# COMMUNITY HAPPENINGS | Murdoch University Vet Clinic

#### **Murdoch University 2025 Vet Program**

In April 2025, Meekatharra once again welcomed the Murdoch University "On the ROAD" (Remote Outreach Animal Desexing) program. initiative brings veterinary staff and final-year vet students into regional communities to deliver free and subsidised veterinary services. The visit represents an ongoing and highly valued partnership that contributes meaningfully to welfare animal outcomes and community wellbeing.

The outreach clinic ran from Monday 7 to Wednesday 9 April 2025 at the Shire Hall, operating from 7:00am to 5:00pm daily. Services offered included free sterilisation, free pet health checks, free vaccinations (if sterilised; otherwise, \$50 cash), free Microchipping (if sterilised; otherwise, \$55), one-year free pet registration (with sterilisation), tick prevention treatments and low-cost vaccinations for concession card holders.

In total, 76 surgeries were conducted across Meekatharra, Wiluna, and Tjuntjuntjara, with 38 microchips implanted and 40 animals vaccinated free of charge. Meekatharra accounted for 26 surgeries and 17 microchipped pets alone. All surgeries were performed by final-year Murdoch University veterinary students under the close supervision of senior veterinarians, ensuring both quality training and high standards of care.

Thanks are extended to Dr Nicole Laing and her team from Murdoch University, the Shire's team, and all residents who supported the initiative.

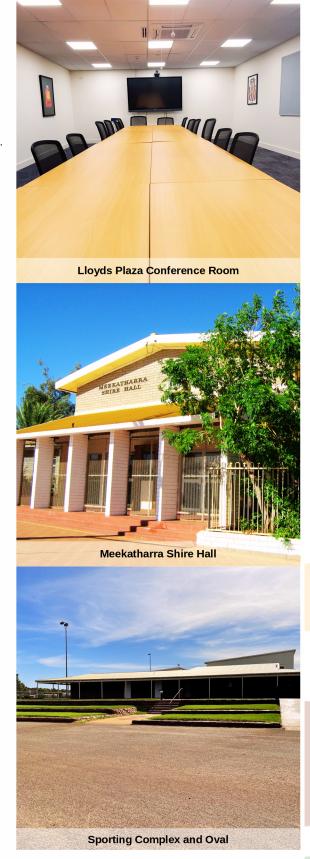

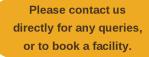

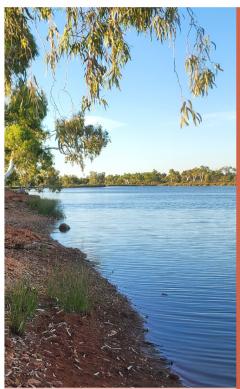

# Family and Domestic Violence Service

This service offers a community response to women and their children (if present) who are experiencing domestic violence or are concerned about their safety.

#### Support includes:

- Crisis accommodation up to 72—hours or with a Police Order
- Arranging transportation and alternative accommodation
- Essential emergency items such as food
- Links to counselling and other culturally appropriate services

#### Meekatharra Housing and-Support Service—Gumbarra Urda

Transitional Accommodation will provide a pathway for families, women and children who have a desire to transition out of unsafe and/or unstable housing situations with support. MHSS will provide medium term accommodation combined with case management and community development.

#### Remote Education and Learning—ljaba

This service works with families and community to increase school attendance in Meekatharra.

Our team acknowledges that school attendance is a 'whole of community' responsibility and has adopted a family focused model to work specifically with parents, carers and other family members as well as Elders, the school, local residents, community organisations and government agencies.

Our aim is to identity and address the short and long term challenges that families encounter, which may impact on children and young people attending and staying at school.

# Public Tenancy Support Service

This service supports people living in Public Housing who face difficulty maintaining their tenancy.

Our team aims to support tenants to increase their ability to avoid reaching the point of eviction, debts and property standards.

# **Mental Health Support Service**

This service provides information support, advocacy, referral and counselling to Aboriginal people living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who experience and live with mental ill health.

Our team adopts a recovery-orientated model, placing significant emphasis on the choices and decisions of the individual. We aim to support people to make positive changes and reach their goals while continuing to participate fully in the community.

# **Grandparents Raising Grandchildren**

This service supports grandparents living in Meekatharra, Cue and Mount Magnet who are the sole or primary carer of their grandchildren.

#### **Emergency Relief**

This service is offered to people experiencing significant financial distress, homelessness and other life challenges.

Immediate relief is available once every three months in the form of food hampers. In addition to referrals to other services. Appointments to Emergency Relief are essential.

# LIFESTYLE | First Aid Tips



#### What to do:

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John WA Action Plan.
- 2. Urgent medical aid. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3. Ensure the casualty does not move.
- 4. Lay the casualty down, rest and reassure.
- 5. If the bite is on a limb, apply a broad pressure bandage over the bite site as soon as possible.
- 6. Then apply a further elasticised or firm bandage start at fingers or toes and move up the limb as far as can be reached. Apply tightly but without stopping blood flow.
- 7. Splint the limb including the joints on either side of the bite.
- 8. Write down the time that the casualty was bitten and when the bandage was applied.
- 9. If the casualty becomes unconscious and not breathing normally, Commence CPR and Defibrillation.

#### Signs and symptoms

- Visible in an hour or more after the person has been bitten.
- In children, signs and symptoms may appear within minutes.
- Paired fang marks, but often only a single mark or a scratch mark may be present. Marks or scratches may bleed.
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Headache, drowsiness, giddiness or faintness.
- Double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids.
- Voice changes, trouble speaking or swallowing. Pain or tightness in the throat, chest or abdomen.
- Breathing difficulties, respiratory weakness or arrest.

**Do not** wash the venom off the skin (it may aid in identification). **Do not** cut the bitten area and try to suck the venom out. **Do not** use a tourniquet.

Do not try and catch the snake.

#### Simple tips to stay safe at home this winter

As temperatures drop, families are being reminded to take simple precautions to stay safe while keeping warm this winter.

Whether it's switching on a heater, using an electric blanket or lighting a fire, following a few key safety steps can help prevent injuries and accidents at home.

Remember to place heaters on a flat, stable surface and keep them at least one metre from flammable items like bedding, curtains and clothing. Never use outdoor heaters or barbecues indoors. If you're using a fireplace, check the chimney is clean and use a mesh screen to stop sparks or logs falling out.

Before you make your bed warm and cosy, inspect electric blankets for frayed cords or damaged wires before use. Always turn them off before going to sleep and never place heavy items on them.

Fill hot water bottles with hot tap water, not boiling water, and always use a cover or wrap to avoid burns. Allow wheat packs to cool fully before reheating and stop using them if they smell burnt.

Children's nightwear such as pyjamas and dressing gowns can be highly flammable so check the fire labelling to understand the fire risk rating for each garment. It's always best to keep children away from heaters, fireplaces and open flames. It can be tempting to save a few dollars buying sleepwear from overseas websites, but these may not meet Australian safety standards.

Candles can create a lovely atmosphere but if left unattended, they could burn your house down. Make sure you blow them out before going to bed or leaving the house, don't burn them close to curtains and bedding and keep matches and lighters out of reach of children.

As the temperature drops, fire risks from heating devices rise. Test smoke alarms monthly, replace the battery every year, and replace the entire unit every 10 years.

Preventing mould is a top priority this season as rain, cold weather, and indoor heating can create condensation, which leads to mould growth. It thrives in areas with moisture and poor ventilation and can cause nasty health issues, particularly for people with asthma or respiratory conditions. To help keep your home mould-free open windows and doors daily to allow airflow and clean up any mould as soon as you notice it.

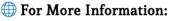

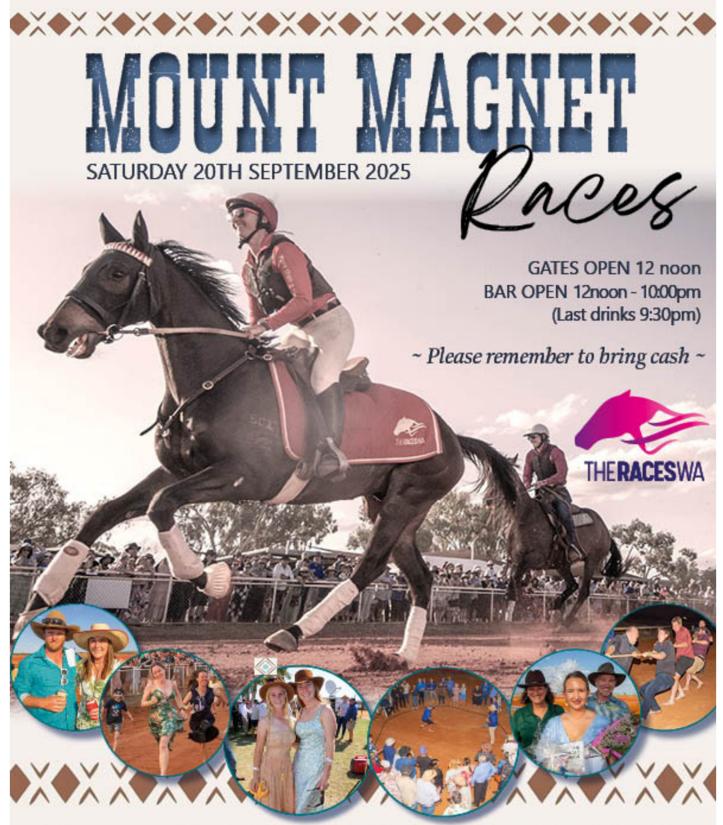

# Compost buddies – nema-todally fabulous

#### A fabulous, food-fertilizing foundation!

Nematodes are a type of invertebrate roundworm. They are the most abundant animals on earth and are in every ecosystem; from our oceans to lava fields, Antarctica and yes sometimes even inside us and our animals. Soil nematodes are usually microscopic, and most are amongst the 'good guys' that are crucial for the making of healthy soils. There are probably billions of them thriving in your compost bin. One of the amazing roles they perform in the soil is converting organic matter into mineral forms that can be taken up and used by plants. Life would be at a loss without those types of nematodes helping to circulate nutrients in the environment and there are many undescribed species still to be found!

#### They are what they eat

Scientists like to classify living things and group them together based on similarities. Nematodes are so diverse that we often put them into groups based on what they eat. For soil nematodes we tend to identify them based on these feeding groups: Bacterivores eat bacteria, Fungivores eat Fungi, Predators eat other nematodes and animals, Plant Parasites feed from plants, Plant Associates eat algae, lichen, mosses and roots of plants, and Omnivores have a variety of food sources. Identifying numbers of nematodes by feeding groups in a soil sample is a good way to estimate a soils biological diversity and to indicate the rate of nutrient cycling occurring. Healthy soil has a higher abundance and diversity of free-living nematodes and low numbers of plant parasites.

#### Some nematodes are pests

Those of us who have cats or dogs (or children!) will be familiar with needing to provide regular worming treatments to stop parasitic nematodes in the gastrointestinal system. Other parasitic nematodes may live in different organs of a variety of animal species or humans and when travelling it is important to avoid them. Parasitic nematodes that attack plants can have huge impacts for growers and we must protect our state to prevent the introduction of exotic pest species. Even turf can be affected. When a patch of 'hallowed ground' was moved from the Melbourne Cricket Ground to the Brisbane Cricket Ground for the 2020 AFL grand final it carried a plant parasitic nematode in the turf and accidently introduced 'Southern Sting' nematodes to Queensland!

#### How can you help?

Good garden hygiene practices are important. When buying or moving plants or seeds, check up on quarantine requirements - you may need to remove soil from the roots or have seeds tested. If you are growing vegetables in the garden, purchasing nematode-resistant varieties and avoid planting the same plant family in the same location in consecutive years. And finally, backyard composting is a wonderful way to put our 'good' nematodes to work so that soil can be brought into good health too. They may be microscopic, but nematodes are mighty. They make nutrient cycling possible. Thanks nematodes!

#### Ingredients

- ▲ 1 apple, cored and chopped
- ▲ 1/2 tsp water
- ▲ 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon
- ▲ 1/4 tsp sugar, optional
- ▲ 1/4 cup reduced-fat plain yoghurt
- Cook Mode Prevent your screen from going dark

#### Method

- 1. Place apple, cinnamon, water and sugar (if using) in a microwave safe mug or bowl and mix.
- 2. Cover with a plate or cling film with holes in it and microwave on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute. If you want softer apples, microwave in 30 second bursts until you get the right texture.
- Note: if there are several mugs in the microwave It will take longer to cook.
- 3. Serve with low-fat yoghurt.
