community' responsibility and has adopted a family focused model to work specifically with parents, carers and other family members as well as Elders, the school, local residents, community organisations and government agencies.

Our aim is to identity and address the short and long term challenges that families encounter, which may impact on children and young people attending and staying at school.

Public Tenancy Support Service

This service supports people living in Public Housing who face difficulty maintaining their tenancy.

Our team aims to support tenants to increase their ability to avoid reaching the point of eviction, debts and property standards.

Mental Health Support Service

This service provides information support, advocacy, referral and counselling to Aboriginal people living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who experience and live with mental ill health.

Our team adopts a recovery-orientated model, placing significant emphasis on the choices and decisions of the individual. We aim to support people to make positive changes and reach their goals while continuing to participate fully in the community.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

This service supports grandparents living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who are the sole or primary carer of their grandchildren.

Emergency Relief

This service is offered to people experiencing significant financial distress, homelessness and other life challenges.

Immediate relief is available once every three months in the form of food hampers. In addition to referrals to other services. Appointments to Emergency Relief are essential.

LIFESTYLE | First Aid Tips

Inalie Dies

What to do:

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John WA Action Plan.
- 2. Urgent medical aid. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3. Ensure the casualty does not move.
- 4. Lay the casualty down, rest and reassure.
- 5. If the bite is on a limb, apply a broad pressure bandage over the bite site as soon as possible.
- 6. Then apply a further elasticised or firm bandage start at fingers or toes and move up the limb as far as can be reached. Apply tightly but without stopping blood flow.
- 7. Splint the limb including the joints on either side of the bite.
- 8. Write down the time that the casualty was bitten and when the bandage was applied.
- 9. If the casualty becomes unconscious and not breathing normally, Commence CPR and Defibrillation.

Signs and symptoms

- Visible in an hour or more after the person has been bitten.
- In children, signs and symptoms may appear within minutes.
- Paired fang marks, but often only a single mark or a scratch mark may be present. Marks or scratches may bleed.
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Headache, drowsiness, giddiness or faintness.
- Double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids.
- Voice changes, trouble speaking or swallowing. Pain or tightness in the throat, chest or abdomen.
- Breathing difficulties, respiratory weakness or arrest.

Do not wash the venom off the skin (it may aid in identification). **Do not** cut the bitten area and try to suck the venom out.

Do not use a tourniquet.

Do not try and catch the snake.

Beware of this sneaky tactic when booking your next holiday

One way to get over post-holiday blues is to book another holiday. It'll give you something exciting to look forward to when the daily grind is getting you down. However, as you start searching for a great deal on your next getaway be on high alert for a sneaky practice that could blow your budget.

Drip pricing is a tactic used by websites or apps to trick or manipulate you into spending more money than you'd planned. It happens when an attractive price is advertised at the beginning of an online purchase, but then extra fees and charges (such as booking and service fees, insurances) are gradually added during the purchase process. It can also include pre-selected extras you may not want, and add-ons presented in a way that makes you feel you must buy them.

This type of pricing tactic is commonly seen when purchasing flights, event tickets, accommodation or rental cars. All the things you're likely to need for that exciting holiday.

When you have to manually un-tick and opt-out of the pre-selected extras before you get to the final price, you're more likely to get caught out by drip pricing. And when you end up paying more than intended or you felt misled about the price – then you've experienced consumer harm.

To prevent being stung extra through sneaky drip pricing, remind yourself about the deal you saw on the flashy ad that drew you in.

Stick to your holiday budget. When you start the online booking process, prepare to back out if the final price is not what you were expecting and shop around for a better final price.

As you move through each screen during the booking process, keep your eyes peeled for any pre-selections. Deselect anything you don't want and double check again before you hit that final pay button.

Under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL), businesses are only allowed to add preselected charges and fees if the additional prices are disclosed at the beginning of the purchasing process. Otherwise, their advertising could be considered misleading.

If you are misled into paying an optional charge, then raise this with the business and request a pro-rata refund to the value of that added charge.

Looking to book a holiday house? Make sure the short-term rental accommodation (STRA) registration number is displayed on the ad. This lets you know that the host has complied with new rules for operating STRA in WA. You can also check that a STRA registration number is valid, and the postcode of the STRA matches the location that you are booking for. This may help to identify illegitimate ads. Check if a STRA is registered via wa.gov.au

Weeding out a bad sale

"Let the buyer beware"

It may not have crossed your mind that plants being sold online or privately, might be prohibited in Western Australia! Or that you have a responsibility as a consumer, to be aware of the risks associated with a purchase. There is legislation that underpins the regulation of importation and trade of plants that are not permitted in Western Australia. The goal of this regulation and legislation is to protect natural ecosystems and primary production systems in WA from the many pests, weeds and diseases found elsewhere. There can be consequences for people who are aware yet continue to engage in distribution of certain species. The consequences for the environment, however, can be devastating if pest species make it into natural ecosystems.

A work in progress

To be eligible for import into WA or trade within WA, a species must be assessed and given a legal status, under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act* 2007 (BAM Act). Once classified, the species is then listed as a 'permitted species' or 'declared pest' in a database called the Western Australian Organism List (WAOL). If an organism is not listed on WAOL it cannot be imported or traded. A person can request to have an organism assessed for classification by filling in an assessment form which is available on the department's website.

End the circulation cycle!

During the Covid-19 pandemic many people started new hobbies. One growing trend is aquascaping an aquatic garden inside an aquarium or pond. Plants were brought in by people who were unaware of the requirements. Subsequently, prohibited plants have been circulating in WA and advertisements of prohibited plants may occur on a variety of online advertising platforms. It is important that consumers learn how to weed out a questionable sale and how to determine if a plant is prohibited.

Some examples to be aware of: Salvinia species (ALL varieties), floating crystalwort (Riccia fluitans), Rotala rotundifolia, water lettuce (Pistia stratiotes), floating water hyacinth (Eichhornia crassipes) and frogbit (Limnobium laevigatum). Rotala rotundifolia is often sold under 'cultivar' names. A cultivar is a variety of a species that has specific physical features, but all cultivars of a species share the same classification as they are the same species.

The buyer's checklist:

- Before making a purchase, check whether a plant has a 'permitted species' status (find the scientific name of the species through internet searches).
- Enter the scientific name into WAOL: https://www.agric.wa.gov.au/organisms
- 3. Don't buy or distribute unlisted species or species that have a 'declared pest' status.
- Advertising/selling 'declared pests' is prohibited and can be reported as an illegal agricultural matter on crimestopperswa.com.au
- If you are unsure you can also email padis@dpird.wa.gov.au

If you find that you have ended up with a prohibited plant because you were not aware, please put it in a sealed plastic bag and leave that in the sun for two weeks on a hard surface, before putting it the bin. This will stop it being viable and it won't become invasive in the environment.

Cook Mode Prevent your screen from going dark

Method

- Put the yoghurt and breadcrumbs into separate bowls. Mix the paprika into the breadcrumbs if using.
- Dip the chicken pieces into the yoghurt and then press down into the breadcrumbs to coat all sides
- Heat half the oil in a large frying pan. Cook half the chicken pieces over a medium heat until outside is brown and crunchy, then flip chicken pieces and cook the other side.
- 4. They will need about 5 minutes on each side. Repeat with the rest of the oil and chicken.
- 5. Make sure to check that the chicken is cooked through before serving.

Variation: Use a beaten egg or milk instead of yoghurt.




